Our Hard Copy Products In recent years, we have offered publications to those interested in all things Haitian in electronic and printed form. Our main mode of sharing through the years has been through our award winning quarterly journal, Haiti Philately. Now in its forty-fourth year of publication, our English language journal has served to document the many aspects of Haitian philately. Subjects that come to mind are stamps, postal history, proofs, essays, errors, revenues, postal rates, the various air services to and from Haiti, various paquebot services, military occupation mail, and so much more. Burton Sellers, a former President of the Haiti Philatelic Society and better known for his Presidency of the national American Philatelic Society, was a tireless supporter of collecting Haiti. Sellers was widely known for his national and international exhibits, his numerous articles in many publications on subjects regarding Haitian philately, and his talks to interested collectors at major events. Following the sale of his sixty plus volume collection in , the Society was permitted to offer scans of much of his collection as a permanent record of his extensive holdings. Beginning in , the Society began the release of a series of Special Studies, each which serve as an important monograph detailing a subject in the broad field of Haitian philately. Several of these publications have been recognized by notable awards in open Literature competitions and they are designed to provide a comprehensive review of their respective topics. The authors to-date include Peter C. Jeannopoulos and Barbara A. Jeannopoulos is a well-known specialist in the philately of Haitian stamps and revenue paper. Besides competitively exhibiting at both national and international exhibitions, he has also published numerous articles concerning Haitian philately in mainstream philatelic and society journals as well as in other specialist publications. The postage stamp portion of the collection stops in This DVD is undoubtedly a beautiful and valuable record of a magnificent collection. Four sample pages follow. A mere description of this enduring collection will not adequately convey its extensive coverage of all aspects of the philately of Haiti. An understatement to be sure! The presentation recalls the period which saw the transformation of Saint Domingue into Haiti. Illustrating postal history reflecting the major historic events of that era, this work marks the change of the then colony into a new nation. Written by Peter C. Its pages are divided into five parts: Part II focuses on the genuine overprint and its identifying features. With accurate illustrations, Part III clearly illustrates how each of the 29 different forgery types differs from the genuine. Part IV points out misinformation and contradictions in that literature, as well as shortcomings in accompanying illustrations. The work concludes with a detailed bibliography, which includes everything written at the time on the subject in the English language, as well as the more important references in German and French. Of the pages, there are 30 pages of color illustrations of earliest known usages,

varieties, covers, largest known multiples, etc. The title is 8. Anyone interested in this issue is much advised to order a numbered copy since only copies have been printed. This publication is an important reference source for anyone interested in the aerophilately of Haiti and was written by Peter C. The work is a result of research by the author which yielded new discoveries concerning early Haitian experimental airmail flights conducted by United States Marine Corps pilots in the s. Jeannopoulos carefully documents his findings versus those which have been noted in existing literature and presents his observations in a comprehensive, concise manner. The study itself spans 28 pages, with 18 pages in full color illustrating various early flights, and carefully details the newly identified discoveries. A previously unidentified flight cachet was found on several of them. As his research efforts progressed, the author also determined that recorded dates were not accurate for another more common cachet from that period. While the scarcity of the newly identified cachet had not been established at the time of publication, this publication should assist collectors to check their collections and report their findings. The monograph is divided into four segments: Prepared by author Barbara A. Levine, this new work will serve as a key reference publication summarizing the development of Haitian aerophilately as documented by the many first flights associated with that Caribbean nation. This work is 45 pages in length, features illustrations of some flight covers in color, and combines flight listings from previously published works, adding flights identified in specialist literature and by individual collectors. This publication also includes illustrations of Haitian air post cachets and error markings. An appendix compliments the other listings in the catalog with a discussion of additional flights of interest not categorized as first flights. The study concludes with a list of references offering the reader more options for further research. This definitive work cross-references to other sources, adding flight number information when available. Designed to serve as a standard for airmail enthusiasts, details concerning flights are summarized in table format for ease of reference. Flights are listed in date order to facilitate identification by specific date. The tables contain entries for both inbound to Haiti and outbound from Haiti first flights. The monograph is divided into seven segments, each representing a distinct period, reflecting the development of Haitian Air Post service, along with a separate section for Appendices. Part I - Pioneer and Early U. Jeannopoulos, this publication is an important reference work which sheds definitive light on this early postal issue of the Republic of Haiti. This monograph of 76 pages brings together information not readily available elsewhere from various sources in English, French, and German. In addition, this work includes unpublished notes of Dr. Tyler and Carroll L. Errors in information previously published have been corrected and clarification has been made of earlier ambiguous statements recorded in philatelic literature. This study illustrates the relative scarcity of each to one another, as well as the scarcity of multiples, town cancels, and covers. This publication is divided into six segments: Part I - A comprehensive examination of the Genuine issue and varieties noted. Part II - A thorough discussion of the Reprints of the issue and their characteristics. Part IV - A detailed survey of the overprints and surcharges on the 50c stamp which created essays, revenue stamps, and other postage stamp issues. Part V - A comprehensive list of References. Part VI - Fifteen Appendices with early articles from the philatelic press spanning the years , including a translation of articles from *Le Timbrophile de France* and from the *Kohl-Briefmarken-Handbuch* 11th Edition. Jeannopoulos, this publication is an important reference work, which will serve as a definitive resource for collectors interested in overprint errors of typeset overprints on postal issues released after by the Republic of Haiti. This perfect-bound book of pages brings together information not readily available elsewhere and provides collectors color illustrations of virtually all the errors recorded during the period. The writer includes a thorough explanation of overprint variations, selected references for further study on this area, a listing of the errors on record, exclusions in this work, and extensive full color illustrations. While other associated topics are included in this work, the reader will be struck by how few errors actually exist. This monograph will aid collectors in determining needs still to be met for their collections.
