The next day, Ohio Governor John Kasich suspended his campaign, effectively making Trump the presumptive Republican presidential nominee. Trump was the first presidential nominee of a major party since Wendell Willkie , the Republican candidate in , who has held neither political office nor a high military rank prior to his nomination. He was also the first presidential nominee of a major party without political experience since General Dwight D. Eisenhower first captured the Republican presidential nomination in This was the first Republican National Convention to be held entirely in July since It is responsible for "organizing, hosting and funding" the convention; it also aims "to promote Northeast Ohio and ensure Cleveland is best represented, and to lessen the burden of local governments in hosting the Republican National Convention". The arena hosted the first Republican presidential debate of the election, aired by Fox News Channel , on August 6, The convention was held July 18â€”21, Cleveland stalled on approving and making public the demonstration applications it received, while Philadelphia hosting the Democratic National Convention had already granted an application. Bush and George H. Bush all announced that they would skip the convention. Senators , particularly those facing difficult reelection campaigns, also indicated that they would not attend, seeking to distance themselves from Trump and spend more time with voters in their home states. The ACLU has been criticized by liberals, such as when it excluded Communists from its leadership ranks, when it defended Neo-Nazis, when it declined to defend Paul Robeson , or when it opposed the passage of the National Labor Relations Act. But the defense of freedom of speech is most critical when the message is one most people find repulsive. United States* , Justice Oliver Wendell Holmes wrote an important dissent which has gradually been absorbed as an American principle: He wanted to change its focus from litigation to direct action and public education. Magazines were routinely confiscated under the anti-obscenity Comstock laws ; permits for labor rallies were often denied; and virtually all anti-war or anti-government literature was outlawed. One faction, including Baldwin, Arthur Garfield Hays and Norman Thomas , believed that direct, militant action was the best path. The prosecution, led by William Jennings Bryan , contended that the Bible should be interpreted literally in teaching creationism in school. The Tennessee Supreme Court later upheld the law but overturned the conviction on a technicality. Arkansas and the case *Kitzmiller v. Dover Area School District*. Numerous states drafted laws designed to use schools to promote a common American culture, and in , the voters of Oregon passed the Oregon Compulsory Education Act. The law was primarily aimed at eliminating parochial schools , including Catholic schools. In a unanimous decision, the court held that the act was unconstitutional and that parents, not the state, had the authority to educate children as they thought best. First victories[edit] Leaders of the ACLU were divided on the best tactics to use to promote civil liberties. Felix Frankfurter felt that legislation was the best long-term solution, because the Supreme Court could not and â€” in his opinion â€” should not mandate liberal interpretations of the Bill of Rights. But Walter Pollack , Morris Ernst , and other leaders felt that Supreme Court decisions were the best path to guarantee civil liberties. Mencken when he was arrested for distributing banned literature Censorship was commonplace in the early 20th century. State laws and city ordinances routinely outlawed speech deemed

to be obscene or offensive, and prohibited meetings or literature that promoted unions or labor organization. Mencken deliberately broke Boston law by distributing copies of his banned American Mercury magazine; the ACLU defended him and won an acquittal. *United States and Memoirs v. California*, decided in 1958, the Supreme Court sided with the ACLU and affirmed the right of a communist party member to salute a communist flag. The result was the first time the Supreme Court used the Due Process Clause of the 14th amendment to subject states to the requirements of the First Amendment. *Minnesota v. Murphy*, also decided in 1958, the Supreme Court ruled that states may not exercise prior restraint and prevent a newspaper from publishing, simply because the newspaper had a reputation for being scandalous. *Committee for Industrial Organization v. Wood* affirmed the right of communists to promote their cause. By 1958, the ACLU had achieved many of the goals it set in the 1940s, and many of its policies were the law of the land. Roosevelt administration proposed the New Deal to combat the depression. ACLU leaders were of mixed opinions about the New Deal, since many felt that it represented an increase in government intervention into personal affairs, and because the National Recovery Administration suspended anti-trust legislation. The ACLU fought these bans, but did not prevail. *Oregon v. Elbert T. Acorn*, in which a communist labor organizer was arrested for calling a meeting to discuss unionization. *Douglas v. California*, and *Frank Murphy v. United States* established a body of civil liberties law. Stone wrote the famous "footnote four" in *United States v.*

Until the re-establishment of the Navy in , these "revenue cutters" were the only naval force of the early United States. As such, the cutters and their crews frequently took on additional duties, including combating piracy, rescuing mariners in distress, ferrying government officials, and even carrying mail. Its formation marked the first time since World War II that Coast Guard personnel were used extensively in a combat environment. The squadron operated divisions in three separate areas during the period of 1965 to 1975. Twenty-six Point-class cutters with their crews and a squadron support staff were assigned to the U. Navy with the mission of interdicting the movement of arms and supplies from the South China Sea into South Vietnam by Viet Cong and North Vietnam junk and trawler operators. The squadron also provided 81mm mortar naval gunfire support to nearby friendly units operating along the South Vietnamese coastline and assisted the U. Navy during Operation Sealords. A total of 35 High Endurance Cutters took part in operations from May to December, most notably using their 5" guns to provide naval gunfire support missions. Often units within the Coast Guard operate under Department of the Navy operational control while other Coast Guard units remain under the Department of Homeland Security.
