Complex sentences, on the other hand, have one independent clause and one or more dependent clauses. Compound-complex sentences have at least two independent clauses and one dependent clause. Comma splices are the incorrect use of a comma in joining two or more independent clauses to create a single sentence. I bought a very cute new puppy, he ate my very expensive bag. Start with simple sentences. They are easier to understand and to correct. Start with the simple ones and then gradually upgrade by using conjunctions.
