Disabled resident at The Golden-Age Home tied to her bed. Beneath the surface, however, in residential clusters, is a heartbreaking and stomach-churning story of abuse and neglect. Many of the elderly residents are subjected to a mass bathing ritual each morning - stripped, lathered, and then sprayed with water from a hose. After the co-ed bathing exercise, the male and female residents are forced to walk back to their dorms stark naked. An undercover Sunday Gleaner investigation has unearthed several instances of abuse and inhumane treatment at The Golden-Age Home, an infirmary for elderly indigent and disabled Jamaicans in Vineyard Town, Kingston 3. Many of the elderly residents are subjected to a mass bathing ritual each morning. Both men and women, awakened before 7 a. Several severely disabled residents spend most of their days wallowing on dirty floors. There appeared to be more flies than the residents who call the facility home. The flies were everywhere - on the residents, and on their food. When our news team visited the premises last week, the lengthy pathway leading to the cluster dwellings was pristine. The grass was well kept, and a gentle breeze caressed the entire property. However, all that tranquillity changed when our news team ventured on to the clusters. Cluster A, the first of eight dormitories, was the first stop. A foul odour, coming from what appeared to be faeces mingled with urine, assaulted our nostrils. The practical nurse repeatedly referred to the disabled females as "gyal". Unable to walk, she crept to the bathroom. After the quick shower, the disabled woman, still naked and now wet, had to creep back to her bed. The sight of severely disabled woman tied to a bed with strips of white cloth conjured up images of the ill-fated Eventide Home at Slipe Pen Road in Kingston that was razed by fire on May 20, , killing more than elderly women. Eventide remembered The Eventide residents were abused and neglected to the point where rodents had the liberty of feeding on some of their body parts. Almost 31 years later, some of the Eventide survivors who were taken to The Golden-Age Home, are still living at the Vineyard Town home. This golden-age home was designed to be the answer to the Eventide problem. Father Richard Ho Lung, founder and superior general of Roman Catholic charity Missionaries of the Poor, was one of the leading voices in the condemnation of the treatment meted out to the poor who lived at Eventide. When told recently of what was transpiring at The Golden-Age Home, he questioned whether the country had so soon forgotten those who perished at Eventide. Eventide is the most tragic display of human neglect our country has ever known. Let us never repeat it again," Ho Lung urged.

Some of the other fishermen make fun of Santiago; others look at him and are sad, speaking politely about the current and the depths at which they had fished and what they had seen at sea. The fishermen who were successful this day have taken their marlin to the fish house or their sharks to the shark factory. Manolin asks if he can get sardines for Santiago tomorrow. Santiago at first tells him to go play baseball but eventually relents. Because Santiago has nothing to eat, Manolin fetches Santiago the dinner that the Terrace owner, Martin, sends for free, as he has many times before. As Santiago eats, he and the boy talk of baseball, the great Joe DiMaggio, and other topics of mutual interest. The next morning, Santiago picks up the boy at his house. They have coffee which is all that Santiago will have all day at an early morning spot that serves fishermen. The boy fetches sardines and fresh bait and helps the old man ease his skiff into the water. They wish each other good luck, and the old man rows away.

Together, these images and allusions suggest a theme of transformation and a larger spiritual dimension possible in the human condition: Human beings can summon imaginative vision, as well as physical endurance, creating the capacity to withstand and even transcend hardships. That central theme radiates beyond the surface realism in this very human tale of an impoverished old man, his love for a young man who also loves him, and his trials in bringing in a big fish. Certainly that story is central, and Hemingway the journalist would have nothing less. In short, the novella invites, even demands, reading on multiple levels. He is thin and gaunt, from a long life of hard work and times with little to eat. His hands are scarred from handling heavy fish on cords, but the scars are "old as erosions in a fishless desert. Job-like in his hardships, Santiago is a man who has endured many ordeals. He remains dedicated to his principles his own internal code of behavior and to his passion for his profession above concerns for material gain or survival. Yet even for a Hemingway hero, Santiago is something special. After Manolin presses Santiago to accept some fresh baits, Santiago who is also somewhat reminiscent of Don Quixote proffers his customary protests to save face but eventually agrees: He was too simple to wonder when he had attained humility. But he knew he had attained it and he knew it was not disgraceful and it carried no loss of true pride. Just as this realistic story tends toward allegory, Santiago and Manolin, as specific individuals, also can be seen as archetypal characters universal

representations inherited from the collective consciousness of our ancestors and the fundamental facts of human existence.
