Calvinism Puritanism broadly refers to a diverse religious reform movement in Britain committed to the continental Reformed tradition. They believed that all of their beliefs should be based on the Bible, which they considered to be divinely inspired. As sinners, every person deserved damnation. Therefore, being a Christian could never be reduced to simple "intellectual acknowledgment" of the truth of Christianity. Over time, however, Puritan theologians developed a framework for authentic religious experience based on their own experiences as well as those of their parishioners. It began with a preparatory phase designed to produce contrition for sin through introspection, Bible study and listening to preaching. This was followed by humiliation, when the sinner realized that he or she was helpless to break free from sin and that their good works could never earn forgiveness. For some Puritans, this was a dramatic experience and they referred to it as being born again. Historian Perry Miller wrote that the Puritans "liberated men from the treadmill of indulgences and penances, but cast them on the iron couch of introspection". Puritan clergy wrote many spiritual guides to help their parishioners pursue personal piety and sanctification. Many Puritans relied on both personal religious experience and self-examination to assess their spiritual condition. They rejected confirmation as unnecessary. Most Puritans practiced infant baptism, but a minority held credobaptist beliefs. In "A Discourse on the Nature of Regeneration", Stephen Charnock distinguished regeneration from "external baptism" writing that baptism "confers not grace" but rather is a means of conveying the grace of regeneration only "when the [Holy] Spirit is pleased to operate with it". Therefore, one cannot assume that baptism produces regeneration. The Westminster Confession states that the grace of baptism is only effective for those who are among the elect; however, its effects are not tied to the moment of baptism but lies dormant until one experiences conversion later in life. In agreement with Thomas Cranmer, the Puritans stressed "that Christ comes down to us in the sacrament by His Word and Spirit, offering Himself as our spiritual food and drink". The episcopalians known as the prelatial party were conservatives who supported retaining bishops if those leaders supported reform and agreed to share power with local churches. In addition, these Puritans called for a renewal of preaching, pastoral care and Christian discipline within the Church of England. The Westminster Assembly proposed the creation of a presbyterian system, but the Long Parliament left implementation to local authorities. As a result, the Church of England never developed a complete presbyterian hierarchy. Furthermore, the sacraments would only be administered to those in the church covenant. The New England Congregationalists were also adamant that they were not separating from the Church of England. However, some Puritans equated the Church of England with the Roman Catholic Church, and therefore considered it no Christian church at all. These groups, such as the Brownists, would split from the established church and become known as Separatists. Puritan husbands commanded authority through family direction and prayer. The female relationship to her husband and to God was marked by submissiveness and humility. I had eight birds hatched in one nest; Four cocks there were, and hens the rest. While Puritans praised the obedience of young children, they also believed that, by separating children from their mothers at adolescence, children could better sustain a superior relationship with God. The pinnacle of achievement for children in Puritan society, however, occurred with the conversion process. Just as parents were expected to uphold Puritan religious values in the home, masters assumed the parental responsibility of housing and educating young servants. Older servants also dwelt with masters and were cared for in the event of illness or injury. African-American and Indian servants were likely excluded from such benefits. Christian demonology Like most Christians in the early modern period, Puritans believed in the active existence of the devil and demons as evil forces that could

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possess and cause harm to men and women. There was also widespread belief in witchcraft and witchesâ€”persons in league with the devil. However, Harsnett was in the minority, and many clergy, not only Puritans, believed in witchcraft and possession. In England and America, Puritans engaged in witch hunts as well. In the s, Matthew Hopkins , the self-proclaimed "Witchfinder General", was responsible for accusing over two hundred people of witchcraft, mainly in East Anglia. In New England, few people were accused and convicted of witchcraft before ; there were at most sixteen convictions. Though this witch hunt occurred after Puritans lost political control of the Massachusetts colony.

Family background[edit] Asquith left with his sister Emily and elder brother William, c. The couple also had three daughters, of whom only one survived infancy. Dixon Asquith inherited the Gillroyd Mill Company, founded by his father. Both families were middle-class, Congregationalist , and politically radical. His biographer Stephen Koss entitled the first chapter of his biography "From Herbert to Henry", referring to upward social mobility and his abandonment of his Yorkshire Nonconformist roots with his second marriage. However, in public, he was invariably referred to only as H. The boys went to live with him in London; when he moved back to Yorkshire in for business reasons, they remained in London and were lodged with various families. The biographer Naomi Levine writes that in effect Asquith was "treated like an orphan" for the rest of his childhood. Abbott , a distinguished classical scholar, Asquith became an outstanding pupil. He visited the public gallery of the House of Commons , studied the techniques of famous preachers, and honed his own skills in the school debating society. He sought to raise the standards of the college to the extent that its undergraduates shared what Asquith later called a "tranquil consciousness of effortless superiority". An easy grasp of his studies left him ample time to indulge his liking for debate. In the first month at university he spoke at the Oxford Union. His official biographers, J. Spender and Cyril Asquith , commented that in his first months at Oxford "he voiced the orthodox Liberal view, speaking in support, inter alia, of the disestablishment of the Church of England, and of non-intervention in the Franco-Prussian War ". However, he won the Craven Scholarship and graduated with what his biographers describe as an "easy" double first in Mods and Greats. He was personally extravagant, always enjoying the good life—good food, good companions, good conversation and attractive women. Naomi Levine, in a biography [26] After his graduation in , Asquith spent several months coaching Viscount Lymington , the year-old son and heir of the Earl of Portsmouth. He found the experience of aristocratic country-house life agreeable. He was proud of ridding himself of "the Puritanism in which I was bred". But he had no wish to pursue a career as a don ; the traditional route for politically ambitious but unmoneyed young men was through the law. With no personal contacts with solicitors, he received few briefs. His bride, Helen Kelsall Melland c. Among the topics that caused debate among Liberals were British imperialism, the union of Great Britain and Ireland, and female suffrage. Asquith was a strong, though not jingoistic, proponent of the Empire, and, after initial caution, came to support home rule for Ireland. He opposed votes for women for most of his political career. Asquith believed that votes for women would disproportionately benefit the Conservatives. Wright invited him to join his chambers at the Inner Temple. In and he defended the radical Liberal MP, Cunninghame Graham , who was charged with assaulting police officers when they attempted to break up a demonstration in Trafalgar Square. When the manager of The Times, J. Macdonald, was called to give

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evidence Russell, feeling tired, surprised Asquith by asking him to conduct the cross-examination. He played an effective low-key role in the sensational Tranby Croft libel trial , helping to show that the plaintiff had not been libelled. He was on the losing side in *Carlill v Carbolic Smoke Ball Co* , a landmark English contract law case that established that a company was obliged to meet its advertised pledges. He sold the Hampstead property and took a flat in Mount Street , Mayfair , where he lived during the working week. Asquith, who was then only 39 and had never served as a junior minister, accepted the post of Home Secretary , a senior Cabinet position. Asquith failed to secure a majority for a bill to disestablish the Church of Wales , and another to protect workers injured at work, but he built up a reputation as a capable and fair minister. Asquith sent Metropolitan policeman. After two civilians were killed in Featherstone when soldiers opened fire on a crowd, Asquith was subject to protests at public meetings for a period. Asquith thought Rosebery preferable to the other possible candidate, the Chancellor of the Exchequer , Sir William Harcourt , whom he deemed too anti-imperialistâ€”one of the so-called " Little Englanders "â€”and too abrasive. Asquith became a son in law of Sir Charles Tennant, 1st Baronet. Margot got on, if sometimes stormily, with her step-children and she and Asquith had five children of their own, only two of whom survived infancy.: With no government post, Asquith divided his time between politics and a return to his law practice. Rosebery resigned in October and Harcourt followed him in December Asquith was less inclined than his leader and many in the party to censure the Conservative government for its conduct, though he regarded the war as an unnecessary distraction. Asquith and his close political allies Haldane and Sir Edward Grey tried to pressure him into taking a peerage to become a figurehead Prime Minister in the House of Lords, giving the pro-empire wing of the party greater dominance in the House of Commons. Campbell-Bannerman called their bluff and refused to move. He held the post for over two years, and introduced three budgets. The only income for which Chamberlain had over-budgeted was the duty from sales of alcohol. Asquith also introduced a distinction between earned and unearned income, taxing the latter at a higher rate. He used the increased revenues to fund old-age pensions, the first time a British government had provided them. Reductions in selective taxes, such as that on sugar, were aimed at benefiting the poor. After a series of heart attacks he resigned on 3 April , less than three weeks before he died. Winston Churchill succeeded Lloyd George as President of the Board of Trade , entering the Cabinet despite his youth aged 33 and the fact that he had crossed the floor to become a Liberal only four years previously. Reading [86] the classics, poetry and a vast range of English literature consumed much of his time. So did correspondence; intensely disliking the telephone, Asquith was a prolific letter writer. He was addicted to Contract bridge , [92] Above all else, Asquith thrived on company and conversation. A clubbable man, he enjoyed "the companionship of clever and attractive women" even more. According to Japanese historian Yoshiaki Yoshimi , however, the comfort stations did not solve, but aggravated the first two problems. Yoshimi has asserted, "The Japanese Imperial Army feared most that the simmering discontentment of the soldiers could explode into a riot and revolt. That is why it provided women". Earlier comfort women were Japanese prostitutes who volunteered for such service. However, as Japan continued military expansion, the military found itself short of Japanese volunteers, and turned to the local population to coerce women into serving in these stations, or abducted them. In urban areas, conventional advertising through middlemen was used alongside kidnapping. Middlemen advertised in newspapers circulating in Japan and the Japanese colonies of Korea , Taiwan, Manchukuo , and China. These sources soon dried up, especially from Japan. An existing system of licensed prostitution within Korea made it easy for Japan to recruit females in large numbers. This might have provided them with some insight into the nature of Japanese, as opposed to British, colonial rule, as well what might be in store for their sisters and daughters. The military often directly demanded that local leaders procure women for the brothels along the front lines, especially in the countryside where middlemen were rare. When the locals were considered hostile in China, Japanese soldiers carried out the "Three Alls Policy" "kill all-burn all-loot all" which included indiscriminately kidnapping and raping local civilians. These documents were initially made public at the war crimes trial. In one of these, a lieutenant is quoted as confessing to having organized a brothel and having used it himself. Another source refers to Tokkeitai members having arrested women on the streets and putting them in brothels after enforced medical examinations. According to China, the documents provide ironclad proof that the Japanese military forced Asian women to work in front-line brothels before and during World War II. New documents discovered in China shed light on facilities inside comfort stations operated within a Japanese army compound, and the conditions of the Korean comfort women. Documents were discovered verifying the Japanese Army as the funding agency for purchasing some comfort women. Documents were found in Shanghai that showed details of how the Japanese Army went about opening comfort stations for Japanese troops in occupied Shanghai. Documents included the Tianjin Municipal Archives from the archival files of the Japanese government and the Japanese police during the periods of the occupation in World War II. Municipal archives from Shanghai and Nanjing were also examined. One conclusion reached was that the relevant archives in Korea are distorted. A conclusion of the study was that the Japanese Imperial government, and the colonial government in Korea, tried to avoid recording the illegal mobilization of comfort women. It was concluded that they burned most of the records immediately before the surrender; but, the study confirmed that some documents and records survived. The BBC quotes ", to ,", and the International Commission of Jurists quotes "estimates of historians of , to , women. According to Hata, the total number of government-regulated prostitutes in Japan was only , during World War II. Cumings stated that between , and , Korean girls and women were recruited. The women forced into prostitution may therefore be much higher than the Dutch record have previously indicated. The number of Dutch women that were sexually assaulted or molested were also largely ignored. Most were adolescent girls aged 14â€”19 who had completed some education and were deceived through promises of higher education in Tokyo or Singapore. Interviews conducted with former comfort women also suggest that some women came from the island of Flores. After the war, many Javanese comfort women who survived stayed in the locations where they had been trafficked to and became integrated into local populations. This was done in , when a former comfort woman forced to work for Showa soldiers in Taiwan, published her memoirs under the pseudonym of Suzuko Shirota. I was told if I were drafted, I could earn lots of money in a textile factory The first day I was raped and the rapes never stopped I was born a woman but never lived as a woman I feel sick when I come close to a man. Not

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just Japanese men, but all men-even my own husband who saved me from the brothel. I shiver whenever I see a Japanese flag Why should I feel ashamed? For example, Dutch women captured in the Dutch East Indies modern Indonesia were reserved exclusively for the officers. They were systematically beaten and raped day and night. House of Representatives committee: Many stories have been told about the horrors, brutalities, suffering and starvation of Dutch women in Japanese prison camps. But one story was never told, the most shameful story of the worst human rights abuse committed by the Japanese during World War II: Even the Japanese doctor raped me each time he visited the brothel to examine us for venereal disease. Over the following four months the girls were raped and beaten day and night, with those who became pregnant forced to have abortions. After four harrowing months, the girls were moved to a camp at Bogor, in West Java, where they were reunited with their families. This camp was exclusively for women who had been put into military brothels, and the Japanese warned the inmates that if anyone told what had happened to them, they and their family members would be killed. The court testimonies state that these prepubescent girls were repeatedly raped by Japanese soldiers [79] while those who refused to comply were executed. Thomas writes that the women working at the brothels "most likely served 25 to 35 men a day" and that they were "victims of the yellow slave trade". Igusa wrote in his memoirs that the women continued to work through infection and severe discomfort, though they "cried and begged for help". In Burma, there were cases of Korean "comfort women" committing suicide by swallowing cyanide pills or being killed by having a hand grenade tossed into their dug-outs. British soldiers fighting in Burma often reported that the Korean "comfort women" whom they captured were astonished to learn that the British were not going to eat them. According to the report, Korean girls were deceived into being used as comfort women by the Japanese; in , there were about girls trafficked from Korea to Burma in this manner of obtaining comfort women. His book has been widely criticized as distorting the facts by both Japanese and South Korean historians. However, it was a plagiarism of a Japanese book by the zainichi author Kim Il-Myeon. Hiding the facts and mixing them with your own assertions is something that newspapers do all the time too". Takashi Uemura , a journalist who wrote one of the retracted articles, was subject to similar attacks from conservatives, and his employer, Hokusei Gakuen University , was pressured to terminate his position. Japan intended to directly compensate individuals, but the Korean government insisted on receiving the sum itself and "spent most of the money on economic development, focusing on infrastructure and the promotion of heavy industry". Eventually, 61 former Korean comfort women accepted 5 million yen approx. We should never forget our feelings of remorse over this. As Prime Minister of Japan, I would like to declare anew my remorse at these deeds and tender my apology to the people of the Republic of Korea. On March 27 the Japanese parliament issued an official apology. The Korean government will administer the fund for the forty-six remaining elderly comfort women and will consider the matter "finally and irreversibly resolved". The South Korean government did not attempt to collect the viewpoints on the issues from the women most directly affected by it -- the survivors themselves.
