

## Chapter 1 : Enable and Manage Passwords & Form-fill in Edge browser

*Acrobat (pdf) Fillable Online Forms I have Windows 10 and started using Microsoft Edge instead of Internet Explorer. Have just found that Microsoft Edge doesn't recognize Acrobat (pdf) fillable forms.*

Sign in with your Office school credentials, Office work credentials, or Microsoft account Hotmail, Live, or Outlook. Under My Forms, click New Form to begin creating your form. Enter a name for your form. You can also enter an optional subtitle. Form names can contain up to 90 characters and a subtitle can contain up to 1, characters. Click Add Question to add a new question to the form. Choose from Choice, Text, Rating, or Date questions. Your form is saved automatically while you create it. For choice questions, enter the text you want to display for the question and each of the choices. Want to add more choices? Click Add Option to add more choices than the default two choices. To remove a choice, click the trash can button next to it. You can also choose to make a question required or allow multiple choices for a question by changing the settings at the bottom of the question. To have Microsoft Forms randomly shuffle the order of the options displayed to users of the form, click More settings for question , and then select Shuffle options. Click More settings for question , and then select Subtitle to add a subtitle for a question. Some choice questions will trigger auto suggestions. Click on the suggested options to add as choices. In the following example, Monday, Wednesday, and Friday are selected. Click Add Question to add more questions to your form. To change the order of the questions, click the Up or Down arrows on the right side of each question. For text questions, select the Long Answer option if you want a larger text box displayed on the form. To copy a question, select it and then click the Copy Question button in the upper right corner. Text questions also allow you to set restrictions when you need to have numbers as the answer. Click More settings for question , and then select Restrictions. You can choose to restrict the numbers by selecting from the various options such as Greater than, Less than, Between, and many others. Click Preview at the top of the design window to see how your form will look on a computer. If you want to test your form, enter answers for the questions in preview mode and then click Submit. Click Mobile to see how your form will look on a mobile device. Click Back when you are finished previewing your form. Sign in to Office with your school or work credentials. Click New, and then select Forms for Excel to begin creating your form. Forms for Excel is only available for OneDrive for Business and new team sites connected with Office groups. Learn more about Office groups. Enter a name for your form, and then click Create. Open the Excel workbook in which you want to insert a form. Also note that Forms for Excel is only available for OneDrive for Business and new team sites connected with Office groups. A new tab, Microsoft Forms, will open. A default title for your form will be provided. To change it, click on the title and type a new name. Open the OneNote notebook in which you want to insert a form. On the Insert tab, select Forms. To access Forms in OneNote Online, please sign in with your work or school account. When you see the message, "Forms for OneNote wants to display a new window," click Allow. Under My Forms, click New Form to begin creating a form. A new window will open with a blank form and default title "Untitled form". Click on the default title to add your own. You can also add a description for your form. Your newly created form will appear at the top of your My forms list under the New Form and New Quiz buttons. Got feedback on Microsoft Forms? ## Chapter 2 : About PDF forms and determining their capabilities

*Opening a fillable form in Windows 10's Microsoft Edge results in the inability to enter content and save the document. This is because Microsoft Edge does not allow for Active X.*

PDF forms can be accessed over the Internet or via email. If a PDF form includes form fields for example, text fields, buttons, list boxes, you can fill the form onscreen with an Acrobat product. With a rights-enabled form, Adobe Reader users can comment on, fill, save, distribute, submit, and add digital signatures to the form. Adobe Reader capabilities Adobe Reader provides the following forms capabilities: Save forms and data locally Fill and submit forms online Distribute forms to others for review and comment Add digital signatures Acrobat Standard capabilities Acrobat Standard contains all the capabilities of Adobe Reader, in addition to the following: More advanced features in Adobe LiveCycle Designer let you use scripting objects, integrate a form with a data source, and create dynamic forms. To determine whether a form contains interactive form fields, do the following: Open the form in an Acrobat product. Select the Hand tool, and then drag it over fields in the PDF form. The form contains form fields if the Hand tool changes to either of the following icons: Interactive fields display a colored fill. If you use Acrobat 3D or Acrobat Professional, you can verify that a form contains form fields by selecting a form tool. Acrobat then highlights any form fields. On Windows XP, form fields are highlighted in blue. Print the form and fill it manually. For information about creating form fields, see the following sources: To change the security settings, do the following If you use Adobe Reader, you cannot change the security settings: Choose a compatibility option. Select Use A Password to restrict printing and editing of the document and its security settings. Choose a printing option from the Printing Allowed menu. Save, close, and reopen the document to access the form fields.
