It covers fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, sugar gliders, hedgehogs, rodents, rabbits, ferrets, miniature pigs, primates and wildlife. Primarily a drug formulary, the book covers dose rates and prescribing guidelines for antimicrobial, antifungal, antiparasitic, antiviral, chemical restraint, analgesic, anti-inflammatory, nebulisation and psychotropic agents, hormones and steroids, vitamins, minerals, fluids and other miscellaneous agents in the various groups of animals. In addition, it includes a grand total of very useful appendices. These include haematologic and serum biochemical values, urinalysis values for selected species, biologic and physiologic values for selected species, venipuncture sites, differential diagnoses, environmental, dietary and reproductive characteristics of reptiles, treatment guidelines for various conditions in selected species, sources of products, fluid therapy, disinfectants and antiseptics, vaccination and preventative medicine recommendations to name a few. It is very well referenced and each section has an appendix with literature cited in that section. The bird section alone cites references. The formulary is set out in table format. In addition to dose rates, treatment regimes and prescribing guidelines for the various groups of animals, it includes precautions, guidelines for the use of the drug, species in which the drug and dose rates have been used and occasionally indications. It is important that practitioners using this book have some understanding of the pharmacology of the drugs and the indications for their use as this information is not included. The majority of the recommendations are based on empirical data and clinical experiences. Very few are based on pharmacokinetic studies as these have not been done in most of the species covered. The majority are off-label uses. The appendices provide useful information that is frequently required at short notice, e. Many of the appendices are repeated from previous editions. The appendices should be used as a guide only and should not replace more exhaustive veterinary literature. The recommendations should be used with caution and clinicians must use sound clinical judgement and draw on their experience and other literature. Some of the appendices describe diagnostic and treatment regimes for specific species and may not be relevant to species seen in Australia. Extrapolating this information to an Australian species should be done with caution. Some also do not include diseases that may be seen in Australia. Although the majority of the appendices are all-inclusive, others are incomplete and perhaps misleading. For example, the appendix on venipuncture sites in reptiles does not cover all options, does not include crocodylians or make a clear distinction between the various groups of chelonians. The preventative medicine recommendations for primates are not completely relevant in Australia and the recommendations for tuberculosis testing are not what is currently recommended in Australia. There is no mention of ancillary tests such as Primagam, cultures and chest x-rays. All the appendices which mention products diets, supplements or laboratories are only relevant to North America. Many of the species covered hedgehogs, many of the rodents, primates and the wildlife are not relevant to the Australian practitioner. Although sugar gliders an Australian species, although the majority kept as pets in the United States are the New Guinea subspecies are included, it is illegal to keep these as pets in most states and territories in Australia. The book is compact and presented in a very user-friendly format. The second edition was one of the most frequently used books on the shelf in my

practice. Now with a significantly updated formulary section, I have no doubt that this third edition will be even more useful. This book would be an essential addition to the library of any practitioner dealing with exotic and unusual pets and wildlife in Australia.
