When approaching an intersection controlled by a flashing yellow light, you must: Come to a complete stop at the intersection. Maintain your normal speed. Slow down and proceed with caution. Slow down when approaching a flashing yellow traffic signal.

Allow extra space in front of your vehicle when following a: Motorcycles can stop more quickly than other vehicles can and you must have adequate room to stop if the motorcyclist brakes or falls off. Also, remember that motorcycles are difficult to see at night because they only have one tail light. Flash your brake lights or turn on your emergency flashers if you: Need to warn other drivers of a collision ahead. Are temporarily parked in a traffic lane to make delivery. Are backing out of a parking space. In which of the following scenarios should your wheels not be pointed straight ahead? When waiting to make a left turn at a traffic light. When parked on a hill or sloping driveway. When parked on the side of a level roadway where there is no curb. If you are less than 18 years, but at least 15 years and six months, and applying for a provisional permit, you need to take the written test on traffic laws and traffic signs. There are 46 questions on this test. To pass, you must correctly answer 38 questions. If you fail, you must wait one week before taking it again. You have three chances to pass the test. If you are over 18 years and apply for an original driver license, the test covering traffic laws and road signs consists of 36 questions. If you pass, you will be issued a permit if you have never been licensed before. Once you have your permit, you must drive with an accompanying adult who is 18 years of age or older and have a valid California license. A renewal test for adults has 18 questions. Today, you take the test on a computer with a touch screen.
