

Chapter 1 : Room Rates at Disney's Contemporary Resort | Walt Disney World Resort

Photo Credit The location of the hotel may be excellent, but what you really need to know is what are the rooms actually like? For anyone who likes contemporary design then they will most definitely enjoy the Contemporary Resort. For some this is a positive, but if you are looking for complete immersion in the Disney theme, the Contemporary Resort may not be for you. The standard rooms are a generous size at square feet. Each room will sleep up to 5 guests and also accommodate a child under 3 in a crib. Each room has a wall mounted flat screen television and a computer with internet access and Contemporary Concierge which is free to use. There is wireless internet available for your own laptop for which there is a charge. The one thing which guests may find lacking in the rooms is that feel that you are in Disney World. If you want upfront non stop Disney this probably is not the hotel for you. No Mickey Mouse comforters here! But of course that total Disney experience is just on your doorstep even if it is not really inside your room. The Disney Contemporary Resort has two distinct sections. The main Tower building with the monorail running through it, the main lobby and the restaurants. The second, separate building is The Garden Wing. The Tower rooms all have a small balcony which has 2 chairs and a table. The Garden View rooms have a view of the parking lot, the water or the garden. You can choose a ground floor Garden View room as these do have a patio. You may decide that the you would rather get the great location of The Contemporary Resort and save money by staying in a Garden room if the only sacrifice is the view and the lack of balcony. For others the view is the key and is worth paying the extra. Which are the best rooms in The Tower? Ask for a Magic Kingdom view room on the 9th floor or higher. These of course command a higher rate but if you want the best view then you may be prepared to pay the extra. The only downside to some of the lower floor Tower rooms is that they can be a little noisy as they are located directly above the Grand Canyon Concourse with the restaurants, shops and monorail. In the Contemporary Resort Tower on the Bay Lake side all of the rooms have good views but of course the higher up you go the better the view gets. Of course it really depends upon what you are looking for. What extra does it give you? The Concierge rooms are located on the 12th and 14th floor of the Tower building. Standard rooms on the 12th floor are the same as any other standard rooms in the resort you are not getting anything different there. Suites and standard rooms are on the 14th floor. You will have a view either of the Magic Kingdom or Bay Lake depending on which side of the Tower you are located. Both lounges have a great view of the Magic Kingdom and of course you can use the Disney concierge service to help you plan your stay. Depending upon how much you use this it can save you a significant amount of money. Breakfast offerings include tea, coffee, juice, pastries, hot and cold cereal, croissants and fruit. Afternoon snacks include cookies, Goldfish crackers, brownies, pretzels, rice crispy treats and beverages. In the evening there is wine and cheese, beer, hot appetizers, crudities with dips. Then there is the wonderful dessert buffet where the selection changes every day. Disney Concierge includes nightly turn down service too. This is a nice perk, but in my experience not really that much of a benefit. A chocolate on a pillow is nice, but do you really want to pay extra for it? Is concierge level worth the extra money at the Contemporary Resort? Guests opinions do differ quite a lot about this. I have stayed in many Disney resorts both in standard and concierge levels and I always check the price difference between the two very carefully. Sometimes the difference in rate can just be made up by eating some of the family meals in the lounge. Breakfast is a quick and easy option. However, when you are using the Disney Dining Plan, as increasingly most guests are, this is only a minimal saving as you have already paid for meals. The view from the concierge lounges of the Magic Kingdom fireworks is one of the best in the whole of Walt Disney World. Some will say it is worth the upgrade just for that. Really it just depends on how much of a price you personally put on experience "€" and just how deep your pockets are! Disney Contemporary Resort Dining Options If you want one of the finest restaurants with perhaps the best view of Magic Kingdom in the whole of Disney World then head to the California Grill on the 15th floor

of the Contemporary Resort. This is consistently one of the most highly regarded restaurants in Disney World and the view of the fireworks is spectacular. It used to be that anyone could sneak a look from the 15th floor but Disney has long since got wise to that one. Now a private access elevator is closed to all except those with a California Grill reservation. This is one of my favorite character dining locations as not only is the food of good quality for a buffet, but the easy access to Magic Kingdom on the monorail makes it a great place to start or end the day after a visit to the park. If you want to share your meal experience with Mickey Mouse, Minnie, Goofy, Pluto and Donald then this is the place for you! For a quick bite there is the Contempo Cafe where you can order breakfast, lunch and dinner from touch screen menus. There are two swimming pools but there is almost a complete lack of theme and really there is nothing particularly remarkable about them. Hopefully one day Disney will address this and update them. You can rent water craft from the marina and even try out water skiing.

History[edit] The Contemporary Resort is one of two resorts located on property when Walt Disney World opened in 1971. To construct the building, steel frames were erected on-site and modular pre-constructed rooms, designed by California architect Donald Wexler , were lifted into place by crane. In preparation for the future sale, Disney incorporated a condominium association for the property on January 9, 1971, that would manage the units. As part of the major construction at the Contemporary Resort, the north wing of the hotel was demolished to make way for a separate Disney Vacation Club resort at the Contemporary complex that opened in 1991. At the same time, the Bay Lake Tower began construction. The Bay Lake Tower opened in 1992. The main hall, named the Grand Canyon Concourse, is located in the main tower and houses restaurants and shops. The Walt Disney World Monorail System runs through the inside of this building and a monorail station is located here for resort guests. Adorning the concourse walls is a multi-story mosaic designed by Mary Blair. One three-story wing flanks the south side of the tower and houses an additional rooms. Bay Lake Tower[edit] Main article: It is located on the former location of the demolished North Garden Wing rooms. The tower shares design features with the original resort. The front desk, concierge, valet, bell services and transportation are shared services provided through the main resort. Bay Lake Tower has a concierge desk and an online check-in desk of their own for guests who wish to check into Bay Lake Tower directly. You enter the bath through a sliding pocket door instead of a traditional hinged model. The pocket door provides plenty of room and makes it easy to move around inside. A curved shower-curtain rod provides extra room. Combined with the pocket door, the curtain rod makes the bathroom feel much bigger than it is. Bathroom sinks have an avant-garde flat-bottom design. There are also two shelves under the sink that provide a small amount of storage. The dressing area includes a sliding door that separates it from the sleeping area. Contemporary Concierge Level Rooms

The concierge level of a deluxe resort can also be referred to as club level. Each one throughout the property has a name for their concierge level. Here guests willing to pay a premium are treated to special services including a lounge, complimentary food and drink, and personalized service. There are about 60 Atrium Club rooms most of which are similar to regular rooms throughout the resort, but there are also suites available. Once guests are brought to the club level they will be introduced to the cast members on hand at two desks set up to be the resource for any special services they may need. These CMs are there to help folks with whatever they might need including ADRs, park tickets, and transportation options. Another special service provided to concierge level guests is a nightly turn down. Housekeeping cast members come to your room in the evening to prepare your bed for you to fall into it after a long day in the parks and leave chocolates. A more exciting benefit to staying in the Atrium Club is access to free food for most of the day. Later in the day snacks are available along with an assortment of drinks including soda, hot drinks like coffee, and beer. Wine and liqueurs along with desserts area served throughout the evening as well. The selection of food and drink is laid out in the lounge only accessible to club level guests. There are several tables and chairs set up for folks to you use throughout the day. The area is busy a breakfast time, but can be a quiet place to relax and maybe even get some work done if guests happen to be business travelers. There are also a few couches in the mix where friends can gather to chat. Kids have their own area here with child sized table and chairs and a TV running cartoons and other Disney favorites. Some feature roll-in showers, while others include assistive hearing devices. Some accessible rooms have the standard setup of 2 queen beds; all rooms with roll-in showers have 1 king bed, and a small number of roll-in shower rooms have both 1 king bed. Bay Lake Views and Theme Park Views

Disney knows that some hotel rooms are better than others. Most people want something pretty to look at from their hotel room window. Luckily both sides of the main Contemporary tower offer great views. The view from your window for the most part includes spectacular views of Magic Kingdom. Most rooms have a great view of the lake. Some rooms face the Bay Lake Tower section of the resort. Most rooms have view of landscaping. Rooms facing West look on to Bay Lake. Some rooms face a parking lot.

Contemporary Pools

Contemporary has two pools. There is also a hot tub, kiddie pool and water player area. The other smaller pool, the Bay Pool is located near the Feature. This pool is considered a "quiet pool," meaning that loud play and splashing around are discouraged. Pool are open every day, including during winter. Contemporary also has a hot tub located near Silver Creek Springs Pool. Feature Pool has one water slide that all ages are free to use. Guests can find showers, storage lockers, restrooms, and laundry facilities. Water wings are allowed at all Disney pools, and every pool has free life vests in a variety of sizes: Weight less than 30 lbs. Weight more than 90 lbs. Chest size in. Additionally, there may be a small supply of even larger vests. Inquire at your resort. Our advice is to send someone down to the pool to check the towel situation before you go. If you end up using your room towels at the pool, just call Housekeeping when you

get back and request more. Some of us will occasionally bring something like a whiffle ball for playing catch in the pool. Also note that kids with pool toys become very popular with other kids in the pool who want to play too. Check with any lifeguard for assistance on using the lift. Restaurants and Dining Dining options abound. On the first floor is The Wave. What does health-conscious mean in Disney-speak? You can still get bacon for breakfast, but the coffee it comes with is certified organic and bird-friendly. On the 15th floor, the award-winning California Grill serves contemporary American cuisine. But expect a boisterous crowd-the noise level makes quiet conversation difficult. Still, the view from the 15th floor is stellar, one of the best spots for watching the Magic Kingdom fireworks. A show kitchen is the centerpiece of the airy dining room. We like the seats at the bar in front of the kitchen, or a coveted window seat. Chef Brian Piasecki takes advantage of seasonal produce, fish, and meats. Oven-fired flatbreads are always on the menu, as well as grilled pork tenderloin with creamy polenta and Zinfandel glaze, a favorite since day one. Goofy, Minnie, Donald, and Pluto are on hand, too. The buffet circles the center of the room. We rarely see anyone here without kids in tow. Selections at both breakfast and dinner are freshly prepared and served in casseroles and platters on special heated countertops - a small step up from chafing dishes. The kitchen continues to create healthful dining options and source local products, setting a good example for other Disney restaurants. Organic beers, organic coffees, hip cocktails, and all-screw-cap wines focusing on New World wines from Argentina, Australia, Chile, New Zealand and South Africa are part of the forward-thinking menu. The Wave serves unusual drinks like the Antioxidant Cocktail and the strawberry-lychee margarita; For breakfast, a new buffet, Supercharged Tropical Smoothie, multigrain pancakes, make-your-own muesli; for lunch, avocado-and-citrus salad, Italian chef salad, Reuben; For dinner, sustainable fish, braised lamb shank. It has faster service and is less expensive than The Wave, but still has its quirks. If you want to modify your order in any way - say, hold the onions on the flatbread - you have to walk to the pick-up window and instruct the staff. The food is fresh and tasty, but the ordering process is a bit convoluted. Noise from the nearby Chef Mickey's can drown out all but the most enthusiastic conversationalist. Besides pizza, chicken wings, desserts, beer, wine, and sodas are also available. However, delivery can take up to 90 minutes, and the food quality is often below average. Pizza delivery hours are 4 PM to midnight daily. Outer Rim Lounge is located amid the busy dining and shopping on the 4th Floor of the main tower at the Contemporary. Outer Rim Lounge has indoor seating and a full drink menu, with several beers, wines, and a selection of spirits. The lounge is usually open 4 PM to 12 AM daily. It also has a selection of beers, wines, and cocktails. Plus a small menu of burgers, hot dogs, sandwiches, salads, and desserts is available. At those prices, it may be less expensive to rent a car and park it at the hotel. Each theme park has its own bus stop somewhere along the wall. Monorail service may be suspended at any time. Monorail service is not available during Extra Magic Hours. There guests travel to Epcot via the Epcot Monorail. Bus schedules to the water parks and Disney Springs are a little less frequent, and you could wait anywhere from 20 to 30 minutes for a ride. Buses run a little slower from around 11 AM to around 4 PM, when most people are already in a park. Your waits to return to your hotel from a theme park should average out to around 30 minutes under most circumstances. If your destination is one of the other Magic Kingdom monorail resorts, and the Magic Kingdom is still open hop on the monorail to the Polynesian and Grand Floridian , or take a boat to Fort Wilderness, the Polynesian, and the Grand Floridian. We suggest you still allow at least an hour for that.
