In this section of the ASVAB you will be required to view pieces of an object and then determine how those pieces fit together. Your Auto and Shop Information subtest score is used to determine various job qualifications. It is not used in determining your Armed Forces Qualification Test score. On the ASVAB for the Auto and Shop Information subtest you will have 7 minutes to answer 11 auto-related questions and 6 minutes to answer 11 shop-related questions. On the paper version of the ASVAB, you will have 11 minutes to answer 25 questions, which are usually split between auto-related questions and shop-related questions. The Electronics Information subtest covers a variety of electrical-related subjects including: You will need to know major electrical concepts, including how to use conductors, currents, circuits and insulators, among other things. Earth science, biology, chemistry, health and more. However, it is used to help determine qualification for a number of different military jobs. It is filled with questions covering basic high school math. This subtest is counted as part of your Armed Forces Qualification Test score, so you will want to perform as well as you can.
