

Chapter 1 : "Pokémon" Nyarth's A-I-U-E-O (TV Episode) - IMDb

Go West, Young Ash by Tracey West is the seventeenth book of the adaption of the Pokémon anime. This book was published by Scholastic in It covers the events from A Tent Situation to Roll On, Pokémon!, excluding the events of The Double Trouble Header.

Meowth shares bittersweet memories of his life before Team Rocket, and reveals how and why he learned to walk and talk like a human. Plot Back home in Pallet Town , Ash , Brock , and Pikachu are doing their morning exercises, while Misty remarks on how the TV remote is getting more exercise than the three. Although Ash is reluctant to abandon another day of training in order to go to Hollywood, he eventually relents, and leaves for Hollywood along with Misty, Brock, and Delia. Elsewhere, while putting up a billboard for the movie, Jessie and James are thrilled about the premiere even though they were not invited, while Meowth is somewhat indifferent. Meowth then recalls his earliest memory: While tied up, he saw a movie being premiered, called That Darn Meowth! Meanwhile, Ash and his friends arrive in Hollywood, but find themselves at a run-down section of town, far away from the glamorous core. Across the street, Team Rocket are about to enter, seeing that the street is deserted, when Meowth suddenly decides to leave, promising Jessie and James to return before the start of the movie. Meowth arrives at an old run-down snack house, and recalls his first time there: Having eluded the chef, he was approached by a gang of Meowth, led by a Persian , and was accepted into the gang. Through the gang, he was able to satiate his hunger by stealing the food he needed, but found that he was still missing some love in his life. Coming to the boarded-up remains of what was once a posh department store, Meowth recalls the first time meeting his first crush, another Meowth named Meowzie , at the window of that store. He recalls having dashed across the street to meet her, causing a major traffic pileup in the process, only to be rebuked. Meowth vowed at that point to try to become human in order to impress her. Back in the present day, Meowth comes across a run-down mansion, recalling his time there. Back in the day, the mansion was home to an academy that taught students upper-class etiquette. Through spying on one of the classrooms, he had learned, albeit slowly, how to walk - the drawback being that he got caught more often whenever he tried to steal food having only to run on two legs instead of four. Eventually, he had also managed to speak human language, again from observing the classes. The first word he had understood was rocket. At this point, Meowth breaks into song, believing that his new talents would win Meowzie over. However, when he returned to Meowzie to show off his talents, he was quickly dismissed as a freak, worse than a street Meowth. Angry over her rejection, Meowth set off to be the richest freak she ever saw, all to win her over. His journey eventually landed him at Team Rocket, and the rest is history. As he finishes reminiscing, however, he is surrounded by his old gang, and he agrees to follow Persian, which does not go unnoticed by Jessie and James, who were about to enter the theater without him. Persian proposes that Meowth rejoin the gang, believing that his human capability would be an asset. However, Meowth refuses, being loyal to Team Rocket. However, Persian brings forth Meowzie, to the surprise of Meowth. Over a private conversation, Meowzie reveals that not long after Meowth had left, the city was caught in a recession. Meowzie was abandoned by her owner who was moving away, unable to afford to keep her, and was taken in by the same Meowth gang. Believing that Meowzie is too good for this place, Meowth tries to take her away, but is stopped by the rest of the gang. But before they can take any action, Jessie and James appear, and while Arbok and Weezing deal with the other Meowth, Meowth and Persian square off on the roof of a building. Although Meowth wins their brief battle, Meowzie runs over to Persian, concerned about its safety. Stunned, Meowth wonders why Meowzie would not leave with him, and Meowzie replies that she had owed Persian her gratitude for taking her in Dejected, Team Rocket leaves together, with Jessie and James trying to comfort Meowth, saying that Meowth is still their freak. Back at the theater, the movie had ended. Just then, Team Rocket appears and does their motto, and promptly leave when they are asked why they are there. Later, Meowth sits on the roof of a nondescript building, staring at the full moon, still longing for Meowzie. Ash questions Professor Oak about his whereabouts, but he is too busy trying to get the GS Ball open. Excited by this news, Ash decides to go to Johto as well. Brock and Misty decide to go with him, while Tracey wants to stay back and help Professor Oak. Happily, Ash and his friends set off to their first destination—New Bark Town. Ash and Misty have an argument, while Brock complains that they are "Worse than ever". Suddenly, Pikachu runs off. Then the bubble pops, and it runs away. However, the fog lifts, and in front of them, they see their destination—New Bark Town. The group runs there. Upon entrance, they see Officer Jenny. Officer Jenny agrees, and walks them into the lab, where Elm and Joy are. He shows them the Johto starters. Right at that moment, a police officer comes in and tells Jenny that they found tracks. Jenny calls out Growlithe to sniff the tracks and find the thieves. Ash tells Pikachu to help it. James retaliates by releasing his Weezing, who begins pouring out a Smokescreen. Ash calls on Charizard to flap its wings to clear the smoke. Seeing their chances, Pikachu, Charizard, Totodile, and Bulbasaur attack Team Rocket, sending them blasting off again, with Totodile back in good hands and Ash ready to register for the League. As they hike, they begin noticing that the trees look drained as opposed to the ones they passed earlier, which were full of life. Brock comments that something must be eating the trees. Misty wonders why the trees are so dry if the forest is balanced. After scaring the Butterfree away, the Pinsir begin scaling the trees. Misty calls out to the Heracross to stop them, but Woodruff says that while the Heracross were certainly powerful enough, they were too good-natured to do so. Brock realizes that the reason the trees are dried up is because the Pinsir invade the new trees, Heracross and Butterfree must then drink from trees they already drank from. Just then, they notice a Butterfree and Heracross being attacked by three Pinsir. Ash, angry at the three-on-two odds, calls on Bulbasaur and Pikachu, who drive away the Pinsir. Woodruff then asks them to go find out why the Pinsir were invading. They arrive at a valley dividing the Heracross forest and the Pinsir forest, and Woodruff remarks that the bridge was cut. However, a Heracross that was following the group breaks down a tree for the gang to walk across. When they arrive at the Pinsir forest, they see a mechanical Pinsir operated by Team Rocket stealing sap from the trees. Just then, the Heracross that was following them fights and defeats the Pinsir, saving Ash and friends. Ash and his friends decide to keep going, but Heracross decides to go with them, allowing Ash to catch it. Ash and his friends have to cross a valley to get to Violet City. On their way, however, is a baby Donphan. Ash, excited, wants to catch it, but Brock says that a baby like that must be raised by an experienced breeder like himself. He sends out Onix to fight it, but it is quickly defeated. Brock notices her necklace, and Rochelle says that it was made of agate, which her Donphan were trained to find around the valley. She leaves, telling the group not to fight any more Donphan. They are unaware of Team Rocket listening nearby, thrilled by the thought of agate. They conclude that in order to find the agate, they must capture a Donphan. They swoop down on Rochelle and her baby Donphan and catch it in a net. Rochelle calls upon her Donphan to sniff out the thieves. Rochelle explains that the Donphan is too young to find any agate, and ask for it back. Brock tries using Onix again, but it is defeated by Victreebel. Pikachu zaps Team Rocket, causing them to blast off again. Rochelle says that, because they rescued her Donphan, that she wished she could repay them. Ash replies by requesting a battle. Ash chooses what appears to be the most

experienced Donphan, and battles it with Heracross, holding his own though ultimately being defeated with a Rollout. Misty asks Ash if he feels disappointed about losing. Ash reflects on his rescuing of Totodile, capturing of Heracross, and battling of Donphan, and replies "Disappointed? Brock rejoins the group.
