But for the most part, they see the country falling well short in living up to these ideals, according to a new study of opinion on the strengths and weaknesses of key aspects of American democracy and the political system. The perceived shortcomings encompass some of the core elements of American democracy. Despite these criticisms, most Americans say democracy is working well in the United States — though relatively few say it is working very well. At the same time, there is broad support for making sweeping changes to the political system: The public sends mixed signals about how the American political system should be changed, and no proposals attract bipartisan support. Yet in views of how many of the specific aspects of the political system are working, both Republicans and Democrats express dissatisfaction. To be sure, there are some positives. On 23 specific measures assessing democracy, the political system and elections in the United States — each widely regarded by the public as very important — there are only eight on which majorities say the country is doing even somewhat well. As recently as four years ago, there were no partisan differences in these opinions. And there is bipartisan sentiment that the military leadership in the U. In most cases, however, partisans differ on how well the country lives up to democratic ideals — or majorities in both parties say it is falling short. Some of the most pronounced partisan differences are in views of equal opportunity in the U. There also is skepticism in both parties about the political independence of judges. Partisan gaps in opinions about many aspects of U. But there are some notable differences: The differences are even starker in evaluations of how well the country is doing in fulfilling many of these objectives. Democrats — particularly politically engaged Democrats — are critical of the process for determining congressional districts. Consistent with this limited view of the potential of women to act as equals to men, as well as his apparently missing on his travels seeing the nurturing roles that many men in the United States played, particularly in the Delaware Valley region of cultures where there was a lot of influence by Society of Friends as well as a tradition of male and female equality, Tocqueville considered the separate spheres of women and men a positive development, stating: Tocqueville seeks to apply the functional aspects of democracy in the United States to what he sees as the failings of democracy in his native France. These include his belief that democracy has a tendency to degenerate into " soft despotism " as well as the risk of developing a tyranny of the majority. He observes that the strong role religion played in the United States was due to its separation from the government, a separation all parties found agreeable. He contrasts this to France where there was what he perceived to be an unhealthy antagonism between democrats and the religious, which he relates to the connection between church and state.
