The printed program gave profiles of five winners under the title: Women Who Beat the Odds. After graduation, she plans to attend Georgia State Law School, seeking to become an agent. But she also would like to create a program that helps young girls in Pennsylvania and gives them a safe residential haven. Avis Wilson joined the Navy in and is one of six females in the nationally recognized ceremonial guard. She is currently enrolled at the American Military Institute for legal studies. She would like to become a criminal defense attorney. Christina Johnson graduated this year from Chowan University in North Carolina with a degree in biology with a track in environmental studies. Karin Wallace is a graduate of Simon Gratz high and is now majoring in public health at Temple. She hopes to begin her own program, focused on adolescents. She is majoring in forensic science. Although the Guru condensed the biographies here due to the late hour of the night this is being written, here is something not shortened. Angie Nelson, who is the hands-on day-to-day head of the foundation, graciously provided the Guru with a copy of the acceptance speech, which Alexis Felder made on behalf of all of the winners. It speaks for itself, and thus, the Guru will sign off this post, leaving you to read the speech in its entirety: My name is Alexis Felder, and I have been associated with the Dawn Staley Foundation for ten years both as a participant and volunteer of the after school program. We faced many obstacles that could have easily broken our spirit. We were constantly exposed to people getting killed in front of our eyes, neighborhoods ruined by the effects of drugs and the game of selling drugs. The lack of proper nurturing and guidance led many of us down the road of making poor choices. Regularly attending school and getting good grades placed second to learning how to survive the inner city streets, and the thought of applying for and entering college was non-existent. The negativities could have easily been our downfall. This program gave us a sense of security and love. It became our safe haven, a way to escape the madness of our environments. Because Dawn Staley created this foundation, we learned the importance of believing in ourselves and that we had the power within to change our lives. The concept that we can do anything we put our mind to was constantly drilled in us on a daily basis. The continued support, the emphasis of education, and the daily nurturing from staff members, encouraged us to dream and live our boldest dreams. I believe that Dawn Staley also created this foundation to form great sisterly bonds with our peers. Many of us entered the program as dysfunctional teenagers, continuing to isolate ourselves from those who were going through similar experiences. My involvement with the Dawn Staley Foundation, fostered relationships with young women sharing many of the same experiences and as a result we developed a bond with one another that will never be broken. We have emerged from the program as grounded young women. We continue to support and nurture each other throughout our college years and hopefully beyond. Tonight you see women before you who are determined to reach their destiny. Among you are recent college graduates, college seniors, and a Navy officer, all with dreams of becoming entrepreneurs, a forensic scientist,

Federal Bureau Investigative Agent, and even a J. Our accomplishments are just a few of what many of the young women that have passed through the program have achieved. The women that are being honored along with myself tonight are some of the very products that the Dawn Staley Foundation helped produce. In the spirit of giving, I ask that you continue to support the Dawn Staley Foundation After School Program, so that young ladies can continue to be loved, nurtured and shaped into responsible citizens and great leaders of tomorrow. Chapter 2 : Dawn Staley - Wikipedia

Dawn Michelle Staley is a basketball player, hall of Famer and head coach at the University of South Carolina. She is a three-time Olympic gold medalist and was elected to carry the United States flag at the opening ceremony of the Summer Olympics.

After winning their next game against Bulgaria, the USA team again fell in a close game, losing by three points to Czechoslovakia. The USA team finished in seventh place. While the USA team had won gold in , they finished with the silver in , in fifth place in , and did not field a team in . The team was coached by Tara VanDerveer of Stanford. After winning opening games easily, the USA faced China in the medal round. There they faced 7â€™0 Spain, but won, 88â€™62, to claim the gold medal. She led the team to an undefeated record of 60â€™0 and the gold medal at the Olympic games in Atlanta. She was also a member of the Olympic team that defended the gold medal. The USA team won a close opening game against Japan, 95â€™89, then won their next six games easily. In the semifinal game against Brazil, the USA team was behind as much as ten points in the first half, but went on to win, 93â€™. The gold medal game was a rematch against Russia. In the first game, the USA team dominated almost from the beginning, but in the rematch, the team from Russia took the early lead and led much of the way. With under two minutes remaining, the USA was down by two points but the USA responded, then held on to win the gold medal, 71â€™. Staley hit two free throws with ten seconds left to extend a three-point lead to five points, then hit another free throw with three seconds left in the game to "seal the 71â€™65 victory". The team was coached by Van Chancellor. The USA team won all nine games, including a close title game against Russia, which was a one-point game late in the game. Before the Games, she was selected to carry the flag of the United States during the parade of nations at the opening ceremony. On August 1, , Staley was traded to the Houston Comets. Staley announced before the start of the WNBA season that she would be retiring after the Comets season was over. The Comets made the playoffs and faced the Sacramento Monarchs in the first round. In , she was voted in by fans as one of the Top 15 players in the fifteen-year history of the WNBA.
