He said, "Ask and it shall be given to you, seek and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. David was the king, humanly speaking, and he knew he was responsible to lead his country. He was called by God to do it, but he was also worried like everybody else. Now is the time to pray. Without the Book of Psalms to guide us, we could think "stars" like him are somehow more than everybody else, but with his open heart in Psalms we see that all of us, no matter what we are thought to be, are just people in need of God. He was terrified and he prayed. Paul the Apostle later taught us: And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus" Philippians 4: David was anxious and so he prayed. I would fly away and be at rest. There is a purpose for your life and mine. Prayer helped them, and prayer will help you and me. The answer might be No, or Yes, or Wait, or something you and everybody else never expected. However, He is much better at running our lives than we are, and we are learning that "godliness with contentment is great gain" 1 Timothy 6: As a human king, David reasonably hoped the armies of his enemies would experience a lack of communication and that confusion would strike them, and so he told God what he wanted. He had observed the behavior of the ones who were the subject of his concern and pointed out their deficiencies to God. David wanted to be a good king and a good guy sometimes he did better at it than other times, but he meant well. He had honest faith in the Lord and truly loved his God. Someone he respected more than anybody else had been revealed as a deceitful, evil person, who smiled and seemed to care but did not. David wanted them to die and go to hell have you felt like that? Luke in Acts 2: Our God will patiently reveal and teach us more than we could ever learn on our own. David personally saw, as we should know, that we do not save ourselves by our efforts, but instead it is the Lord who will save us. With whom there is no change, and who do not fear God. School yards are not safe, homes contain warring parents, the work place is full of tension, nations invade other nations, but "He will redeem my soul in peace from the battle which is against me. Perhaps he woke up angry and you just happened to be in the way. Friendship contains an implied contract, a covenant: I will like you and you will like me. But sometimes, words soft like butter can hide angry thoughts of war that burst out suddenly, unexpectedly, and your heart is hurt by that person who pretended to love you. To be hurt is a part of life, but so is prayer, and in faithful prayer, there is healing for your soul. When the leader of a country, corporation, job site or whatever, is a person of prayer, others are encouraged to become like them. George Washington, a general and then the first U. President, spent considerable personal time in fasting and prayer, encouraging others in his command to do the same. We can tell that the world is in trouble by the lack of such prayer and encouragement among leaders in the world of today. We as a people and as leaders are "shaken" because we do not "cast our burden upon the Lord," but we are sustained by Him when we do. But I will trust in You. And notice that the unbelieving can be people of "bloodshed and deceit" of all kinds, including those who are outwardly religious but have no faith in the Lord.

Because they have no changes, therefore they fear not God. He hath put forth his hands against such as be at peace with him: The words of his mouth were smoother than butter, but war was in his heart: Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee: But thou, O God, shalt bring them down into the pit of destruction: Psalm 55 is a psalm that shows us how to pray when we are in distress. We can literally unload our burdens on to the Lord. David knew and understood that bitter pain. David had the unfortunate experience of his son Absalom turning against him. His faithful counselor or advisor, Ahitophel turned against him and joined with his son in the conspiracy. This may have been the background for Psalm When David was betrayed he prayed earnestly to God. David prayed earnestly to God for deliverance -- Psalm David humbly asked God to hear his prayer and not reject his request. David was deeply hurt because he had been betrayed by people he loved. Out of a very troubled heart David cried to God for help. The psalmist was hurting so bad inside that he thought he would die; he was trembling with fear. Things were so bad for the psalmist that his desire was just to escape. His troubles were beating him down like a horrible storm. David prayed earnestly for his enemies to be destroyed -- Psalm The deep hurt of this moment was brought about because David was under attack by a familiar friend. There was violence and strife in the city and so David asked God to confuse his enemies. It is sad to be under attack. It is especially sad to be under attack because of the treachery of a friend. The closer they are to you, the deeper the pain. Like David, Jesus was betrayed by one of his closest and most intimate friends. David waited on the Lord to take care of his enemies. David just kept on praying to God -- Psalm David knew the answer to dealing with earthly problems. He took his problems to God in prayer. He is focused not on what cannot be done about the problem, but he focused what God could do. He said, "I will call upon God. Evening and morning and at noon, I will complain and murmur, And He will hear my voice. We are to wait upon God to rightly deal with the problem. When he took this great burden and gave it to the Lord, God actually took it. God will sustain you and me when we wait upon the Lord. Let us confidently lean upon Him. He will help His people.
