National Register of Historic Places – The National Register of Historic Places is the United States federal governments official list of districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects deemed worthy of preservation. The passage of the National Historic Preservation Act in established the National Register, of the more than one million properties on the National Register,⁸⁰ are listed individually. The remainder are contributing resources within historic districts, each year approximately 30, properties are added to the National Register as part of districts or by individual listings. For most of its history the National Register has been administered by the National Park Service and its goals are to help property owners and interest groups, such as the National Trust for Historic Preservation, coordinate, identify, and protect historic sites in the United States. While National Register listings are mostly symbolic, their recognition of significance provides some financial incentive to owners of listed properties, protection of the property is not guaranteed. During the nomination process, the property is evaluated in terms of the four criteria for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places, the application of those criteria has been the subject of criticism by academics of history and preservation, as well as the public and politicians. Occasionally, historic sites outside the proper, but associated with the United States are also listed. Properties can be nominated in a variety of forms, including individual properties, historic districts, the Register categorizes general listings into one of five types of properties, district, site, structure, building, or object. National Register Historic Districts are defined geographical areas consisting of contributing and non-contributing properties, some properties are added automatically to the National Register when they become administered by the National Park Service. Initially, the National Register consisted of the National Historic Landmarks designated before the Registers creation, approval of the act, which was amended in and , represented the first time the United States had a broad-based historic preservation policy. The New Spain religious buildings the founding Franciscan saw and emulated were of the Spanish Colonial style, also, the limited availability and variety of building materials besides adobe near mission sites or imported to Alta California limited design options. Finally, the missionaries and their indigenous Californian workforce had minimal construction skills, exterior walls were coated with white plaster, which with wide side eaves shielded the adobe brick walls from rain. Revival These architectural elements were replicated, in varying degrees, accuracy, the Spanish Mission Style and its associated Spanish Colonial Revival Style became internationally influential. Examples can be found throughout Australia and New Zealand where the California Bungalow style was also prevalent, in Central and South America its influence is less discernible as the Spanish Colonial Style had, in effect not been departed from, so it is arguable that there wasnt a revival. The Mission Inn in Southern California is one of the largest extant Mission Revival Style buildings in the United States, located in Riverside, it has been restored, with tours of the styles expression. Spanish Colonial Revival architecture – The Panama-California Exposition of in San Diego, highlighting the work of architect Bertram Goodhue, is credited with giving the style national exposure. Embraced

principally in California and Florida, the Spanish Colonial Revival movement enjoyed its greatest popularity between and , the antecedents of the Spanish Colonial Revival Style can be traced to the Mediterranean Revival architectural style. The possibilities of the Spanish Colonial Revival Style were brought to the attention of architects attending late 19th and they also integrated porticoes, pediments and colonnades influenced by Beaux Arts classicism as well. By the early years of the s, architects in Florida had begun to work in a Spanish Colonial Revival style, Frederick H. Trimbles Farmers Bank in Vero Beach, completed in , is a fully mature early example of the style. The city of St. Cloud, Florida, espoused the style both for homes and commercial structures and has a collection of subtle stucco buildings reminiscent of colonial Mexico. Many of these were designed by architectural partners Ida Annah Ryan, the major location of design and construction in the Spanish Colonial Revival style was California, especially in the coastal cities. In the early s, architect Lilian Jeannette Rice designed the style in the development of the town of Rancho Santa Fe in San Diego County, the city of Santa Barbara adopted the style to give it a unified Spanish character after widespread destruction in the Santa Barbara earthquake. In the s, numerous houses in Spanish Revival style were built in Shanghai, although Shanghai was not culturally linked to the Spanish-speaking world, these buildings were probably inspired by Hollywood movies, which were highly influential in the city at the time 4. Tucson had hoped to receive the appropriation for the mental hospital. Tucson was largely disappointed with receiving what was viewed as an inferior prize. Construction of Old Main, the first building on campus, began on October 27,, and classes met for the first time in with 32 students in Old Main, which is still in use today. Because there were no schools in Arizona Territory, the university maintained separate preparatory classes for the first 23 years of operation. The University of Arizona offers fields of study leading to bachelors, masters, doctoral, academic departments and programs are organized into colleges and schools. Currently, grades are given on a strict 4-point scale with A worth 4, B worth 3, C worth 2, D worth 1 and E worth zero points. In , there were discussions with students and faculty that may lead the UA towards eventual usage of the grading system in future years. As of December , the university uses the 4-points scale. Giffords staffers, one additional person was injured in the immediate aftermath of the shooting. News reports identified the target of the attack as Giffords, a Democrat representing Arizonas 8th congressional district and she was shot through the head at point-blank range, and her medical condition was initially described as critical. Loughner, a year-old Tucson man who was fixated on Giffords, was arrested at the scene, Federal prosecutors filed five charges against him, including the attempted assassination of a member of Congress and the assassination of a federal judge. Loughner previously had been arrested once on a drug charge and had been suspended by his college for disruptive behavior. Court filings

include notes handwritten by Loughner indicating he planned to assassinate Giffords, the motive for the shooting remains unclear, Loughner did not cooperate with authorities, invoking his right to remain silent. He was held without bail and indicted on 49 counts, in January, Loughner was found by a federal judge to be incompetent to stand trial based on two medical evaluations, which diagnosed him with paranoid schizophrenia. Judged still incompetent to stand trial on May 25, finally on August 7 and he pleaded guilty to 19 counts, and in November was sentenced to life in prison. Following the shooting, American and international politicians expressed grief and condemnations, gun control advocates pushed for increased restrictions on the sale of firearms and ammunition, specifically high-capacity ammunition magazines. Palin rejected claims that she bore responsibility for the shooting, President Barack Obama led a nationally televised memorial service on January 12, and other memorials took place. The shooting took place on January 8, at 10:10 a. The shooting was caught on video by a security camera but has not yet been released to the public. A nearby store employee said he heard 15 to 20 gunshots, Loughner stopped to reload, but dropped the loaded magazine from his pocket to the sidewalk, from where bystander Patricia Maisch grabbed it. Another bystander clubbed the back of the head with a folding chair, injuring his elbow in the process. Loughner was tackled to the ground by Bill Badger, a year-old retired United States Army Colonel who had also shot himself. Loughner was further subdued by Maisch and bystanders Roger Sulzgeber and Joseph Zamudio, Zamudio, a concealed weapon permit holder, had a weapon on his person, but arrived after the shooting had stopped and did not draw his firearm. Thirty-one shell casings were found at the scene by investigators, the first call from the scene to emergency services was received at 10:11 a. She is the woman in Arizona's history to be elected to the U. S. House of Representatives, on January 8, just a week into her third term, Gabrielle Dee Giffords was a victim of an assassination attempt near Tucson, at a Safeway supermarket where she was meeting publicly with constituents. Giffords was later brought to a facility in Houston, Texas. On August 1, Giffords returned to the House floor to vote and was greeted with a standing ovation. On January 22, Giffords announced her resignation from her seat in order to concentrate on recovering from her wounds. Gabrielle Dee Giffords was born and grew up Tucson, Arizona, to Gloria Kay and she was raised in a mixed religious environment by her Jewish father and Christian Science-practicing mother. Her grandfather, Akiba Hornstein, was a Jewish immigrant from Lithuania who changed his name to Giffords to avoid anti-Semitism, through her father, Giffords is a second cousin of actress Gwyneth Paltrow. Giffords has identified herself solely with Judaism since, belonging to Congregation Chaverim and she was Arizona's first Jewish congresswoman. Giffords worked as an associate for regional economic development at Price Waterhouse in New York City, in, she became president and CEO of El Campo Tire Warehouses, a local chain of auto service centers founded by her grandfather. The business was sold to Goodyear Tire in, at the time of the sale, she commented on the difficulties local businesses face when competing against large national firms. Giffords was elected to the Arizona House of Representatives and served from to and she was elected to the Arizona Senate in the fall of, and at the time was the youngest woman elected to that body. She took office in January and was re-elected in and she resigned from the Arizona Senate on December 1, in preparation for her congressional campaign. Sarn, repayments due under *Ladewig v. It wasn't until later that summer when the new President, Franklin D. Roosevelt, President Roosevelt agreed and issued two Executive orders to make it happen. In, Conrad Wirth became director of the National Park Service, the

demand for parks after the end of the World War II had left the parks overburdened with demands that could not be met. In , with the support of President Dwight D. Eisenhower, he began Mission 66, New parks were added to preserve unique resources and existing park facilities were upgraded and expanded. In , as the Park Service turned 50 years old, emphasis began to turn from just saving great and wonderful scenery, Director George Hartzog began the process with the creation of the National Lakeshores and then National Recreation Areas.

Early history[edit] The early history of Arivaca is obscure. In a Mexican land grant of 8, acres Bernard as the first Postmaster; [9] still in operation at ZIP code In he built the historic Arivaca Schoolhouse , which was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in , as the oldest standing school building in Arizona. Arivaca was a camp for at least three United States Cavalry units during the Mexican Revolution: Arivaca mining district[edit] The historic Arivaca mining district consists of over old mines in the Las Guijas Mountains northwest, the San Luis Mountains to the southwest and Cobre Ridge to the southeast of the town. Gold , silver , lead , copper and tungsten production has been recorded starting in Spanish colonial times and continuing intermittently through the s. In the Arivaca Ranch sold 11, acres to a land developer who subdivided the property into acre parcels. Four years later, the dirt Arivaca Road was paved. In the s and s many new residents moved into the area, and a medical clinic, fire department, arts council, human resource office, community center and branch of Pima County Public Library were opened. In the Arivaca Schoolhouse, the oldest standing schoolhouse in the state, was added to the National Register of Historic Places. A former nursing home was turned into the Arivaca Action Center with a focus on education, the arts, wellness, hospitality and sustainability. The AAC offers space for meetings, overnight guests, gardening, and physical therapy[citation needed].
