On his return to Australia, Williams saw the aesthetic potential of the Australian bush in its inherent plasticity. This was grounded in establishing a pictorial equivalent to the overwhelmingly vast, primarily flat landscape, in which the traditional European relationship of foreground to background breaks down, necessitating a complete re-imagining of compositional space. In this, Williams looked to the approach taken by Australian Aboriginal artists. He did this by tilting the landscape up against the picture plane, so that frequently the only indicator of horizontal recession is the presence of a horizon line, or where clumps of trees huddle closer together towards the horizon, suggesting recession. Where no horizon is visible, the landscape runs fully parallel to the picture plane, as in the major You Yangs series of the mids. Here, calligraphic knots of pigment indicate the presence of single trees against the earth, as if seen from the air example. Williams had planned to paint the length of the river, but his widow, Lyn said he "lost heart in the project" after the accident.
