He is considered one of the so-called Five Good Emperors, and his reign was marked by internal stability and military success. Hadrian associated himself strongly with his military, going so far as to spend meal times with his troops. Whatever the case, his family was part of the Roman establishment. His father was a prominent senator, Publius Aelius Hadrianus Afer. It is considered by some authorities that his later official biography was deliberately written in order to make it look as though he was a native of Rome, giving his birth date as January 24, 76 A. His mother was from Gades now Cadiz and was the daughter of another prominent senatorial family. When Hadrian was ten, both his parents died, and he was then made the ward of Trajan. He was recalled to Rome by Trajan when he was 14, and never again visited Italica. Entry into Military Service The first army role that Hadrian took on was in the Second Legion, the Adiutrix, for which he served as tribune. A few years later, he was moved to the First Legion, known as Minervia, in Germany. In 98, the Emperor Nerva died, and Hadrian went personally to tell Trajan the news. Although he later spent a short amount of time in Greece, being elected as a citizen of Athens, his career at this time mostly centered around Upper Pannonia. While serving in the Fifth legion, Hadrian fought in a series of wars against the Dacians. It is said, although with little surviving evidence, that he was rewarded by Trajan " who was by now Emperor " for his military prowess. Nevertheless, he was soon appointed as governor of Syria when the incumbent had gone to address further problems with the Dacians. By now, Trajan was mortally ill, and attempted to go home to Rome, leaving Hadrian in charge of the Roman rearguard in Syria. The Emperor was dying before he could complete his journey, so he adopted Hadrian as his heir. Once back in Rome, Hadrian efficiently ensured loyalty from his legions, dismissing those who seemed to be potential trouble-makers. Hadrian developed a reputation for excellence in his military administration, but part of the reason for this was that his reign was relatively peaceful, with the Second Roman-Jewish War being the only really major conflict of his years in power. He proved himself to be a pragmatic Emperor, preferring to make peace with the Parthians in rather than go to war. Hadrian also realized that the Mesopotamian lands conquered by his predecessor, Trajan, were almost impossible to defend in the long term and therefore decided to abandon them. Instead, Hadrian believed that the Empire as it stood should be strengthened, rather than attempting any further expansions; indeed, his reign marked the end of any significant Roman expansion. To this end, he decided to construct fortified defenses on the borders of the Empire. However, there were also substantial fortifications along the Rivers Rhine and Danube. At first, Hadrian had shown some compassion, allowing Jerusalem " which had lain in ruins since the First Roman-Jewish War sixty years earlier " to be rebuilt, but he later adopted harsher measures, building a temple to Jupiter on top of the Temple. This resulted in a large-scale uprising, which may have resulted in the destruction of an entire Roman legion. The rebellion was finally crushed after almost four years, by which time more than half a million Jews lay dead. Hadrian continued to persecute the Jews for the rest of his reign. On July 10, , he died aged 62 in his country villa at Baiae. From the descriptions given by contemporary sources, it is generally thought that he died of heart failure. Hadrian was buried close to his villa, but a little later, his remains were taken to Rome to be interred in the Domitian Gardens. In the iconography of the age of Hadrian, certain Hellenizing features—the wearing of a short Greek beard by the males and the adoption by the females of a simple, classicizing coiffure—are harmonized with new experiments. His father died in 85, and Hadrian was entrusted to the care of two men: In 90 Hadrian visited Italica, where he remained for several years. There he received some kind of military training and also developed a fondness for hunting that he kept for the rest of his life. Rise to power When Trajan was consul in 91, Hadrian began to follow the traditional career of a Roman senator, advancing through a conventional series of posts. He was military tribune with three Roman legions. Toward the end of 97, Hadrian was chosen to go west to Gaul to convey congratulations to Trajan, whom the aged emperor Nerva had just adopted and thereby designated his successor. Inevitably, hostility and envy awaited him. The greatest single political figure behind the emperor Trajan was the man who had masterminded his elevation, Lucius Licinius Sura. For a time Servianus could do no harm. In Hadrian became tribune of the plebs and, exceptionally, advanced to the praetorship in . In he was briefly governor of Lower Pannonia. In Licinius Sura had held that office for the third time, an honour vouchsafed to very few. Other promising young Romans suffered a similar retardation at about the same time. Perhaps Servianus played some role. One source says that Hadrian was an officer under Trajan during the Parthian wars at the end of his reign. In , when Trajan began his journey westward, Hadrian was left in charge of the crucial army in Syria. On August 9 Hadrian learned that Trajan had adopted him, the sign of succession. On the 11th, it was reported that Trajan had died on the way to Rome, whereupon the army proclaimed Hadrian emperor. Certainly, it was Trajan who had taken the fateful step of entrusting the army of Syria to Hadrian. The new emperor began a slow return to Italy. He ordered the summary executions of four senators of exalted, consular rank, all it would seem threats to the security of Hadrian. This bloody prelude to the new regime was unsettling, and Hadrian affirmed it was contrary to his will; he laid the blame on Attianus, just as he often blamed instructions of the dead Trajan for other unpopular acts. When Hadrian reached Rome in the summer of , his position was reasonably stable. He courted popular sentiment by public largesse, gladiatorial displays, and a formal cancellation of debts to the state. Attianus, however, was replaced, and his colleague in the prefecture, Sulpicius Similis, was also dismissed. Hadrian installed as prefects the distinguished Marcius Turbo, a general to whom the new emperor owed much, and Septicius Clarus, the patron of Suetonius the biographer. Before many years had passed, both of these men had fallen into disgrace. Hadrian was mercurial or possibly just shrewdly calculating in dispensing favours. The new emperor remained at Rome for three years. In he set forth on a tour of the empire, west and east, to inspect troops and examine frontier defenses. He went to Gaul and Germany, thence to Britain in . From there he moved on to Spain and spent the winter in Tarraco, where he made arrangements for coping with an uprising in Mauretania Morocco. He next passed eastward, approaching Asia Minor Anatolia by the Aegean after an overland trip through the Balkans. He quickly negotiated some problems with the Parthians and then visited northwestern Asia Minor. Returning to the west coast in , he sailed to Athens and finally reached Rome again in . This prolonged absence from the capital of the empire had its administrative justifications. There had been disturbances in some provinces, and the Parthians had to be dealt with; there was a general need for imperial supervision. Nevertheless, another motive impelled the emperor in his journeys—namely, an insatiable curiosity about everything and everybody. The Christian writer Tertullian called him rightly *omnium curiositatum explorator*, an explorer of everything interesting. That curiosity was bred of a keen intellect and an anguished spirit. These together drove him inexorably, and by a roundabout path, to the Greek East. After he left Spain early in , he never saw the western provinces again. Hadrian soon came to look upon his reign as a new Augustan age. In he began to style himself Hadrianus Augustus, deliberately evoking the memory of his great predecessor; he announced a golden age on his coinage. The peace he so much cherished was a latter-day Augustan peace, and

he bequeathed to posterity a public statement of his exploits that imitated the one left by Augustus. Hadrian spent another three years in Rome, but in he set forth again. After a visit to North Africa , he went to Athens, and from there he sailed to Asia Minor; he penetrated far eastward into Syria and Arabia. Crossing over into Egypt, he explored the Nile ; then, for the third time, he went to Athens. It is not certain whether Hadrian returned to Rome in or a little later; he was certainly there in May of , but by then a revolt in Judaea forced him abroad still another time. He went to Palestine, not as a tourist but as a commander. In northern Britain he initiated the construction of the tremendous frontier wall that bears his name from Wallsend-on-Tyne to Bowness-on-Solway. At Lambaesis , in Algeria, his rigorous inspection of the troops and his severe standards of discipline can be seen in a long inscription preserving an address he made to the soldiers in He created the Panhellenion, a federation of Greeks that was based at Athens, which gave equal representation to all Greek cities and thereafter played a conspicuous part in the history of Roman Greece. At the shrine of Delphi , Hadrian gave his support to a building renaissance. The impact of all this on Hadrian personally cannot be exaggerated. Like Augustus before him, he was initiated into the Greek mystery religion at Eleusis , and, after the temple of Olympian Zeus was dedicated, he assumed the title Olympius. He was an adept in astrology , like many intelligent Romans of the time. He had a lively sense of the past, preferring older writers to more recent ones, favouring archaism for its own sake. He revolutionized style in the empire by wearing a beard and setting a precedent for generations of emperors. When, as they journeyed together along the Nile in , the boy fell into the river and drowned, Hadrian was desolate and wept openly. Although Hadrian himself denied this, the sober 3rd-century historian Dio Cassius thought it was the truth. The religious character, if such there was, of the relation between Hadrian and the boy is totally elusive. The emotional involvement is, however, quite clear. Statues of the boy became a common sight. Four complete poems of his composition survive; they illustrate an exceptional technical mastery of versification, although the manner of expression is often artificial and the subjects are slight. His most famous verses are the lines addressed to his soul and reportedly uttered as he lay dying. In architecture, the emperor had a notorious quarrel with a leading contemporary architect, Apollodorus of Damascus , whom it is even alleged Hadrian had put to death. His ultimate artistic achievement was undoubtedly the villa he created for himself at Tivoli , outside Rome. Here the emperor surrounded himself with elegant evocations of his travels; by landscaping and superior reproductions, he re-created the sights he most loved and thereby managed in his last years to experience the satisfactions of travel without ever leaving the shores of Italy. Latin literature did not progress during his reign. The greatest Hadrianic authors, Suetonius the biographer, Juvenal the satirist, and Tacitus the historian, were all, in a sense, only survivors of the Trajanic age. They had no immediate literary heirs. Probably there had been a literary quarrel. Of two eminent orators, Dionysius of Miletus and Favorinus of Arelate in Gaul , Hadrian openly favoured and advanced the former; he then tried to overthrow him. In Rome itself, during his brief sojourns there, Hadrian left his memorial in several imposing buildings. Designs for the Temple of Rome and Venus provoked the conflict with Apollodorus. He completely rebuilt the Pantheon , which had been destroyed by fire in the reign of his predecessor. What had moved them is not altogether clear. Rabbinical literature alludes to a Hadrianic persecution that caused fear and apostasy. The probable explanation of this kind of reference is a universal ban on circumcision that Hadrian issued in, it seems, the early s. The emperor had an abhorrence of physical mutilation and even went so far as to declare that castration was no less a crime than murder. In the same spirit he denounced and forbade circumcision, which he viewed as mutilation. There is no reason to imagine that Hadrian intended by his measure to punish or provoke the Jews. The uprising came swiftly and understandably. He first placed an able general, Sextus Julius Severus , in charge of the problem. Recent discoveries have shown that several measures connected with the close of the revolt and often cited as indications of imperial severity have to be dated at least six years earlier and, very probably, well before that. Hadrian meted out no savage punishments in Servianus and others may, however, have seen in his young grandson, Pedanius Fuscus, a successor to Hadrian. In both Servianus and Fuscus were executed. The emperor had realized that it was time to face the issue of succession, and he wanted it resolved in his own way. The extravagant life of Ceionius, later renamed Lucius Aelius Caesar , portended a disastrous reign. Fortunately, he died two years later, and Hadrian, close to death himself, had to choose again. This time he picked an

year-old boy named Annius Verus, the future emperor Marcus Aurelius. In Hadrian arranged for the succession to pass to the young Verus. His arrangements were clever. An estimable and mature senator, Antoninus , was adopted by Hadrian and designated to succeed him. The emperor, however, required that Antoninus adopt both the young Verus and the eight-year-old son of the recently deceased Ceionius. Thus, the family of his first choice was remembered, whereas an early succession for the older boy seemed assured.

And it took me years to learn enough to live up to what they said for those first notices. I remember the critic very well and have never forgiven him. Meeting Laurence Olivier[ edit ] Laurence Olivier saw Leigh in The Mask of Virtue, and a friendship developed after he congratulated her on her performance. Olivier and Leigh began an affair while acting as lovers in Fire Over England , but Olivier was still married to actress Jill Esmond. Selznick , who was planning a film version. Without apparent provocation, she began screaming at him before suddenly becoming silent and staring into space. She was able to perform without mishap, and by the following day she had returned to normal with no recollection of the event. It was the first time Olivier witnessed such behaviour from her. During production, she developed a reputation for being difficult and unreasonable, partly because she disliked her secondary role but mainly because her petulant antics seemed to be paying dividends. He was not well known in the United States despite his success in Britain, and earlier attempts to introduce him to American audiences had failed. Selznick watched her performances that month in Fire Over England and A Yank at Oxford and thought that she was excellent but in no way a possible Scarlett because she was "too British". Leigh travelled to Los Angeles, however, to be with Olivier and to try to convince David Selznick that she was the right person for the part. Myron Selznick also represented Olivier and when he met Leigh, he felt that she possessed the qualities that his brother was searching for. She secured the role of Scarlett soon after. Cukor was dismissed and replaced by Victor Fleming , with whom Leigh frequently quarrelled. She and Olivia de Havilland secretly met with Cukor at night and on weekends for his advice about how they should play their parts. Hate, hate, and never want to do another film again! She had two great concerns: Actresses go on for a long time and there are always marvellous parts to play. Esmond was granted custody of Tarquin, her son with Olivier. Holman was granted custody of Suzanne, his daughter with Leigh. He refused to allow her to join Olivier in Pride and Prejudice , and Greer Garson played the role Leigh had wanted for herself. Olivier are handsome young people, they hardly act their parts at all. With the United States not yet having entered the war, it was one of several Hollywood films made with the aim of arousing a pro-British sentiment among American audiences. Roosevelt and, on its conclusion, addressed the group, saying, "Gentlemen, I thought this film would interest you, showing great events similar to those in which you have just been taking part. Leigh was filming Caesar and Cleopatra when she discovered she was pregnant, then had a miscarriage. All British films in this period were adversely affected by a Hollywood boycott of British films. She became Lady Olivier. The tour was an outstanding success and, although Leigh was plagued with insomnia and allowed her understudy to replace her for a week while she was ill, she generally withstood the demands placed upon her, with Olivier noting her ability to "charm the press". Members of the company later recalled several quarrels between the couple as Olivier was increasingly resentful of the demands placed on him during the tour. An exhausted and exasperated Olivier screamed an obscenity at her and slapped her face, and a devastated Leigh slapped him in return, dismayed that he would hit her publicly. Subsequently, she made her way to the stage in borrowed pumps, and in seconds, had "dried her tears and smiled brightly onstage". Olivier told a journalist, "You may not know it, but you are talking to a couple of walking corpses. Nevertheless, she believed strongly in the importance of the work. Olivier and Leigh were chagrined that part of the commercial success of the play lay in audience members attending to see what they believed would be a salacious story, rather than the Greek tragedy that they envisioned. Leigh herself had mixed feelings about her association with the character; in later years, she said that playing Blanche DuBois "tipped me over into madness". Shortly after filming commenced, she had a nervous

breakdown and Paramount Pictures replaced her with Elizabeth Taylor. David Niven said she had been "quite, quite mad". John Gielgud directed *Twelfth Night* and wrote, " He dares too confidently Several weeks later, she miscarried and entered a period of depression that lasted for months. After their return to London, her former husband, Leigh Holman, who could still exert a strong influence on her, stayed with the Oliviers and helped calm her. Final years and death[ edit ] Merivale proved to be a stabilising influence for Leigh, but despite her apparent contentment, she was quoted by Radie Harris as confiding that she "would rather have lived a short life with Larry [Olivier] than face a long one without him". Merivale joined her for a tour of Australia , New Zealand and Latin America that lasted from July until May , and Leigh enjoyed positive reviews without sharing the spotlight with Olivier. She also appeared in the films *The Roman Spring of Mrs. Stone* and *Ship of Fools* Producer and director Stanley Kramer, who ended up with the film, planned to star Leigh but was initially unaware of her fragile mental and physical state. On the night of 7 July , Merivale left her as usual at their Eaton Square flat to perform in a play, and he returned home just before midnight to find her asleep. About 30 minutes later by now 8 July , he entered the bedroom and discovered her body on the floor. She had been attempting to walk to the bathroom and, as her lungs filled with liquid, she collapsed and suffocated. Olivier paid his respects, and "stood and prayed for forgiveness for all the evils that had sprung up between us", [] before helping Merivale make funeral arrangements; Olivier stayed until her body was removed from the flat. Her funeral was attended by the luminaries of British stage and screen. Vivien was different; ambitious, persevering, serious, often inspired. She is so perfectly designed for the part by art and nature that any other actress in the role would be inconceivable", [] and as her fame escalated, she was featured on the cover of *Time* magazine as *Scarlett*. In critic Andrew Sarris commented that the success of the film had been largely due to "the inspired casting" of Leigh, [] and in , wrote that "she lives in our minds and memories as a dynamic force rather than as a static presence". The papers of Vivien Leigh, including letters, photographs, contracts and diaries, are owned by her daughter, Mrs. It is now held as part of the record of the history of the performing arts in Australia.
