Southbound traffic used the newly constructed Welcome Way until it merges with Harrison Street just north of 35th Street; northbound traffic use Brady Street which had been a two-way, four-lane street. Other two-way stretches of the highway through Davenport have four or more lanes. The changes came as follows: The final stretch completed a continuous multi-laned link between Dickeyville , Wisconsin south to Grandview. Highway 61 continues to the city of Thunder Bay , where it ends at an intersection with the Trans-Canada Highway.

You can either drive the Cassiar Highway , which is a small mostly rural route, or drive the Alaska Canada Highway aka the Al-Can , which is a slightly larger, slightly less rural route. As we proceeded further north, we had the chance to watch Autumn turn into Winter at 70 mph. Very quickly the landscape went from greens and browns, to white. For the first leg of our trip, we planned on driving as far as Muncho Lake, in BC. There was a dog friendly hotel I found and it was about 8 hours away from our starting point. We pulled up to the hotel after sundown and were immediately greeted by the caretaker outside. I looked over at Lauren both a bit weary and excited and told her the good news. It was when the caretaker opened his mouth next that everything turned sour. I thanked him for the offer and got back in the car. Lauren and I just sat there in dead silence. We had no idea what to do. It was 14 Degrees outside, snow was falling, and we were in the middle of the Northern Rockies with nowhere to stay. We finally looked at each other and simply said, keep moving forward. We then began the most difficult and amazing part of our adventure. We started driving and figured we would just keep going until we found another hotel that was open. We started driving again, but much slower than the posted speed. The combination of snow fall, absolute darkness, and the road conditions made the drive pretty painful. Suddenly up ahead in the road, we saw something moving, it was bright white. As we got closer it stopped, turned and looked at us. It was a pure white mountain goat. I was only able to grab one, admittedly bad, photograph before he scampered off. For the next couple of hours we kept driving and experienced the most amazing animal adventure ever. We drove by an entire herd of buffalo resting along the roadside, caribou grazing on bits of grass poking through the frost, and even a group of wild horses trotting along the side of the car. All the animals were just walking back and forth in the middle of the road, licking the salt off the pavement. Driving in those conditions is highly strenuous. I kept waking up once an hour or so and having to start the car for 20 minutes to bring the heat back up before turning it off and falling asleep again. After catching a few hours of nap time, we started back on the Alaska Canada Highway. As sunrise hit, we entered the Yukon territory. We were hungry, tired, and out of water when we reached Watson Lake. We did what anyone in our situation would do, we melted snow so the dogs could have a drink of water and we kept going. We fueled up, had some terrible coffee, and got back on the road. Immediately we were rewarded with more animal sightings, as they came out at sunrise for a snack. It was absolutely mind-blowing to be this close to nature. The remaining 8- hours or so of that day were kinda blur. If you are making the same drive, make sure to stop at Kluane Lake , and take it all in. We continued through some more small towns as we made our way towards the Alaska border. After about 6 hours of driving we came to the Alaska border and re-entered the USA. From here it was another 2 hours to Tok, AK. The next day, we picked back up on the Al-Can and finally came to the end of the road when we hit the very small town of Delta Junction. From this point, our time on the Alaska Canada Highway came to an end. We continued on our adventure towards Deadhorse, Alaska and the famed Dalton Highway. And no wonder there are questions: Such a trip requires planning. Following are the top ten most-frequently-asked questions about driving the Alaska Highway, and our answers. Is the Alaska Highway paved? What are road conditions like? Road construction is a fact of life here in the summer, although delays are usually minimal. The asphalt surfacing of the Alaska Highway ranges from poor to excellent. Much of the highway is in fair condition, with older patched pavement and a minimum of gravel breaks and chuckholes. Recently upgraded sections of road offer excellent surfacing. Damaged road is usually flagged with small orange flags or cones. Expect about miles of narrow road with curves and hills with 10 percent grades and few passing lanes. This stretch of road crosses Summit Pass Historic Milepost , highest summit on the Alaska Highway at 4, feet elevation. You may experience an odd snowstorm here, even in July. After winding through the MacDonald River valley—few guardrails and watch for caribou and stone sheep on the road—the highway straightens out again for the next miles into Watson Lake, YT. The stretch of road between Watson Lake and Whitehorse, approximately another miles, is in fair to good condition, with easy curves through wide river valleys and along lakes. From Whitehorse to Haines Junction, a distance of miles, it is straight road with poor to fair surfacing with gravel breaks and frost heaves. The next driving miles, from Haines Junction to the Alaska border, consists of long straight stretches of improved highway with wide lanes and generous shoulders; an improved section that winds along the shore of Kluane Lake followed by and a long, often bumpy, frost-heaved stretch of road—in various stages of improvement—from Destruction Bay to the Alaska border. From the Alaska—Yukon border to Tok, the Alaska Highway has curves and grades; it was in poor to fair condition in fall Both these sections of road have straight stretches interrupted by easy curves. What kind of vehicle should I take? Drive what you want to drive, just make sure it is mechanically sound with good tires and a spare. You will see all sorts of vehicles traveling the Alaska Highway in summer, from bicycles, motorcycles, vintage and compact cars to pop-up trailers, motorhomes, 5th-wheelers towing passenger cars and plenty of trucks, big and small. What do I need to know about crossing the border? NEXUS can also be used at participating airport kiosks. Is cell phone and internet service available? There are long stretches of the Alaska Highway without cell phone service. Service will also depend on your U. Coverage is increasing in bush villages and available in large communities. John and Dawson Creek. Coverage is good in Alberta along the East Access Route. Cellular service in western Canada is provided by Bell and Telus. How far apart are services? Gas, diesel, food and lodging are found in towns and cities along the Alaska Highway, as well as at smaller unincorporated communities, roadhouses and lodges located between the larger population centers. With the closure of several long-time roadhouses in recent years, and the seasonal nature of others, motorists should plan for to miles between services on a couple stretches of highway. Pay attention to your gas tank and drive on the top half of your tank. Motorists should also keep in mind that not all highway businesses are open year-round, nor are most services available 24 hours a day. Remember that you will be driving in 2 different countries that use 2 different currencies: For the best rate, exchange your money at a bank. There are banks in Dawson Creek, Fort St. Haines Junction has banking service at the post office. Most businesses but not all will take major credit cards. Be aware that many credit card companies tack on a fee for foreign currency transactions. Do we need reservations? Small to mid-sized communities along the Alaska Highway often have limited accommodations that can fill up with gas patch and road crews as well as tourists. It can get just as busy at the larger communities along the highway during the summer. There are many private RV parks and campgrounds along the Alaska Highway, as well as government campsites. British Columbia has 6 provincial park campgrounds on the Alaska Highway; Yukon maintains 8 government campgrounds; and in Alaska there are 10 state and federal recreation sites for camping along the Alaska Highway. Plan to pull in in the afternoon to make sure you get a spot. During the high-season mid-summer , certain campgrounds can fill up early in the day. The weather can include below freezing temperatures well into May. Campgrounds in many areas of Yukon and Alaska interior remain closed until mid-to late May or offer reduced services because of frozen water lines. When is the best time to go? The Alaska Highway is driven year-round, although most tourist traffic hits the road between May and September. Expect cold nights freezing and below by early September in parts of Yukon and Interior Alaska. Keep in mind that some attractions and businesses in the North operate seasonally, opening around Memorial Day weekend and closing after Labor Day weekend. June and July offer lots of daylight, with summer solstice on or around June 21st. This gives you extra-long days for driving, fishing, hiking and sightseeing. May and June tend to be drier than July, but in the North as elsewhere, weather is unpredictable. Along with warm temps and long days you can expect bugs. Bring repellent for yourself and any furry family members to make your stops more enjoyable. What are winter driving conditions? Staff frequently receives questions about driving the Alaska Highway in winter from people curious about Alaska winters, the northern lights and winter tourism opportunities. Military families and others who move to or from Alaska in the off-season are also curious to know how to ensure they have a safe trip despite winter road conditions and possible extreme temperatures. Cell service at the lake was always spotty. The weather was beautiful, she was with friends. If something was up, she would call us," said Dawn. But Maddy never called. The locals call it "The Highway of Tears" for a reason. Since , at least 18 women have gone missing or have been murdered in this very same area He has written about this haunted highway and the Maddy Scott case. Somebody knows something," said Sgt. They begin by developing a profile of Maddy. She was close to her brother, Ben, and sister Georgia. After graduating high school, Maddy began working with her father in the logging industry. She was well-loved and liked in the community. She was an avid outdoors person," Wamstecker explained. She was really thoughtful," she said. The girls cannot think about their close friend without remembering all the videos they made together. In an eerie twist, Maddy co-wrote and starred in a suspense movie called, "The Stalker. Were you there when Maddy was killed? Frustrated and heartbroken, Dawn and Eldon began their own investigation, separate from the official police version of events. Who they arrived with, with who they left with. She can be seen on a security camera recorded just hours before she vanished. Why did everybody leave? Word had spread online. Big party," said Bolduc. Asked if there were strangers at the party, Bolduc told Van Sant, "I know most of them, but the people that came at the very end of the party, I did not know. I had no idea who they were. Jordy Bolduc was injured, so her boyfriend carried her to his truck and told Maddy they were leaving. By 10 the following morning, Bolduc was feeling guilty about leaving Maddy alone. She returned to the lake to help her pack up. And I looked around Jordy Bolduc noticed that the tent was a mess. Her rings were outside She was one of the last people I aced the polygraph," she replied in a whisper. The investigation spread outward and Sgt. Floyd learned that year-old Fribjon Bjornson, a logger and single father of two, was telling friends he knew what happened to Maddy. He is bad news," said Bolduc. Bjornson, better known as "Frib", led a troubled life and abused drugs -- a fact confirmed by police. But his mother insists her son was turning his life around. There was talk in town that Frib owed drug dealers money and that they had abducted Maddy to teach him a lesson. He voluntarily took a lie detector test and passed. Based largely on that polygraph test, the RCMP cleared him. But two days later, Bjornson disappeared. Two weeks later, investigators made a shocking discovery. You see her on the side of the road on one of these signs. What is that like for you? Just six months earlier in the same town, another daughter disappeared. Every night I go to sleep thinking about Loren," Doug Leslie said. So I thought that was kind of strange," said Leslie. So when police promised -but failed - to call him back, he headed out along a dark road that feeds into the notorious Highway of Tears. Doug Leslie had no idea that, hours earlier, an alert cop had made a traffic stop on that road. And out of one of these logging roads, these skid roads, a black pickup truck comes out He was held at the scene while a game warden was summoned and followed fresh tire tracks back through the snow. Instead he finds the body of a year-old girl who had just been killed and dumped there," said Friel. It was at that moment that Doug Leslie came upon the scene. And he was white as a ghost," Leslie told Van Sant. And they said all they could tell me was they were investigating a homicide. So I knew right away. And his arrest also brought little peace to the families of the women killed along the Highway of Tears -- the cases that Sgt. Wayne Clary is determined to solve. Sergeant Clary took over the special unit assigned to the Highway of Tears cases in There will be forensic reports, lab reports, witness interviews," he explained. More than 60, people have been interviewed. To show the challenges his people face, Clary took "48 Hours" into the air to fly the nearly miles of the Highway of Tears -- from the interior all the way to the sea.
