The purpose of an informative essay, sometimes called an expository essay, is to educate others on a certain topic. Typically, these essays will answer one of the five Ws: Of course, they can also answer "how," indicating how to do something. Informative essays must never express your opinion or try to convince others to take a certain action or stance. That role is expressly reserved for persuasive essays. Read on to learn more about how to construct an informative essay, as well as examples of informative essays to help you get started.

Structure of an Informative Essay The basic structure of an informative essay is very simple. It needs to have a beginning, middle, and end. These are known more formally as the introduction, body and conclusion, respectively.

The Introduction The beginning, otherwise known as the introduction, is your opportunity to present your thesis statement and grab the attention of the reader. Your thesis statement must be one sentence, making it very clear what the reader will be informed about. The introduction can be anywhere from a paragraph to a page, depending on the requirements and circumstances. Use this opportunity to introduce the main idea, provide any pertinent definitions, and briefly describe what will be covered. Above all else, the introduction must clearly state what readers are about to explore. Be sure to steer clear of any evidence of your opinion on the topic. When you woke up this morning, did you think today would be the day you save a life? All you have to do is set aside approximately one hour to donate blood. This essay will explore how to donate blood, whom it benefits, and how often you can contribute to these life-saving measures. Ireland is a country steeped in history. The Body The middle, otherwise known as the body, is your opportunity to expound upon the thesis statement and grab the attention of the audience with solid facts, statistics, statements, and other supporting details. The body will be several paragraphs long, comprising the bulk of the essay. Be sure you delve deeply into every area previously outlined in the introduction.

The Conclusion The end, otherwise known as the conclusion, is your opportunity to summarize the essay in a paragraph or two. It should spur the reader to want to learn more about the topic. Be sure to reiterate the thesis statement clearly. In your introduction, you may have laid out what would be covered in the essay. Offer a sentence or two reiterating what was learned about those topic areas. After that, offer up a few closing remarks that gloss over the most important elements. End on a high note, encouraging your readers to learn more or contemplate the most important elements of your essay. You may even pose a rhetorical question. Put simply, all of these different types of paragraphs simply involve layering on a different purpose or intent. What are you trying to achieve in this paragraph and in your whole composition? What is your purpose right here? Do you wish to describe? Do you want to evaluate? Is your goal to narrate? Is your intent to persuade?

Narrative Version 1st person Last week we installed a kitty door so that our cat could come and go as she pleases. Unfortunately, we ran into a problem. Our cat was afraid to use the kitty door. We tried pushing her through, and that caused her to be even more afraid. The first step we took in solving this problem was taping the kitty door open. After a couple of days, she was confidently coming and going through the open door. However, when we removed the tape and closed the door, once again, she would not go through. They say you

catch more bees with honey, so we decided to use food as bait. We would sit next to the kitty door with a can of wet food and click the top of the can. It would be very easy to add an introduction and conclusion to these two paragraphs and have a complete essay! People often install a kitty door, only to discover that they have a problem. The problem is their cat will not use the kitty door. First, they may not understand how a kitty door works. They may not understand that it is a little doorway just for them. Second, many kitty doors are dark and cats cannot see to the other side. The first step in solving the problem is to prop the door open with tape. This means your cat will now be able to see through to the other side; your cat will likely begin using the kitty door immediately. Once your cat has gotten used to using the kitty door, remove the tape. Sometimes cats will continue to use the kitty door without any more prompting. If this does not happen, you will want to use food to bribe your cat. Open the door to show your cat that it is both you and the food waiting on the other side of the door. Repeat this a couple times, and then feed your cat. After a couple days of this, your kitty door problem will be gone. Cause and Effect Paragraph 8. This is also a first person narrative. The expository essay is a kind of essay that asks students to investigate an idea, evaluate evidence, expound on the idea, and set forth an argument concerning that idea in a clear and concise manner.

Fourth grade students who are preparing for middle school should write better sentences, paragraphs with clear ideas and a linear structure, and stories or essays that are informative and interesting. In these new expository writing prompts for 4th graders, students will seek to define, describe, and explain topics related to their upcoming time in middle school. Use these 30 new expository writing prompts to help students better prepare for the academic rigors of the next step ahead of them—while also reflecting on the emotional challenges and new experiences that await them in middle school. With more students and more classrooms, you may or may not have classes with your friends when you enter middle school. Explain some things you can do when most of your friends are in classes other than yours. Explain why making eye contact as both a listener and a speaker is important. Think of something about middle school that makes you nervous. Describe how you feel and what you think the experience will be like. Define several qualities that make someone a good leader, and explain how you can work to better embody those principles. Describe several things you would look for in your ideal high school. Explain how middle school will be different from elementary school. Which aspects are you most excited about?
