The first book was published in and new volumes were added as late as A version of this information was previously published in Yellowback Library in September before the NYPL collection was available to researchers. This version contains some corrections to the previous data and reflects the best current knowledge for the authorship of this series. The original text of this volume was written personally by Edward Stratemeyer in April and published by Mershon later that year. This is somewhat unusual because there are very few times when Stratemeyer personally wrote one volume and had the series continued by ghostwriters.
