

Chapter 1 : Catch a Fire: The Life of Bob Marley Summary & Study Guide

I was so looking forward to reading Catch a Fire, the Life of Bob Marley by Timothy White, but truthfully it turned out to be a constant struggle. Timothy White is a font of information, rather than a good story-teller and that is a real shame.

The novel Catch a Fire is a complete biography depicting the events that happened to Bob Marley in his lifetime, as well as including the major events that influenced his behavior and thoughts. The beginning of the novel encapsulates the history of the Ethiopian people, specifically with Haile Selassie, who becomes the King of Ethiopia. The beginnings of Rastafarianism and why it started is fully explained. From there, the childhood and youth of Marley is explored. Marley is the child of a white American captain and Cedella Malcolm, typically called Ciddy. Captain Marley marries Cedella when he finds out that she is pregnant solely to make sure that his son will not be a bastard. For this reason, Ciddy essentially raises Bob, who she prefers to call by his middle name "Nesta. When Bob arrives in Kingston, however, his father immediately abandons him. When Ciddy comes to get him, she ultimately decides that she also wants to live in Kingston and works out a living arrangement with Toddy Livingston. Here, Bob gets his heavy influence in Jamaican culture and particular interest in reggae music. Bob stays in Jamaica and eventually begins to record music and establish a group – Bob Marley and the Wailers. Working with Coxsone Dodd and other producers, he establishes his group as a success. Flying to England to record for Island Records, he meets Chris Blackwell who takes his music to another group of people – Europeans. As the popularity of his music increases, Bob and the Wailers become a fantastic success internationally. Throughout it all, Marley proclaims his personal feelings and messages about Rastafarianism and Jamaica in his music. He becomes a symbol for the Jamaican people and for poor people internationally with his songs that are intensely personal, but have incredible universal appeal as well. Bob is sometimes brought into political arenas, which he tries to avoid and keep his music his only political message. However, at concerts like the "Smile Jamaica" concert, Marley is the centerpiece for Jamaican political figures and plays a role in trying to encourage peace and stability in Jamaica. Bob is diagnosed with cancer at 33 and will die by the age of 36, a fact that he himself foresees and foretells to his friends. After he dies, he leaves behind 11 claimed children and his wife Rita and his mother Cedella, both of whom restart their music careers in his wake. This section contains words approx.

This book has been stuck in my consciousness for the past few weeks and this is a brief summary of the book and my impressions from reading this phenomenal tale. I can really appreciate the amount of research Timothy White has done. Actually, I truly can not imagine what he has done, but he has given a glimpse of the details of how he gathered the pieces together to form this book. He then gives a brief historical account of Marcus Garvey, the African slave trade, tribal wars in Jamaica, traditional spiritual practices found in Jamaica and how these traditions have roots in Africa. All of this is meant to show how these are intertwined with the unique Jamaican sound of Reggae. Next, White moves to the rural area of Nine Miles where Bob spent the first 6 years of his life. At age 6 Bob first went to Kingston on the demand of his white father, Colonel Marley. His family lost touch with him and after a year his mother went searching for him and miraculously she found him and brought him back to Nine Miles for a few more years until they both moved to Kingston permanently. Bob grew up in a tenement yard a tightly knit ghetto of well established bonds and apparently knew how to fight and hang with the nastiest of ghetto street thugs. Along with many other youths at the time, he was about 18, Bob became inspired to approach a recording studio shark and asked if he could record an original song. Bob began his career very cautiously. He sold his first record and when his song was one among many in a local jukebox, he would stand by the machine and continuously load coins into it so he could hear his own voice. Sometimes giving brief information on various subjects such as the roots of Rastafarianism and the political atmosphere of Jamaica, White also touches on politics, spirituality, music and African heritage in order to have a better understanding of Bob Marley. Bob seemed very innocent and sincere when he agreed to play for the free Smile Jamaica concert. However, the attempted assassination in his home just a few days before the free concert must have given him a sense of responsibility for his music. Bob, wounded along with his wife Rita from the attempted assassination, gave a dramatic performance at the Smile Jamaica concert and left for London the following morning for a 3-year self-imposed exile. One memorable anecdote that White gives the reader is that Bob always woke up before dawn and had a cup of tea and went jogging during the first light of day. This is very important for anyone who wants to be successful in life. Bob said that sleep is an "escape for fools". White says that Bob never went to sleep unless everyone else in the house was already asleep and no matter what time that person went to sleep he would also wake up before everyone else woke up. And if sometimes the scene presented someone who was wired and who could not sleep and was up all night talking and smoking ganja, then Bob would stay up all night as well, and would not show any signs of fatigue the next day. White presents the life of Bob Marley in a factual manner with no emotional involvement. He earns the respect of the reader because his writing spans about 25 years. He has been interviewing Bob Marley and company and writing this story since about and the latest revised edition was released in 1993. White is humble in his approach and knows where he stands as an outsider observing a world that he is unfamiliar with. The reality of the mystical and transcendental aspect of life can not be explained by one who has not experienced or practiced the spiritual way of life. So, as a writer and reporter, White could offer mundane observations of what he heard and saw. But only an experienced soul who practices sincerely can give us what they have experienced on the transcendental level. Such a powerful soul as this is rare. Bob was not willing to waste a moment the lyrics from "Heathen" give pertinent instructions and inspiration in this regard:
