Now I better get offline and back to revisions. Thanks for the nudge. I must not look at the Internet for 15 minutes! I do the same thing to avoid eating!! Just 20 more minutes and then I can raid the refrigerator. I also get up early to write 5: I am the least distracted at this time of the day. Did you say something? I never write with music on, and usually I wear earplugs. Unfortunately, there are some games on that laptop. And our son set us up with wireless access, bless his heart, so now that laptop can access the Internet. I thought I was going to give you a great and reasoned response†but I imagine others have. While my conscious mind surfs, my subconscious mulls over whatever has me blocked. And when all else failsâ€II nap! Scholastic, August I make sure to turn off my Twitter and Email client programs. Andâ€lit has no wireless. I end up writing without interruption during my writing time and then looking things up all at once later on. Upstairs is my desktop computer which I use for everything â€" writing, email, Internet, games, whathaveyou. I have a comfy chair in the living room with a small table in front of it where the laptop is stationed. My laptop computer is for writing. There I do no email, the Internet is for research only, and I write. Until my body rebels and I have to change position, again get a snack, pay bills, do something else and not write. The family that computes togetherâ€l. I bounce between the two computers. The change of scene from my office to the living room also prevents me from getting bored with the writing project that I HAVE TO get done. I tell myself that if I finish 1, new words then I get to mess around on the Internet for half an hour. Early on, I made some decisions about which sites or hotspots were most important to me to keep up onâ€"whether for personal or work-related reasonsâ€"and which ones were less relevant. The others are all stored deep in subfolders of my Favorites menu. This makes it easy to keep up with the sites that are truly important to me, giving me that sense of connectedness that I need, while stowing the others out of everyday use, for days when I have longer to spend or want to reward myself with some heavy-duty web immersion. So first thing in the morning is my time to deal with emailâ€"an added bonus, my teenagers are happy to have me distracted and not mothering them on the way out the door in the morning. Once the email is done I just turn the airport off while I work. I play no games at all, ever. I have no idea. I de-activated the chat feature as well. On my deathbed, will I be happy that I spent so much time online? Still, I do a lot of research for this and that. Curious to hear what others do! We all need help. No Internet allowed during that time. This can take approximately 30 minutes. I do not connect it to the Internet. In order to look at the Internet or get email, I have to go to a different computer. Are you planning victories, or are you pessimistic over past defeats? A psychiatrist said, "Most of my patients come to me because they are bored. Why are we weary of our lives? Because we have lost meaning in it; we are fed up. We see ourselves as victims and manipulated and shoved around. Our inner anger incubates; it seethes, it settles in our hearts as a festering sore. Our interstate highways are monotonous. Our assembly lines are monotonous. Our way of life is monotonous. Our parties are monotonous. There are few wild beasts more to be dreaded than a communicative man having nothing to communicate. A pretty girl at a party was cornered by a bore, and exasperated, she rose to leave, and he said, "Who is driving you home? And he said, "I knew a fellow who was hooked by a cow. We are sick with a disease of sameness. We read of actors who leave TV series and who leave Broadway plays, and when you ask them why, because the monotonous sameness of it all has brought to them a lack of interest in the show. This last week our Career class, our Career Sunday school class, had a dinner meeting at the Belo Mansion, where the lawyers gather, and Mary Crowley was their main speaker. And she said, beautifully and effectively, "All of us seek three things. We seek first identification, to be somebody, not a cipher. Second," she said, "we seek stimulation to escape boredom. And third," she said, "we seek security. A psychiatrist said, "Emptiness of life can become boredom. Then it becomes futility, and finally despair. Only thing about them, they are false and tragic cures. And I name some of them. And these are common among us all, and we see them every day of our living. Satan comes in our boredom; says to us, "I have thrills to suggest. The first one is in drugs. Why not lose all of my worries? Happiness is but a pill away. I read this in a newspaper; the headline caught my eye, "His Last Long Trip. It spoke about a railway employee who had found a well-dressed young man in an empty boxcar. He had committed suicide. His name was Richard Schrader. And by his side was a suicide note. And it read, "Dear Dad, dope ruined my life and took away my happiness. I thought I was experiencing life; I found out it was death. Their defence lawyer was the most famous America has ever known. His name was Clarence Darrow. And for days and days that trial made the headlines of every newspaper in America. And Clarence Darrow won his case. He saved those two rich boys from the electric chair. And the basis of his argument was this: And as a kick and as a thrill, they murdered that little boy Bobby Franks. The president who insists that he is driven by a clear and compelling moral framework, in which the forces of Good and Evil battle toward a decisive resolution, has done more than almost any American in history to make the world question on which side of that battle this country is fighting. The more convinced President Bush and his followers become of the unchallengeable righteousness of their cause, the fewer limits they recognize. I presented a powerpoint today during the adult forum to introduce Paul and preached on I Thessalonians. I am going to use powerpoint for the remaining six sermons in worship. Paul has been accused of being Who was Paul and what was he really about? My working thesis is that Paul was very much like the historical Jesus. He held the same basic values as Jesus did: Paul, like Jesus, was a product of his time and world-view, but he also transcended it and invites us to do the same as we participate in the new way of being and living. He connected Jesus with the epic of Israel in a bold and innovative way which has stood the test of time. And, yes, sadly, has also been often misunderstood and distorted and misused. Paul wisely developed the myth of the Christ as a human and divine figure who must be met in a mystical way. Paul is misunderstood by those who read him literally just as most of the Bible is misunderstood by those who take the Bible literally. The power of the Bible is that it points to the truth through amazing stories, metaphors, archetypes, sacraments, songs, poems, sagas, epics and even some historical facts along the way. The Bible becomes the Word of God only when it is understood in a mystical way. The great sages, prophets, teachers, guides of all wisdom traditions know that the message only gets through to people who are willing to let go and become one with God in a mysterious and miraculous way. His message is subversive. There is no law against such things.
