They are easy to install and can be sturdy and opaque or made from a translucent linen. It is traditional for all shades to stop at the window sill. The mounting board for outside mount shades attached with bracket. Select an applique design or a stencil. Roman shades pleat up from the bottom with the first part of the shade disappearing first. If you have a stencil or applique on the bottom edge of the shade, it will not show when the shade is up. A good place for a motif to be displayed is the top face pleat. There, it will look like a soft fabric valance when the shade is drawn up. Generally, Roman shades come with drawing cords for the rigging on the right side of the shade. However, you may specify "left draw", for example, for the left of a bank of windows. Roman shades may be lined, just like curtains. Roman shades come with all the hardware you will need, including cleats to hold the cording against the wall. In stencilling, one of the simplest methods of duplication, the design is cut out of paper or any other suitable thin, strong material and is then printed by rubbing, rolling, or spraying paint through the cutout areas. It is often called hand colouring, or hand illustration. The major disadvantage of the stencil method is that, although any open design can easily be cut in a stencil, a design enclosing another is impracticable because the middle design drops out. This can be dealt with by using two overlapping half designs. If all parts of the stencil are held together with a web of threads, however, greater freedom will result. When applied to mass-produced commercial products, such as fabrics, this process is called silk screen. When an artist designs, makes, and prints his own stencil to produce a fine print, it is called screenprinting formerly serigraphy, and the product is called a screenprint. Several methods may be used to obtain a stencil on a screen mesh. In one method, called the blackout-, or glue-cutout-, stencil method, those parts of the screen that are to be stopped are filled with water-soluble glue. Lines could be reserved in these parts by drawing with lithographic tusche a greasy ink or crayon, which could later be washed out of the glue with turpentine. Water-based inks are now more common. Another method, called the film-stencil method, employs stencils cut from a thin sheet of coloured lacquer laminated to a sheet of glassine paper. The design is cut only through the lacquer layer, and the finished stencil is fixed to the underside of the screen. The glassine paper is then removed from the stencil, and the design is printed. Photographic transfers both in line and halftone can also be fixed to the screen with a light-sensitive emulsion, which is exposed to light through a drawing or a film positive. This method is primarily a reproductive technique, because no original designing is actually done on the screen. American painters including Robert Rauschenberg, Andy Warhol, and Larry Rivers, however, have used photographic screens in their works. Screenprinting is done with a liquid ink that is forced through the open screen by the sharp rubber blade of a squeegee. Since most of the inks used for this purpose are opaque, the reproduction of gouache opaque watercolours is almost perfect. Transparent colours can also be used, as can water-based colours through screens stopped with plastic or polymer. Screenprinting began to be used for noncommercial purposes in 1930s, when a group of American artists working with the Federal Art Project experimented with the technique and subsequently formed the National Serigraph Society to promote its use. Prehistoric hand stencils , Cueva de las Manos in Argentina Hand stencils , made by blowing pigment over a hand held against a wall, are found from over 35,000 years ago in Asia and Europe, and later prehistoric dates in other continents. Stencils may have been used to color cloth for a very long time; the technique probably reached its peak of sophistication in Katazome and other techniques used on silks for clothes during the Edo period in Japan. In Europe, from about 1500 they were commonly used to color old master prints printed in black and white, usually woodcuts. Low wages contributed to the popularity of the highly labor-intensive process. In the pochoir process, a print with the outlines of the design was produced, and a series of stencils were used through which areas of color were applied by hand to the page. A template is used to create an outline of the image. Stencils templates can be made from any material which will hold its form, ranging from plain paper, cardboard, plastic sheets, metals, and wood. Official use[ edit ] Stencils are frequently used by official organizations, including the military, utility companies, and governments, to quickly and clearly label objects, vehicles, and locations. Stencils for an official application can be customized, or purchased as individual letters, numbers, and symbols. This allows the user to arrange words, phrases and other labels from one set of templates, unique to the item being labeled. When objects are labeled using a single template alphabet, it makes it easier to identify their affiliation or source. Stencil graffiti Stencils have also become popular for graffiti , since stencil art using spray-paint can be produced quickly and easily. These qualities are important for graffiti artists where graffiti is illegal or quasi-legal, depending on the city and stenciling surface. The extensive lettering possible with stencils makes it especially attractive to political artists. For example, the anarcho-punk band Crass used stencils of anti-war , anarchist , feminist and anti-consumerist messages in a long-term graffiti campaign around the London Underground system and on advertising billboards. There has been a semi-recent trend in making multi-layered stencils with different shades of grey for each layer creating a more detailed stenciled image. Stencils are usually applied in the home with a paint or roller brush along wall borders and as trim. They can also be applied with a painted sponge for a textured effect. Stencil templates can be purchased or constructed individually. Typically they are constructed of flexible plastics, including acetate, mylar, and vinyl. Military stenciling[ edit ] Stencils have been used in the military across most nations for many years and continue to be used today. They are used to mark up equipment, vehicles, rations, signposts, helmets, etc. One use of military stencils was the application of playing card designs to USA Airborne helmets during World War Two as a method to identify regimental units. Silk screening[ edit ] Silk screening is a type of printing on paper or textiles , in which an ink is embedded in the cloth. The ink is controlled through the use of a stencil, which is placed directly over the paper or textile. This process can only handle one color of ink at a time. Therefore, multi-colored designs must be silk screened several times, with each interval taking time to dry. Stencil lithography has unique advantages compared to other patterning techniques: Thus it allows a wide range of substrates e. Other stencil forms[ edit ] Main article: Screen printing A stencil technique is employed in screen printing which uses a tightly woven mesh screen coated in a thin layer of emulsion to reproduce the original image.
