Perhaps through some kind of charter review commission? Did you know that New York City is currently home to two separate charter review commissions? What is the city charter? First enacted in 1784, the charter is the legislative document that establishes New York City, comprised of its five boroughs which also make up its five constituent counties as a single municipal entity according to New York State law. It sets how many city council members there are, whether we should have a mayor or not, and whether borough presidents should have any actual power. Much of it is baked into our administrative code, which spells out the laws of New York City. While the charter can be amended by the city council, changing anything in it that relates to the way we vote, or creates a new citywide office, or radically changes the power of an existing office, must go to a popular vote by the general public. What happened the last time NYC changed the charter? The city you live in today, from its powerful mayor to its activist city council, is largely because of the decisions made in 1992, the last time the charter was substantially altered. New York had to completely rewrite its charter goodbye City Council President, hello Public Advocate, which affected everything from how the city holds its elections to its process for deciding how to use its land. Since then, there have been a couple of revisions, mostly regarding term limits. In 2008, a petition drive led to a ballot measure that set city council term limits at two terms which was famously briefly overturned by the city council in 2009, to let Mayor Michael Bloomberg run for a third term. Both mayors Giuliani and Bloomberg appointed commissions to look at changes to the charter, but neither led to any significant changes in how the city operates. The last major commission to look at the charter was appointed in 2011. Wait why do we have two different charter revision committees? According to state law, both the mayor and the city council are allowed to appoint a committee to review the city charter, release a report on possible changes to the charter, and then put specific proposals on the ballot for a popular vote. In January of this year, Mayor Bill de Blasio announced that he was going to appoint a commission to review the city charter limited at looking for ways to boost civic participation. At the same time, members of the City Council, along with Public Advocate Tish James who is now the frontrunner to become the next Attorney General of New York were working on a bill to create a commission to review the entire city charter for possible changes. Last month, the committee appointed by Mayor de Blasio announced the results of a series of citywide community hearings and internet-generated proposals that will be appearing on the ballot. The three measures aim to increase civic participation and lower the barriers of entry for running for elected office: Also, provide more resources to community boards. Many advocates had rallied around the implementation of ranked-choice voting during committee hearings, which would save the city money on costly runoff elections that consistently draw miniscule turnout. Ranked-choice voting allows voters to rank their choices for an elected office, with the winner being a candidate that better reflects the support of a majority of voters, rather than just the one who got the most votes. Each of these ideas were presented to the mayoral commission as well during a frenzy of last-minute community meetings. The commission chose not to act on them, even though commissions are allowed to review every aspect of the city charter, no matter what the person who appointed them instructed. Other ideas the commission could possibly look into include changing the time construction in the city can begin, whether to allow non-citizens to vote in municipal elections, creating a new public housing program, or abolishing the Board of Elections. The commission can think big. We need a chief diversity officer reporting directly to the mayor to change the culture and practice of these agencies. You could double the size of the city council, or have the speaker of the city council be an elected position. Whether or not you can get enough commissioners to support it, and then the voters, is another question. The proposals will be on the back side of the ballot. Then, an effort to legitimize whatever ends up on the ballot next November by trying to ensure a high turnout during a year where all indicators point towards an

In this case, board members with previous CEO or other high-level executive experience can be particularly helpful. Parents often find it difficult to orchestrate the handover of the keys to the family business. There are a range of board types to consider, each appropriate for different situations. A board of insiders This is a board composed of shareholders and company executives who come together to make decisions on key issues related to the business. It can resemble an executive committee or other senior leadership group. A board of insiders can also be an effective way to involve the next generation of family owners in the process of making major decisions. These types of boards are relatively easy to assemble, requiring little if any legal setup, and can be an effective forum in organizations that lack sufficient debate and interaction at the senior leadership level. A fiduciary board with a minority of independents Fiduciary boards have a formal role in the organization. The members have decision-making authority laid out in the corporate bylaws and are also subject to the liability associated with board membership. Keeping the number of outsiders--those unaffiliated with the company or the ownership group--in the minority keeps the decision-making firmly in the hands of insiders. This can be more comfortable for owners who want to maintain their authority while moving to more independent oversight. A fiduciary board with a majority of independents This is what you see in most public companies and many large privately held companies. With a majority of outsiders, the board generally functions more objectively and independently than if it were dominated by insiders. While still acting on behalf of the owners, the board is more likely to drive the strategic agenda and have more authority. These boards also typically can and need to attract members with a higher level of expertise and experience. Most privately held businesses that pursue this route have an ownership group that, for a variety of reasons, has decided to turn the majority of the key decisions over to a board. I advised my friend to look first for people in his network before going to a search firm or recruiting more broadly. Finally, no friends, customers, suppliers, or personal trainers. Even one person who is obviously underqualified or has a conflict of interest can compromise the effectiveness of the board. Everyone you choose for your board should be there because he or she has something to contribute and is willing to deliberate the issues carefully before, during, and after the meetings. Once the board is up and running, here are a few guidelines to get the board off on the right foot. Make sure the board functions well as a team. Give the new board members some breathing room to be effective. Initially, it can be tempting for you as the owner to set the agenda, dominate the discussions, and focus only on what you are interested in. You need to make sure you are listening, especially early on. After all, you formed a board, presumably, to get support and guidance from others. Consider going as far as giving the chairmanship or other important responsibilities to other members of the board to distribute the balance of authority. This will help focus the discussions on what they can affect and reduce confusion between the roles of the board, owners, and CEO. Finally, set the tone that every board member works on behalf of all shareholders. It can be tempting for board

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members to align with one or a group of shareholders, especially if they were introduced to the board by said shareholders. This is generally documented in the corporate bylaws. You, as owners, will retain the ability to make the key decisions, including selecting board members, while delegating only the decisions you choose to the board. Many owners look back at the founding of their board as a critical moment in the long-term success of their business and in their own success as owners stepping away from the business. Understanding that boards can be designed to fit the unique needs of every business can ensure that you get the expertise and support you need without the unnecessary bureaucracy or any unintended loss of control. Search Certified Board Resolution: It gives authority to an individual or group to act on behalf of the corporation. There is often confusion as to the difference between a board resolution and board minutes. Both are important records of the activities of the board of directors of a company. However, board minutes describe all the discussions and resolutions that occur over the course of board of directors meeting. It is prepared after the meeting has concluded. A resolution, on the other hand, describes one action taken by the board at a meeting, is prepared separately during the meeting, and is attested to by the secretary of the corporation before the president approves it. State laws under which a corporation is formed require that whenever a board of directors makes a decision or desires to take an action and it is voted on and approved by a majority of the board, a certified board resolution be created. This document is then made available to the public. The most common reasons for having a board resolution certified include: Banks commonly request an individual representing a corporation to produce a certificate of authority that establishes his or her authority to make payments and conduct financial activities on behalf of the company. Representatives of a corporation, such as an employee or manager who is not on the board of directors, is often asked by other companies to disclose that the board of directors has given the representative permission to enter into agreement on behalf of the corporation. A certified board resolution is accepted as proof. Steps to Creating a Certified Board Resolution In order to prepare and execute a certified board resolution, the secretary of the corporation should follow these procedures: Review the corporate by-laws. Among the important items to review are the requirements for establishing a quorum in order for the meeting of the board to be considered valid and voting procedures. The chairperson will call the meeting to order. The chairperson is a member of the board elected for a term of usually one year and tasked with running board meetings. If the chairperson is not in attendance at a board meeting, then the CEO or president of the company or another member of the board can be designated to oversee proceedings. The chairperson will call for a vote on the issue before the board. The vote will be taken. If a majority of the board members are in favor of the action, the vote will pass and it will become a matter of corporate record. The secretary prepares the resolution and certifies that it was adopted by the board of directors according to the procedures set forth in the by-laws. Elements of a Certified Board Resolution Regardless of the authority granted through the certified board resolution, the certificate is required to contain the following information: Date when the resolution is passed by the board of directors. A designation of the party for whom the resolution is being prepared for and its address. Explanation of the action being taken by the board of directors and the reason for doing so. Name of the secretary. Legal name of the corporation and state of incorporation. Names of the board of directors voting for approval of the resolution. Meeting details, such as the date of the meeting, number of directors in attendance and how the directors in attendance voted. Name of the individual s being granted authority to act on behalf of the corporation, if necessary. Validation that all statements and declarations contained in the certificate are true and signature of the secretary to that effect. Imprint of the corporate seal. They establish policies for managing a company. The Board also ensures that the executives get timely and constructive feedback; are introduced to other community leaders and organizations; get invited to important social gatherings; are recognized and rewarded for exceptional initiatives; get personal and professional leave and are also assisted when other members misunderstand their role or overstep their authority. The Board should make sure that organizational planning is done effectively and comprehensively. They can either be a part of the planning process if they plan to own it or ask good questions from the other planners if they themselves are not a part of it. The board should only approve plans after thorough deliberation and analysis of the same. The Board also ensures that the organization has adequate resources to meet its needs. It is, of course, the top executive who is the main fundraiser. But it is the board that determines what is really possible to achieve. The board influences potentially big donors, introduces the top executives to new fundraising initiatives and also monitors the different fundraising initiatives within the organization. After providing resources, the board also needs to ensure that these resources are being utilized efficiently and effectively. They protect accumulated assets and manage the current income properly. They are wholly and solely accountable for the use of resources in the organization especially because the organization is declared tax exempt by federal and state laws. Therefore, the Board develops and approves an annual budget and ensures that the budget implementation is accompanied with accurate, intelligible, clear and timely reporting. They have to ensure that they are in line with the current and stated mission and purpose of the organization. The media, government and prospective donors and clients need a positive image of an organization for reliance, and the Board makes sure of just that. The members also ensure that none of the other board members goes out and makes a statement in behalf of the board or the organization without prior consultation and approval of all the other members. This can be in issues pertaining to personnel policies and procedures, grievance protocols, etc. The Board also assesses its own performance. Every three or five years, the board should take out some time from their usual work and review their own performance. What Makes a Good Board Member? When choosing a board member or compiling a board, ask yourself the following: Does the prospective candidate have enough time for attending meetings and representing the organization in various forums? Does he or she believe in the cause of the organization? Does he or she understand and agree to accept the legal liability for the activities happening in the organization? Does he or she come from a relatively varied field of expertise compared to the other board members? This diversity helps in decision making in different areas. They should also not expect any form of remuneration except the feeling of contributing to the community.

Below the main breaker there are many smaller breakers that are divided up and are marked with amount of electricity available to each of those breakers. Each divided slot usually represents individual rooms, but they may also represent hard-wired appliances like air conditioners, furnaces, and water heaters. For example, of the amps available to a home, the kitchen may have two 15 amp circuits, the bedroom may have a 10 amp circuit, the air conditioner a 30 amp circuit, etc. Make sure that each of the circuits in your electrical panel are clearly labeled on the inside of the main breaker panel door by what they are powering the kitchen, bedrooms, air conditioner, etc. This will make it easy to know what breaker is what and will make it easier to control rooms or appliances when you need to turn them off to replace a switch, or outlet, or to perform maintenance. In order for your home to receive power you must have a breaker box. The typical amount of power that is allotted for your home is amps but it may vary depending on the size of your house. With that amount of power being fed into your home, if you were to plug anything in without a circuit breaker the device that was plugged in would blow up because too much power was going into the device. They are usually located in utility rooms, the garage, or in a basement. Unfortunately for Floridians, we frequently get thunderstorms and we even get to experience the occasional hurricane. Because these things tend to shut our power off and cause us to reset our circuit breakers, many of us know exactly where they are in our homes.
