Many people feared that the proposal would erode freedom of press, religion, and association. The unpopularity of Chief Executive Tung Chee-Hwa and his administration, combined with the dissatisfaction about economy recession and the pandemic control, prompted an estimated , - 1,, people to march on 1 July , making it the largest since the Tiananmen Square protests of The resignation of Liberal Party chief James Tien from the Executive Council on 6 July caused the eventual withdrawal of the legislation and the break-up of the "ruling alliance" of the Chief Executive. The security secretary, Regina Ip , who was heavily criticised for her arrogant and condescending handling of the proposed law, was forced to resign. The display was one of power and symbolism staged by 19 pro-Beijing groups. The march was part of a celebration demonstration that began in Victoria Park.
