Chapter 2 : Lovely Crochet Edging Patterns & Ideas - Hative

Welcome to our main directory of free crochet edging patterns, which also includes patterns for trims, borders, and other edges. Whether you need edgings for clothing, linens, pillowcases, baby blankets, afghans, scarves, or other projects, you'll find plenty of options to choose from.

If you already have a rotary cutter at home, you could also use a skip blade attachment specially made for crocheted edgings. Insert the hook into the fabric, and pull up a loop of the thread to the height of the edge of the blanket Fig. Then, yarn over and pull through both loops on hook Fig. Continue around your fabric until you have a stitched border to crochet into. Then scroll down to choose a crochet edging pattern. Basic Border Join yarn to blanket by inserting your hook through a stitch and pulling up a loop see Fig. Ch 3, work 1 dc in each st until you reach the corner. For rounded corners, work 2 dc in the three corner stitches. For straight corners, work 5 dc in the corner st. Continue working around blanket. Join with a Sl st in the top of the beginning ch Fasten off, weave in ends. Two-Round Design Join yarn as above. Work 1 hdc in each stitch until you reach the corner. For rounded corners, work 2 hdc in the three corner stitches. For straight corners, work 3 dc in the corner st. Ch 1, work 1 sc between each hdc around blanket, continue the same around each corner. Join with a Sl st in 1st sc. Shell Border Join yarn as above. Little Spaces Edging I have shared this simple edging pattern before but it is worth including here as well. Join yarn as above. Different edgings are best for different projects. Crocheting an edging around a corner? Crochet edgings can also be a great way to finish off knitting projects! You can just crochet right onto the cast on, cast off, and sides of a knitted piece. Much easier than grafting a knitted edging on! Remember that these edgings can be done with any weight of yarn - from embroidery thread up to chunky. As long as you use the right sized hook for your yarn, you can make anything from delicate lacy edgings out of thread to heavy, statement edgings with chunky yarn. Just measure your wrist, make an edging long enough to go around it, and put a button fastening on it! Some of the fancier edgings even make great decorative scarves. Make a few different designs in the one colour and wear them all at once for something really fashion-forward!
