Chapter 1 : Athletic Training (MS) Admissions | College of Public Health | Temple University

Paramedic Program Admission and Program Requirements Submit evidence of successful completion (grade of C+ or better) of a level Anatomy & Physiology course or successful completion of an on-line program (non-credit).

Accreditation standards of athletic training degrees were first developed in 1966. For the best preparation for graduate work in athletic training, the prerequisite courses are required as foundation work. Building on this background, the graduate program provides the specialized coursework and practicum experiences that prepare and qualify successful candidates for careers in athletic training. The main components of the program include: The Truman graduate program in Athletic Training is characterized by high academic and professional standards, close collaboration between students and faculty, and professional preparation. Students who wish to pursue graduate study in athletic training should contact the Program Director in Athletic Training for information. Students who are interested in the graduate program of study are encouraged to obtain information early, so that appropriate plans can be made to meet the prerequisites. It is the goal of the MAT program to provide the athletic training students with the skills necessary to perform the duties of a certified athletic trainer. To provide students, through a program of progressive clinical experiences, the skills necessary to perform the duties of a certified athletic trainer. To furnish students with the clinical and academic skills to work in the variety of venues employing certified athletic trainers. To prepare students who are proficient in all content areas designated by the National Athletic Trainers Association competencies. The candidate performs the clinical proficiencies designated by the National Athletic Trainers Association competencies essential to athletic training at a professional level. To continue to determine and assess the effectiveness of athletic training course content and clinical experiences. To ensure that all program graduates meet the rigorous requirements for obtaining eligibility for the Board of Certification exam. To provide academic and clinical experiences, in accordance with program accreditation standards, that prepare graduates to provide comprehensive athletic training program services. To model and promote ethical principles and procedures in the conduct of clinical practice, academic achievement, and research. To model and promote professional values which include a respect for diversity and the importance of lifelong learning. The athletic training facilities have group rehabilitation areas, taping areas, wet room areas, and modality treatment areas. The athletic training facilities have an extensive collection of diagnostic and rehabilitation materials that are used by student athletic trainers as they prepare for professional degrees. Off-site facilities including local high school and clinic settings are used for practicum hours. These facilities are equipped with modality and rehabilitative equipment to provide care to active individuals. The Truman athletic training facilities are open throughout the academic year and limited times in the summer serving Truman athletic teams. The Truman graduate athletic training program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education. Students are supervised by preceptors at all times during practicum hours. Minimum GPA score of 3.

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Chapter 2 : Degree Programs and Requirements | University of New Orleans

The admission process for the Athletic Training (AT) Program is separate from the application process for admission to the University. Students do not officially apply for admission into the AT Program until they have met all preadmission criteria (typically takes one year to complete).

We are happy to hear that! MSTP applicants are expected to have a strong background in science and extensive laboratory or clinical research experience. Applicants with undergraduate majors in biological and physical sciences, computer science, mathematics or engineering are encouraged to apply. All applicants should have completed, or will complete by the time of matriculation, the normal prerequisites for admission to the medical school. In addition, MSTP applicants will have completed advanced coursework in the sciences and mathematics through calculus. We welcome applications from individuals from racial and ethnic groups underrepresented in medicine and biomedical research. Please be aware that all students matriculating into the Einstein MSTP will be subjected to a urine drug test at or shortly before Orientation. 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Chapter 3 : Admissions | Medical Scientist Training Program (MSTP) | Albert Einstein College of Medicine

Applicants for the Personal Fitness training program must meet the following requirements for consideration for admission. Submit an Application For Admission with a \$ registration fee. The \$ registration fee is refundable prior to the first day of class.

Students do not officially apply for admission into the AT Program until they have met all preadmission criteria typically takes one year to complete. Admission to the AT Program is competitive and not all who apply can be accommodated. Once admitted into the AT Program, students must maintain retention criteria to remain in and process through the program. Students will make formal application to the Athletic Training major once they have completed the pre-admission requirements for consideration into the Athletic Training program. To complete the Athletic Training major, students must complete the three-year course and clinical sequence after formal admission into the program. Transfer students Transfer students need to speak to the AT Program Director regarding their admission into the Athletic Training major. Selection, progression and retention requirements Selection Process for the Athletic Training major: The number of students selected for formal admission to the major each year is limited by the number of students that meet all criteria and the number of clinical placement sites available to the AT Program. Typically up to clinical placements are available each year for newly admitted students. The selection process begins at the end of each spring semester and is finalized during the summer. Consideration will be given to students who are completing preadmission coursework during the summer academic term. Students attempting courses for the first time in the summer due to scheduling issues in the previous fall or spring are given priority over students that are retaking preadmission required courses. Students selected for formal admission into the major will be contacted by the program director. Requirements for formal admission into the major include the following: All applicants who reapply must meet all requirements in effect at the time of application. Students are encouraged to contact the department for current admission requirements. All students selected for formal admission must provide evidence of being able to meet the technical standards of the program with or without reasonable accommodations. The technical standards for the program are included in the application material. Upon notification of formal admission into the Athletic Training major, students will be required to initiate and pay for any security checks and drug screenings required for clinical agencies. All admitted students must complete a criminal record check and receive response that the applicant has not been convicted of any crime pursuant to Section All students are expected to provide their own transportation to clinical sites. All students will be required to purchase student professional liability insurance. Progression and Retention Requirements: Completion of clinical experience Maintain a major coursework GPA of 3. If standards are not met by the end of the probationary period, the student may be dismissed from the major. Students who receive a grade of "D" or "F" in an ATC course must repeat that course and receive a grade of "C" or higher to progress in the program and remain in the major. Failure to follow the appeal process may result in dismissal from the program.

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Chapter 4 : Detailed Program Admission Requirements

â€¢ The successful Athletic Training major who is selected for admission to the Professional Program in Athletic Training cohort must satisfy the following additional requirements for admission by August 1 each year.

Will you consider a copy of my GRE score for application review? Upload a copy of your GRE in the area provided in the application. If I take the GRE in November, will my scores arrive in time for fellowship and scholarship competition? The only answer we can give is maybe. There have been years when the scoring by the Educational Testing Service was delayed, and the score reports were received too long after the deadline for file review. I am a foreign student. Proof of English language proficiency is an application requirement for the Ph. See exceptions on the English Language Proficiency Attestation Form ; this must be completed and uploaded with any required documentation as noted. Additional clarifications on exceptions include: Diploma received from an English-speaking institution. If an undergraduate or graduate degree was earned from an accredited institution where the language of instruction is English and the country language is English for example, U. In process of completing a degree from an English-speaking institution. If you are in the process of earning a degree from an institution where the primary language of instruction is English and that is in an English-speaking country, such as Canada or the U. For application review, you can upload a copy of your scores. Should you receive an appointment, you will be required to submit an official score sent directly from the Educational Testing Service to Mayo Clinic Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences. Scores will need to be current. I have publications and would like to include them with my application for review. How can I submit them? Upload the first two pages of each publication, which should contain the abstract and introduction section. Should the admissions committee like additional information regarding your publication, you will be contacted directly. Be sure the name of the publication and your name are listed.

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Chapter 5 : Admission Requirements

Exceptions to the requirements can be made on recommendation by the MATrg Application Committee. Admission Acceptance/Denial into the MATrg: The MATrg application process is a competitive process.

Master of Science M. School Psychology Counseling Psychology Concentration The curriculum is designed for students seeking preparation for a career in various types of mental health settings and related organizations, or for students planning to pursue a Ph. The primary goal is to provide a solid psychological core with a focus on emotional, social, vocational, health, and educational issues across the life span. Recognizing the value of both practice and research, the Counseling Concentration offers two options: Admission Requirements Admission requires an undergraduate major in psychology or related field. Undergraduate study should include one course in general psychology, elementary statistics, research methods, abnormal psychology, physiological psychology, social psychology and developmental psychology. The minimum acceptable admission requirements of the Graduate School are a 2. Conditional admission is offered for 2. In addition the student should submit in duplicate ALL of the following -information in a single envelope directly to the Graduate School: Three 3 letters of recommendation - one of which should be from an academic advisor or his or her designee. A letter of aspiration personal statement indicating why the applicant has chosen to pursue a degree in this area along with his or her academic and career goals. Official copy of all undergraduate transcripts should also be submitted with the application. Once the above criteria have been met, the Coordinator of the program will contact the applicant and arrange an interview with the members of the Graduate Admissions Committee prior to final recommendation for admission to the program. All application materials including the letters of recommendation and aspiration must be received by the Graduate School by February 1 for admission for fall semester. Degree Requirements A minimum of four semesters and a summer term of residential study are required to complete the program within a two year period. The Thesis Option requires fifty-three 53 semester hours of approved course work. The Non-Thesis Option requires fifty-eight 58 semester hours of approved course work. Thesis Option This option is appropriate for students planning to pursue a Ph. The candidate must submit a thesis on a topic approved by the thesis advisor. A minimum of fifty-three 53 semester hours of approved course work is required. Non-Thesis Option The non-thesis option is for students who choose to focus on training in the practice aspects of psychology. Students who select the non-thesis option will be required to take a minimum of 58 hours of course work including 6 hours of electives above the core requirements and must pass a Comprehensive Examination to meet the requirements for the degree. Upon successful completion of the M. Undergraduate study should include at least one course in statistics, testing, abnormal, physiological, social, and developmental. Conditional admission may be offered for 2. Applicants with less than a 2. Degree Requirements A minimum of four semesters and a summer term of residential study and forty-two 42 semester hours of approved course work are required. These courses are prerequisites for both the Ed.
