He tries to execute Reyna for patricide but is turned into a ghost by a furious Nico. Arriving at Camp Half-Blood with the help of Pegasus and several of his brethren, Nico and Hedge head out to the camp while Reyna, who is confronted by Orion, manages to kill him with the help of her mother Bellona, and Athena. Reyna reveals the Athena Parthenos, ending the warfare and rivalry. Meanwhile, the demigods head to the Acropolis and battle the army of giants, whom they kill with the help of the gods, after their split personalities are healed by the return of Athena Parthenos. However, the Giants are able to injure Percy and Annabeth, whose blood wakes Gaea. Gaea rises and begins to attack the camp. The seven demigods, transported by Zeus, arrive and battle Gaea. Piper charmspeaks Gaea to sleep, and Leo sacrifices himself with the help of a newly-revived Festus while blasting Gaea with fire, which, coupled with an onager attack that Octavian launched with him, destroying Gaea. The camps celebrate their victory together at Camp Half-Blood. Nico decides to reside in Camp Half-Blood and also reveals his crush to Percy but decides he has moved on. Jason, having been made a Pontifex, plans to visit Camp Jupiter occasionally to make offerings. Percy and Annabeth also plan to move to Camp Jupiter to attend college after they graduate from high school. He arrives at Ogygia to pick up Calypso. No longer bound to her curse, Calypso and Leo leave into the unknown.

Athena Minerva Athena was the virgin goddess of arts, craft and war. Also known as Athene, she was also identified as the Roman goddess, Minerva. Athena was daughter of Zeus and his first wife Metis wisdom , who was the daughter of Oceanus and Tethys. After Zeus had overthrown his father Cronus and became supreme ruler of heaven, Gaea warned her grandson that if Metis has a second child, it would be a son. Zeus was told that this son would one day overthrow him, as he had done to his own father Cronus. Not wanting to suffer the same fate as his father, he swallowed Metis, while she was still pregnant. Months later, Zeus suffered from a great headache. The gods were astonished and profoundly alarmed at this prodigy. It was only when she removed her helm, that Athena revealed herself to be less formidable in aspect. She was often referred to as Pallas Athene. There are several sources of where Athena got her name "Pallas" from. Apollodorus wrote that Triton , son of Poseidon, raised Athena as she was growing up. Athena was sometimes known by her epithet, Tritogeneia - "thrice born", either because of Triton or because she grew up at Lake Tritonis, in Libya. Triton had a daughter named Pallas, who became a playmate for Athena. The young goddess was playing with her friend, when Athena accidentally killed her. However, her father Zeus thrown the statue out of heaven and it landed in the tent of Ilus , the son of King Tros of Dardania. In another myth, where the Olympians fought against the giants, where they were aided by Heracles, Athene killed a giant named Pallas, whom the goddess flayed giant, and wore his skin that protect her. And it is from this battle, that she got her name. Apollodorus wrote both versions of Athena gaining the name Pallas. There is some confusion over the origin and meaning of the name Pallas. Pallas is a name that can be applied to either male or female character. In the case of Athena, when it was used as a name for a girl, the name Pallas probably means "girl" or "maiden". However, some modern scholars dispute this meaning, because Pallas could also mean "brandisher". As to the name of "Athena", the meaning is lost. Athena could be a pre-Hellenic name, either of Minoan or Mycenaean origin. There is a theory that Athena seems to be a pre-Hellenic goddess ie, before the arrival of Dorians, Ionians and Aeolians , existing originally as a Minoan or Mycenaean goddess of crafts, homes, hearth and communities. When the Hellenic people migrated to Greece, they brought with them Pallas, the virgin war goddess. The two goddesses fused into a single goddess, known as Pallas Athene, which we know of today, retaining the attributes and functions of both goddesses. However, this is merely modern speculation than fact. As a virgin goddess, she was known by her epithet, Parthenos. In art she was normally depicted as wearing the terror-inducing aegis, symbolising the dark storm clouds, and was armed with the resistless spear shaft of lightning. In the poem the Shield of Heracles, ascribed to Hesiod: She was armed like as if she would array a battle, with a spear in her hand, and a golden helmet, and the aegis about her shoulders. And was going towards the awful strife. She personified the clear upper air as well as mental clearness and acuteness, embodying the spirit of truth and divine wisdom. But Athena was also the goddess of war. She participated with skill and wisdom in wars to defend the state, but she did not fight, like Ares , with uncontrolled ferocity, or for the sheer love of strife and mindless slaughter. She did not participate in war for the love of killing, but rather, her activities in war were intended to restore order, and thus she was ultimately the goddess of peace. Athena represented the more noble aspects of war such as courage and self-control, whereas Ares symbolised the more brutal aspects of war. As the goddess of war, she also became patron goddess of many of the heroes, acting more like an ideal elder sister, providing guidance. She aided Bellerophon in taming the winged horse, Pegasus , by providing the bridle. According to some sources, Athena, not Poseidon, taught mankind the art of horsemanship, though Poseidon was a god of horses. The sight of cannibalism revolted her that she left Tydeus to die from his mortal wound. Athena had also helped several of her mortal half-brothers, such as Perseus and Heracles. She provided Perseus with information on how to kill the Gorgon Medusa. Athena accompanied and advised Heracles in various adventures. It was Athena who brought Heracles to aid the gods in a war against the giants Gigantes , known as Gigantomachia.

In this war, she killed a giant named Pallas by crushing him under a huge boulder. She was popular among the heroes, because she was the goddess of victory, and one of her epithets was Athena Nike. Athena was one of the goddesses who wanted the golden apple during the Judgement of Paris. She promised Paris to make him a great hero, winning all his wars. Her enmity was incurred against the Trojans when Paris awarded the apple to Aphrodite. She sided with the Greeks, often aiding her favourites, particularly Achilles, Diomedes and Odysseus. When Ares confronted her, she easily bested him. As Ares charged her, with his sword brandishing, Athena calmly hurled a large rock at Ares, knocking the war god unconscious. Perhaps it was revenge for losing the golden apple to Aphrodite in the Judgement of Paris. This was not the only confrontation she had with Ares. Odysseus was on the Thesprotian side because he had married Callidice, the Queen of the Thesprotians. No detail was given, except that Apollo separated the quarreling deities. Athena was responsible for causing Hector to fight Achilles without divine aid: Achilles killed Hector in single combat. Athena inflicted madness on Ajax, when he lost the armour of Achilles to Odysseus. It was a sacred statuette of Athena or that of her childhood friend Pallas, called the Palladium, which made Troy invulnerable to attack, during the Trojan War. Originally, the Palladium was kept in Olympus, but when the Pleiad Electra sought protection against Zeus who was determined to rape her, Zeus angrily threw it out of heaven, landing near the tent of Ilus. Upon the advice of the Trojan seer Helenus, Odysseus and Diomedes stole the Palladium from its altar. According to Vergil in the Aeneid, the Palladium that Diomedes and Odysseus had stolen was a fake, and Aeneas took the real Palladium with him to Italy. However, her enmity was turned towards most of the Greek leaders, when they failed to punish Ajax the Lesser for raping Cassandra in her temple. Athena asked Poseidon to destroy most of the Greek fleet in a violent storm. She appeared in various guises, offering advice to Penelope and Telemachus. Athena was probably also the goddess of justice. She thereby acquitted Orestes of murdering his mother. Cecrops was king of Attica at the time, the region was known as Cecropia, when she and her uncle Poseidon sought to claim Athens by becoming a patron deity of the city. The citizens awarded the city to Athena, because she caused an olive tree to spring out of the rock on the Acropolis. The city was then named after her. See Cecrops in the House of Athens. It was during this time that Hephaestus tried to ravish the virgin war-goddess. Athena easily repulsed his amorous advance upon her. The semen from Hephaestus fell on the ground of the Acropolis, impregnating the Earth Gaea, so Erichthonius was conceived. Some people suggested that Athena was really the mother of Erichthonius, without losing her virginity; the semen sprayed on her thigh, which she wiped off her leg and threw it on the ground; this could have easily given it life is one possibility that could be considered. Erichthonius was an infant with a tail and legs of a serpent. Athena hid the child in a chest. She gave the chest to Herse and Agraulus, daughters of Cecrops, warning them not to open the chest. However, the two sisters could not resist the temptation, and opened the box. Either Athena inflicted madness upon the girls for disobedience, or the deformity of Erichthonius drove them insane. Whichever was the case, the two sisters leaped off the Acropolis to their death. See Erichthonius in the House of Athens. As goddess of craft, she invented the flute, but discarded it when Hera and Aphrodite laughed at her whenever she blew it. She cursed anyone who picked up the musical instrument that she had discarded. A satyr named Marsyas picked up the flute and dared to challenge Apollo in a musical contest, but he lost and was flayed alive by the god. She helped Argus to build the Argo for Jason and his crew. Surprisingly, her role in the Quest was relatively small. Her place of worship was not only in Athens, but also in Argos, Sparta and Troy as well. The olive tree was sacred to her, and her sacred animals were horses, sea eagles, cocks and serpents, but her favourite bird was the owl.

The Trials of Apollo This article is written from a real world point of view. The book was released on October 7th, Disney Hyperion sent "Swag" boxes full of Heroes of Olympus goodies to famous youtubers and included a clue about the Seven, plus Nico and Reyna, on whether they will survive the final battle. Synopsis Though the Greek and Roman crew-members of the Argo II have made progress in their many quests, they still seem no closer to defeating the earth mother, Gaea. They must be stopped before the Feast of Spes, when Gaea plans to have two demigods sacrificed in Athens. She needs their blood—the blood of Olympus—in order to wake. The demigods are having more frequent visions of a terrible battle at Camp Half-Blood. The Roman legion from Camp Jupiter, led by Octavian, is almost within striking distance. Though it is tempting to take the Athena Parthenos to Athens to use as a secret weapon, the friends know that the huge statue belongs back on Long Island, where it might be able to stop a war between the two camps. The gods, still suffering from multiple personality disorder, are useless. As dangerous as it is to head to Athens, they have no other option. They have sacrificed too much already. And if Gaea wakes, it is game over. Jason, disguised as an old beggar man named Iros, is called out by Antinous who questions why Iros is there. Jason covers himself by stating that he is still running messages for the suitors and attempts to get more information out of Antinous. Eurymachus, a ghost, accidentally gives away information about how Gaea is stopping the demigods from getting to Acropolis. Eurymachus is stopped short by Antinous and is destroyed. Antinous tells Jason that Apollo no longer has control of Delphi and that Victory is running rampant, so there is no way the demigods will win. Beryl attempts to convince that Jupiter made her leave Jason at the Wolf House and that she had no choice. Beryl unsuccessfully tries to get Jason to fight for Gaea, who let her out from the Underworld, and then disappears as a spirit of insanity or mania. As the fight goes on, Jason is stabbed by Michael with an Imperial Gold gladius below his rib cage. Suddenly, a crack appears in the stone and Juno appears to tell the heroes that they need to find goddess of victory in Olympia because she is out of control and then find the twins, Artemis and Apollo who are in hiding from Jupiter. Juno disappears before her husband Jupiter finds her, and then Jason faints. Nico is too exhausted to shadow travel again, so Reyna helps by lending him her strength, which is a power of children of Bellona. They shadow travel one more time to Pompeii, where they lay camp for the night since Nico is unable to travel anymore. Coach Hedge takes first watch as Nico and Reyna go to sleep. Reyna dreams of a giant following them. Then her dreams take her to where Octavian is with the legion outside of Camp Half-Blood. Octavian personally takes on the highest title, Pontifex Maximus, which no demigod has ever done. Octavian has added two dozen different murderers, thieves, and traitors into the legion since Reyna has been gone, which makes Mike upset. By sunset, Nico wakes up and Reyna tells him about her dreams. Nico believes the dream is about a giant and to avoid it at all costs, but Coach and Reyna believe that fighting will be the best option. Reyna decides that she will contact the Amazons for help as well, but decides to work out the details until the next jump. Reyna controls the dead legionnaires, but they are still out numbered. Nico, finally strapped in to carry the Athena Parthenos, shadow travels. Subduing Nike Back on the Argo II, Leo is working on a secret project, but is interrupted when Piper tells him that there is a meeting in the mess hall. Leo joins the others, along with Buford, the table. The seven discuss going towards Olympia, meeting Nike, and which demigods should go and meet the goddess. They decide that Frank, Hazel, Percy Jackson, and Piper should go since they are the least competitive group that will not try to outdo each other. The four leave to go scout the area. Percy and Leo search a museum, while Frank and Hazel are looking at ruins. Before they could discuss it, Frank and Hazel get back accompanied by Arion who had appeared out of nowhere. The group head towards the ruins which are roughly five kilometers wide. They decide to walk through the ruins looking for something to pop up. Eventually, they head toward the Temple of Zeus where an old Nike statue used to stand. Leo and Percy provoke the goddess to come forth by challenging that Adidas

shoes are better than Nike shoes. The goddess challenges the four to a fight to the death, with the Romans and Greeks against each other. Nike demands for them to fight in an arena and gives them four minutes to be present. To make sure that they get there she sends four metal statues after them. Once there, the group comes up with a plan to get out of killing each other. Frank then puts a sock in her mouth and duct tape over her and they take her with them on the Argo II. Lycaon After shadow traveling, Nico is knocked unconscious and starts to dream of painful memories. Nico tells Clovis to tell Chiron that they are bringing the Athena Parthenos and that he need helps tracking down Thalia. Clovis shows Nico the war meeting they had at the Big House. Clarisse La Rue is telling the campers about the defenses that they have and blames Rachel Elizabeth Dare of not being able to warn them of the giant army outside of Camp Half-Blood. Ella has been too scared to mention anything about prophecies since the Romans surrounded. Clarisse demands that they attack the Roman base, which Jake Mason states is better defended than their own home. Then Nico is suddenly woken up by Coach Hedge. After the shadow travel, the Athena Parthenos is laying sideways on the column of the Temple of Diana. A spirit has been wandering around the trio and wants to talk to Nico. The spirit takes Nico to chapel, where Hades awaits. Hades tells Nico the hunter Gaea is employing is Orion. Orion already has the scent of the trio and will not stop hunting them until they are captured. Hades tells Nico that Hazel knows one of the Seven will die and that wolves are currently chasing after them as well. Nico quickly goes back to where the trio have set up camp and tells them about being chased by wolves. They engage in battle and eventually manage to shadow travel away, without a clear direction of where they are going. Unleashing the Makhai Meanwhile, Frank and Piper are on port of Pylos looking for the poison and failing. Frank goes in and talks to a man who hands him a bottle. Frank explains that his cousins, other descendants of Periclymenus , have been living there for generations. As a parting gift, the cousins gave Frank the small vial of poison. Frank has an idea of how to find a chained god in Sparta, but will not discuss it until the others are back on the Argo II. Once on the ship, Frank states that the chained god is Ares because the Spartans believed that if they chained him up the spirit of war would never leave them. Leo tells the crew that they should reach Sparta by tomorrow morning. Piper goes back to her room and Jason knocks on the door. Jason was about to take night duty but decided to meet Piper before he left. They talk and Piper tells him a Cherokee story. Piper has a dream about the Giants in Acropolis and finds that a giant called Mimas is waiting for them at Sparta. The next morning Piper tells the crew about her dreams and Percy unintentionally causes the toilets to explode. Annabeth tells him that they will be fine and heads of with Piper to find the chained god. They search everywhere and finally take a break on a hill. They talk to each other about how they feel about their boyfriends and Piper tries to comfort Annabeth about Percy. Suddenly, they spot an eruption of fire from a well looking hole down the hill. They walk down the hill to the well looking hole and find a set of three holes that spewed out fire.
