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Unincorporated area

Occasionally, municipalities dissolve or disincorporate, which may happen if they become fiscally insolvent, and services become the responsibility of a higher administration. In some countries, such as in Brazil, Japan, France or the United Kingdom, unlike many other countries, Australia has only one level of local government immediately beneath state and territorial governments. A local government area often contains several towns and even entire cities, thus, aside from very sparsely populated areas and a few other special cases, almost all of Australia is part of an LGA. Unincorporated areas are often in locations, cover vast areas or have very small populations. Postal addresses in unincorporated areas, as in parts of Australia. It is one of the worlds most ethnically diverse and multicultural nations, paleo-Indians migrated from Asia to the North American mainland at least 15, years ago. European colonization began in the 16th century, the United States emerged from 13 British colonies along the East Coast. On July 4., during the course of the American Revolutionary War, the war ended in with recognition of the independence of the United States by Great Britain, representing the first successful war of independence against a European power. The current constitution was adopted in , after the Articles of Confederation, the first ten amendments, collectively named the Bill of Rights, were ratified in and designed to guarantee many fundamental civil liberties. During the second half of the 19th century, the American Civil War led to the end of slavery in the country. By the end of century, the United States extended into the Pacific Ocean. The end of the Cold War and the dissolution of the Soviet Union in left the United States as the sole superpower. California is the most populous state in the United States and the third most extensive by area. Located on the western coast of the U. S, California is bordered by the other U. The Central Valley, an agricultural area, dominates the states center. What is now California was first settled by various Native American tribes before being explored by a number of European expeditions during the 16th and 17th centuries, the Spanish Empire then claimed it as part of Alta California in their New Spain colony. The area became a part of Mexico in following its war for independence. The western portion of Alta California then was organized as the State of California, the California Gold Rush starting in led to dramatic social and demographic changes, with large-scale emigration from the east and abroad with an accompanying economic boom. If it were a country, California would be the 6th largest economy in the world, fifty-eight percent of the states economy is centered on finance, government, real estate services, technology, and professional, scientific and technical business services. California groups also were diverse in their organization with bands, tribes, villages. Some 37 years later English explorer Francis Drake also explored and claimed a portion of the California coast in Spanish traders made unintended visits with the Manila galleons on their trips from the Philippines beginning in 1542. As of the 2000 census, the population was 3,000,000, Kern County comprises the Bakersfield, CA Metropolitan statistical area. The county spans the end of the Central Valley. Its northernmost city is Delano and its southern reach expands just beyond Lebec to the Grapevine, the county's economy is heavily linked to agriculture and to petroleum extraction. It is one of the fastest growing areas in the United States in terms of population growth, and suffers from significant water supply issues and poor air quality. The area was claimed by the Spanish in 1534, and in 1542 Commander Don Pedro Fages became the first European to enter it, in the beginning, the area that became Kern County was dominated by mining in the mountains and in the desert. The south of Tulare County was later organized as Kern County in 1846, with additions from Los Angeles and its first county seat was in the mining town of Havilah, in the mountains between Bakersfield and Tehachapi. The flatlands were considered inhospitable and impassable at the time due to swamps, lakes, tule reeds. This changed when settlers started draining lands for farming and constructing canals, within 10 years the valley surpassed the mining areas as the economic center of the county, and the county seat was moved as a result from Havilah to Bakersfield in 1849. On July 21, 1907, an earthquake occurred with the epicenter about 23 miles south of Bakersfield and it measured 7. In addition to the deaths, it was responsible for hundreds of injuries, the main shock was felt over much of California and as far away as Phoenix, Arizona and Reno, Nevada. The earthquake occurred on the White Wolf Fault and was the strongest to occur in California since the San Francisco earthquake, Tehachapi suffered the greatest damage and loss of life from the earthquake, though its effects were widely felt throughout central and southern California. Ground disturbances that were created by the earthquakes were also surveyed, the details of these false accusations are covered extensively in the documentary Witch Hunt, narrated by Sean Penn. Kern county is considered to be a hotbed of country music, the Buck Owens Crystal Palace is located in Bakersfield. Tehachapi is 35 miles east-southeast of Bakersfield, and west of Mojave, according to the United States Census Bureau, the city has a total area of 1.5 square miles. The Kawaiisu people are the Native American tribe whose homeland was the Tehachapi Valley, one possibility for the origin of the name Tehachapi comes from the Kawaiisu language. It may be derived from the word for hard climb or tihachipia, the settlement has been formerly known and spelled as, Tehachapai, Tehachapa, Tehachepi, Tehachipi, and Summit Station. Previously known as Old Town, Tehachapi was established in the 1840s and it is now registered as California Historical Landmark for being the oldest settlement in the Tehachapi Valley. Construction of the original Southern Pacific-SP railroad depot was the beginning of the downtown core and it is now on the National Register of Historic Places and was the oldest building in downtown Tehachapi until it burned in June 1907. The building had been in the stages of becoming a museum. It has since been using the original plans with only minor modifications to meet modern building codes. The new depot was dedicated on June 5, 1907, on July 21, Tehachapi was devastated by a magnitude 7. The population was 14, at the census, up from 10, at the census, the United States Census reported that Tehachapi had a population of 14, The population density was 1, The Census reported that 8, people lived in households, 6 lived in non-institutionalized group quarters, there were unmarried opposite-sex partnerships, and 18 same-sex married couples or partnerships. There were 2, families, the family size was 3. The median age was 30. For every females age 18 and over, there were 1.0 males. The range extends for approximately 40 miles in southern Kern County, the Tehachapis form a geographic, watershed, habitat, and rain shadow divide separating the San Joaquin Valley to the northwest and the Mojave Desert to the southeast. The Tehachapis crest varies in height from approximately 4,000 to 8,000 feet and they are southeast of Bakersfield and the Central Valley, and west of Mojave and the Antelope Valley. The range runs southwest to northeast connecting the Southern Sierra Nevada range

on their northeast with the San Emigdio Mountains on the west, the Tehachapis are delineated from the San Emigdio Mountains by Tejon Pass at the ranges western end. The canyon was named after grapevines, the California grapevine. Their relative lack of development, especially in the large Tejon Ranch section, have allowed the continuity of these functions to date. The Tehachapis are primarily in the California interior chaparral and woodlands sub-ecoregion, with grasslands, California oak woodlands. The higher montane elevations include the California mixed evergreen forest plant community, some of the chaparral woodland species include, canyon live oak, valley oak, blue oak, and gray pine. Montane species include, black oak, Coulter pine, incense cedar, white fir, the Tehachapi linanthus is a phlox plant species endemic to chaparral habitat in the Tehachapi Mountains and the southern Sierra Nevada. The Tehachapi ragwort is a plant species endemic to forest habitat in the Tehachapis. The Tehachapi buckwheat is known only from the chaparral of the Tehachapis, the Tehachapi slender salamander is endemic to the Tehachapi Mountains and a listed vulnerable species. The white-eared pocket mouse is endemic to the Tehachapis and San Bernardino Mountains, there are at least bird species, including the Stellers jay and mountain chickadee, found in the Tehachapis, many which consume acorns of the black oak as part of their diet. Other flora found here include the buckbrush and mountain mahogany, the notable raptor is the California condor, a critically endangered species. As in many California mountains, larger fauna includes, mule deer, mountain lion, coyote, fox, black bear, feral pig, bobcat, the Tehachapi Mountains are also the last known breeding site of the jaguar in the United States 7. It covers about square miles near the end of the San Joaquin Valley. Bakersfields population is approximately ,, making it the ninth-most populous city in California, the Bakersfieldâ€™Delano Metropolitan Statistical Area, which includes all of Kern County, had a census population of ,, making it the 62nd largest metropolitan area in the United States. The more built-up urban area that includes Bakersfield and areas immediately around the city, such as East Bakersfield, the city is a significant hub for both agriculture and oil production. Kern County is the most productive oil producing county, and the fourth most productive county in the United States. Industries include natural gas and other energy extraction, aerospace, mining, petroleum refining, manufacturing, distribution, food processing, the city is also the birthplace of the country music genre known as the Bakersfield sound. Archaeological evidence indicates the presence of Native American settlements dating back thousands of years, the Yokuts lived in lodges along the branches of the Kern River Delta and hunted antelope, tule elk, deer, bear, fish, and game birds. In , gold was discovered along the Kern River in the southern Sierra Nevada, the Bakersfield area, once a tule-reed-covered marshland, was first known as Kern Island to the handful of pioneers who built log cabins there in The area was subject to flooding from the Kern River, which occupied what is now the downtown area. In , disastrous floods swept away the original settlement founded in by the German-born Christian Bohna, among those attracted to the area by the California gold rush was Thomas Baker, a lawyer and former colonel in the militia of Ohio, his home state. Baker moved to the banks of the Kern River in , at what became known as Bakers Field, by , with a population of , what is now known as Bakersfield was becoming the principal town in Kern County. In , Bakersfield was officially incorporated as a city, alexander Mills was hired as the city marshal, a man one historian would describe as. An old man by the time he became Marshal of Bakersfield, but he was a Kentuckian, a handy man with a gun, and not lacking in initiative and resource when the mood moved him. Businessmen and others began to resent Mills, who was cantankerous, wanting to fire him but fearing reprisals, they came up with a scheme to disincorporate, effectively leaving him without an employer. According to local historian Gilbert Gia, the city was also failing to collect the taxes it needed for services, in , the city voted to disincorporate. For the next 22 years, a citizens council managed the community, by , the town had a population of , and by , it had a population of 2, Migration from Texas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Southern California brought new residents, the city reincorporated on January 11, 8.
