The evidence from these analyses confirms three of our main findings: Second, we examine the plausibility of a sanctioning account more directly , focusing on how in-group reciprocity norms might work in practice to support more cooperative behavior. We explore the data for evidence that players anticipate punishment , that they act more cooperatively when sanctioning is possible, and that they do in fact engage in costly punishment. We find strong evidence that players do all of these things. We then take an additional step and try to sort out how exactly ingroup reciprocity norms function. Recall that, in the last chapter, we emphasized the difficulty of disentangling the technology and strategy selection mechanisms. In the third part of this chapter, we investigate whether coethnics act in a more reciprocating manner even among players who know one another or who can be easily foundâ€”that is, while controlling for periodicity and reachability. This analysis permits us to separate out two distinct logics for how ethnicity figures in the solution of collective action problems. The first is purely about strategy selection: The second emphasizes technology: Our evidence suggests that patterns of coethnic cooperation cannot be explained simply by the technological advantages that groups possess. A specifically coethnic reciprocity norm exists among our subjects in Mulago -Kyebando. Finally, we examine whether coethnic reciprocity norms which are powerfully in evidence in binary interactions between egoists extend to a different strategic context, one in which information about behavior is publicly observable and norm enforcers are empowered whether they are coethnic or not to sanction. In this case, external actors can play a role in supporting cooperation. We ask whether there are conditions under which a universal reciprocity normâ€”which is in evidence when punishment is possibleâ€”is sufficiently powerful to erase the coethnic advantage in cooperation. We find that, in environments where actions are publicly observable and all players are equally able to sanction, reciprocity norms can function effectively across group lines. Only a state court, a federal article III court, or a military court, should ever be able to suspend your rights for any significant period of time. Does the NICS background check system have problems? Yes, it results in tens of thousands of unjustified denials of gun purchases every year. It throws millions of dollars at a faulty program and it will result in more law-abiding citizens being deprived of their right to keep and bear arms. If we continue to give the executive branch more money and encouragement to add names to the list of people prohibited from buying a firearm without a day in court and if the gun banners achieve their goal of universal background checks, one day, a single person elected to the office of President will be able to achieve universal gun prohibition. House leadership should immediately de-couple the fix-NICS legislation from the concealed carry reciprocity legislation. People hate it when Washington combines bills like our leadership plans to do this week. A few have speculated that the House is combining the bills to ensure reciprocity will pass in the Senate. I have some news for them: The Senate and the House meet at conference with their respective bills, with the result being fix-NICS emerges from conference without reciprocity. Fix-NICS comes back to the House and passes because all of the Democrats will vote for it as they just did in Judiciary Committee and many Republicans will vote for it. And we should be given enough time to amend the fix-NICS bill, because it needs to be fixed, if not axed. Shumer is campaigning against the bill. Simply because something is popular with a majority does not mean that it is right for you. Over the years, many of my students, particularly ladies, have shown a preference for the revolver. Why is this so? One reason is that the double-action revolver is a logical choice for a beginner learning to handle and shoot a handgun. You activate the cylinder latch on the left hand side and swing the cylinder out to load, unload, or to show clear. Pressing the ejector rod removes the empty cartridge casings from the chambers in the cylinder. You load the revolver by inserting cartridges one at a time in the chambers or by loading the entire cylinder at once using a speed loader or other device. Close the cylinder, rotate by hand until it stops, and you are safe and ready to holster. To fire, you may either thumb cock the hammer before pressing the trigger for single action fire, or by pulling the trigger fully to the rear which cocks the hammer, rotates the cylinder, and fires the revolver all in one motion. There is no manual safety. Advertisement Auto-loaders come in many different flavors. The safety may be on the frame, the slide, or there may be no external safety at all. SIGs have a de-cocking lever, while Heckler and Koch pistols may be had in any one of nine different variations. The magazine release may be on the butt, behind the trigger guard, or in front of the trigger guard. Each brand of auto-loader has its own procedures for administrative handling. Further, some people find retracting the slide on an auto-loader to be inconvenient. Finally, take-down and cleaning of an auto-loader is a more complex process than cleaning a revolver. You must use what works for you. Hold more rounds than revolvers most of the time. Are generally faster to reload. Are thinner and easier to conceal. Are more tolerant of abuse. Depend on high-quality ammunition for reliability. Can be picky about which ammunition works well. Generally require more training and practice to use well. Must be chosen with your hand size and grip angle in mind. Require specific training to clear a misfire or malfunction. Hold 5 to 8 rounds in. Take more time to reload. Are utterly reliable if kept clean and well maintained. Will handle a wider variety of ammo in a given choice of caliber. Can be mastered with relatively basic training. Can be fitted with a wide variety of aftermarket grips to fit various hands. Will easily handle a misfire. Just pull the trigger again.
