

Chapter 1 : More than half of probation employees fail exam replacing patronage promotions - The Boston

The Court Officer Exam, part of the Court Security Series Tests, is a multiple-choice test, approximately three hours long. You will be tested on the following subjects: Applying Written Information (Laws, Rules, Regulations, Procedures, etc.).

July 21, Last Day of Registration: September 1, Examination Examination Date: October 28, Examination Fee: Individuals who passed the previous Court Officer Entrance Exams in July and October do not have to take this exam; Individuals who passed the previous exams remain eligible to be considered for Court Officer positions and will be subject to the Physical Fitness Assessment and other hiring requirements as set forth in this announcement and in accordance with Trial Court policy. Registrants would be notified by email should this occur. Individuals who do not take and pass this examination, or the exams administered in July or October, will be ineligible for Court Officer positions until another court officer examination is offered in the future. Those individuals that pass this exam will receive information regarding the next steps in the hiring process for the Court Officer positions. Passing the Court Officer Examination alone does not guarantee that you will receive an interview. Persons who apply to a Court Officer job posting, after passing a Court Officer Entrance examination must also meet the eligibility requirements for this job in order to be considered for appointment. Exam registrants should also be aware that due to the anticipated large volume of qualified candidates, job applicants selected for an interview typically exceed the minimum requirements. A Court Officer is responsible for providing security through, in and around court premises, protecting judges, jurors, witnesses, prisoners, court personnel, and the public who use Massachusetts Trial Court buildings and facilities. A Court Officer identifies and addresses all security concerns, including: A Court Officer takes appropriate action in disruptive situations in all areas of the court house, including for assaultive behavior where persons may be armed or otherwise pose a danger. A Court Officer documents, secures, and returns prisoner property in accordance with Security Department policies and procedures; enforces all appropriate judicial orders, and enforces all laws and ordinances as appropriate. A High School diploma or equivalent and at least two 2 years of experience in security, law enforcement, corrections, the military, loss prevention, emergency medical services, or direct care social services. A Bachelor degree from an accredited educational institution recognized by the U. Department of Education or the Council for Higher Education Accreditation may substitute for required work experience. Candidates that pass the written exam and meet the minimum position requirements may be invited to attend a session for the PAT. Not all candidates will be invited to a PAT at the same time due to the anticipated large volume of applicants. Psychological Assessment â€” Candidates may be asked to undergo a psychological assessment. Trial Court Policy Section 4. A CORI check involving other offenses will not automatically disqualify the final candidate s. Determinations of suitability based on CORI checks will be made consistent with this policy and any applicable law or regulations. Medical â€” As a condition of employment, an applicant for Court Officer will be required to pass a medical examination that includes a drug screening. Background Investigation â€” Candidates may be subjected to a background investigation. Federal I9 Form for Employment Eligibility â€” Pursuant to the provisions of the Immigration Reform and Control Act of , after an offer of employment is made, selected candidates for appointment are required to complete an Employment Eligibility Verification Form I-9 and submit specific documents that establish identity and verify the right to work in the United States. Massachusetts Residency Requirement â€” Pursuant to G. Training â€” Candidates must satisfactorily complete the Court Officer Training Academy and are subject to a probationary period. During the Trial Court review process or during the life of this candidate pool, candidates must make original supporting documentation available should the issue of authenticity arise with any submitted document copies. Examination fee Processing fee must be paid by Late registrations submitted from September 2, through If you have not registered and paid for the examination on or before September 14, , your registration will not be processed or accepted, and you will not be eligible to take the examination. Persons who have successfully registered will later receive an email notification that includes important information about the date, time, exact location, and other general information for their examination. An orientation and preparation guide will be available for download online once registration is complete. The Fee Waiver Form is available in the additional resources below. You must follow the instructions on the Fee Waiver Form regarding proper submission of the Form and supporting documentation. All Fee Waiver forms must be either scanned and emailed to exams.jud. The fee requirement is waived for current employees of the New York State Unified Court System and for those who fall into specific categories provided on the exam announcement. Exam Announcement and Filing Period The issuance of an exam announcement and the opening of the filing period usually occur about three to six months prior to the scheduled exam date. The filing period is typically four weeks long. To take an exam, you must submit an application during the filing period. The application must be submitted during the filing period. An email address and credit or debit card are required for successful submission. Separate applications must be submitted for each exam if an applicant is applying to more than one exam. For example, if you are applying to take both the Court Clerk and Senior Court Clerk Exams you must file two applications. An exam announcement may be viewed or downloaded from this website, during the filing period of the exam, until the date of the exam. Seniority Credits for Promotional Exams Promotional exam candidates will have seniority credits added to their score based upon their length of continuous permanent service in the New York State Unified Court System. Seniority credits may not be used to achieve a passing score. Exam History Eligible lists are generally in place for four years and may be extended for one additional year. Consistent with civil service rules, passing candidates will be canvassed in rank order when there is a vacancy to be filled. List Information or Changes to Contact Information Once the list is established and initial results are emailed, Appointments and Systems Management is responsible for the list. Candidates may direct inquiries regarding rank number, score, or add or change their location preferences or provide an updated email address, phone number or other contact information to asm nycourts. The computer-based examination replaces the paper-and-pencil testing process. All applicants must successfully pass the multiple-choice and oral examinations to become eligible to provide court interpreting services for the New York State Unified Court System. After submitting the application, you will immediately receive a confirmation email with information about the scheduling process for the multiple-choice Per Diem Court Interpreter examination. Court Interpreter Spanish In order to be employed as a permanent Court Interpreter in Spanish, applicants must pass the open-competitive Civil Service written and oral exams in Spanish and undergo a criminal background investigation. This exam is administered approximately every four years. A fee is associated with the examination and background check. Successful applicants on the open-competitive Civil Service exam are placed on a ranked eligibility list and are also eligible to be placed on the Registry of Per Diem Court Interpreters for Spanish. The current Court Interpreter Spanish list was established July 14, The last Court Interpreter Spanish written exam was held on May 5,
