Closes for the season October The extensive menu includes everything from blackened fish tacos and clam chowder to hamburgers and hotdogs, and is the perfect stop after a day at Hammonasset Beach. Closes at the end of October for the season. Picture a bread bowl, hollowed out and stuffed full of your choice of hot or cold lobster, and then topped with a generous pour of lobster bisque. Add it to your list of things to eat before you die. Open year round except February. Best eaten on one of their outdoor picnic tables on the Patchogue River, the sweet lobster pairs perfectly with the savory bacon, the ocean breeze, and a cold beer from their full bar. Nestled in West Haven, this restaurant makes you feel miles away with all the pirate paraphernalia and beach directly across the street. My order usually involves their hot lobster roll which is superb , a cup of chowder, and the soft-shell crab during season. Open year round except for January. Sit your rump on one of their many tree stump seats and enjoy a meal while summer nostalgia inevitably overcomes you. Open through September and weekends only in October.
