LInX was designed to enhance information sharing between local, state, and federal law enforcement in areas of strategic importance to the Department of the Navy; since , LInX has become strategically important to the United States Army and the United States Air Force. LInX provides participating law enforcement partner agencies with secure access to regional crime and incident data and the tools needed to process it, enabling investigators to search across jurisdictional boundaries to help solve crimes and resolve suspicious events. LInX is designed to facilitate cooperation and sharing. Ownership and control of the data remains with the agency that provided it. LInX is organized regionally, with each region having its own Governance Board. There are currently eleven 13 geographical regions and one 1 region consisting of the law enforcement agencies of the Department of Defense known as the Law Enforcement Defense Data Exchange D-DEx: LInX contains data from over 1, law enforcement sources. The combination gives access to law enforcement data with over million records to search from. Criminal Property Information There have been some lengthy discussions by the CJIN Board regarding the issues surrounding property information that has been identified in a criminal incident. The Board has addressed both enterprise and local solutions for data warehousing of property information; including potential changes to the State Statutes to include the majority of secondhand dealers, scrap metal, precious metals, etc. Some of these solutions include changes to city and county ordinances. These samples are collected by local Law Enforcement while fingerprinting defendants at arrest. They are then to be used to identify guilty parties as well as exonerate the innocent. There were numerous screen shots of the system in action to allow for a more detailed understanding of the look and feel of the system. A timeline was provided for the various releases of the system and a chart of the constituents that are served by the system. The NCAWARE system provides an automated, web-based statewide warrant repository to maintain and track criminal processes and offender information. The Clerks of Superior Court act as the hub of court system including serving a judge of probate. There were representatives from the City of High Point and Statesville along with the Board discussed how to ensure that agencies are aware of and how Judges can ensure that pre-trial release is working. The CJIN Board

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has been exploring this topic for some time and have gathered a variety of information from various sources that will shed some light on the status of Body Worn Camera; NC Agencies pilots, implementation, policies, etc. With so much attention being focused on specific instances across the United States, it begs the question of what the Body Worn Camera Policy is for difference Agencies across the US. Out of those meetings and workshops one of the concerns is that of video management of the body worn camera footage; tagging of videos, record retention, cost of storage, etc. This concern will be explored in greater depth by the CJIN Board, but the first step was to explore the policies that different departments have in place. All of the aforementioned presentations, polices, statutes, ordinances, workshops, etc. These enhancements are called CJLEADS 2 which are actively being deployed, will consolidate tools, minimize workflow and offer a more modern user experience. Based on user feedback, GDAC worked to transition to an environment that will comply with the most current security recommendations and protocols. Although user will still have full access to the CJLEADS 1 environment until Spring, , we are asking each agency to begin their transition as soon as possible so that we can ensure all 25, active users of CJLEADS have successfully on-boarded to the new version before the old version is shut down on May 1st. GDAC plans to complete this incremental rollout before the end of January Since we are requiring MFA, we are providing this second-factor of identity management at no cost to the agency, just as the CJLEADS application has been available for use at no cost to the agency. Clinton Williams developed as they were using a white board and post-it notes, now they have a fully integrated technological solution.
