Biblical account[ edit ] Caleb, son of Jephunneh Numbers According to Numbers 13, Caleb, the son of Jephunneh, was one of the twelve spies sent by Moses into Canaan. Their task, over a period of 40 days, [3] was to explore the Negev and surrounding area, and to make an assessment of the geographical features of the land, the strength and numbers of the population , the agricultural potential and actual performance of the land, settlement patterns whether their cities were like camps or strongholds , and forestry conditions. Moses also asked them to be courageous and to return with samples of local produce. Verse 30 of chapter 13 reads "And Caleb stilled the people toward Moses, and said: Caleb and Kenizzites[ edit ] Caleb the spy is the son of Jephunneh. Jephunneh is called a Kenizzite Numbers The Kenizzites are listed Genesis However, Caleb is mentioned alongside the descendants of Judah recorded in 1 Chronicles 4: Iru, Elah, and Naam; and the sons of Elah: Kenaz" 1 Chronicles 4: The Kenizzites are generally considered an Edomite clan see Genesis Since Hebron itself was one of the Cities of Refuge to be ruled by the Levites , it is later explained that Caleb actually was given the outskirts Joshua Caleb promised his daughter Achsah in marriage to whomever would conquer the land of Debir from the giants. Traditional Jewish accounts[ edit ] Traditional Jewish sources record a number of stories about Caleb which expand on the biblical account. One account records that Caleb wanted to bring produce from the land, but that the other spies discouraged him from doing so in order to avoid giving the Israelites a positive impression of Canaan. They only agreed to carry in samples of produce after Caleb brandished a sword and threatened to fight over the matter. The two men alluded to here are Caleb and Joshua: O my people, remember the favour of Allah to you when He raised prophets among you and made you kings and gave you what He gave not to any other of the nations. O Moses, therein are a powerful people, and we shall not enter it until they go out from it; if they go out from it, then surely we will enter. Enter upon them by the gate, for when you enter it you will surely be victorious; and put your trust in Allah, if you are believers. O Moses, we will never enter it so long as they are in it; go therefore thou and thy Lord, and fight; surely here we sit. My Lord, I have control of none but my own self and my brother; so distinguish between us and the transgressing people. It will surely be forbidden to them for forty years -- they will wander about in the land. So grieve not for the transgressing people.

Why was Moses not allowed to enter the Promised Land? Moses is hailed as the leader of the Exodus, the one through whom God delivered His people from Egyptian slavery. To Moses God entrusted the Law. Jesus demonstrated that Moses foreshadowed His own work as the Messiah John 3: Moses is listed in Hebrews 11 as exemplary of faith. In Deuteronomy 34 we read that God Himself buried Moses. Yet Moses, for all of his blessings, was not allowed to enter the Promised Land. Therefore, you will see the land only from a distance; you will not enter the land I am giving to the people of Israel. He showed Moses the Promised Land, but did not let him enter in. The incident at the waters of Meribah Kadesh is recorded in Numbers Nearing the end of their forty years of wandering, the Israelites came to the Desert of Zin. There was no water, and the community turned against Moses and Aaron. Moses and Aaron went to the tent of meeting and prostrated themselves before God. God told Moses and Aaron to gather the assembly and speak to the rock. Water would come forth. Moses took the staff and gathered the men. Water came from the rock, as God had promised. But God immediately told Moses and Aaron that, because they failed to trust Him enough to honor Him as holy, they would not bring the children of Israel into the Promised Land verse Most obviously, Moses disobeyed a direct command from God. God had commanded Moses to speak to the rock. Instead, Moses struck the rock with his staff. Earlier, when God had brought water from a rock, He instructed Moses to strike it with a staff Exodus God wanted Moses to trust Him, especially after they had been in such close relationship for so many years. Also, Moses took the credit for bringing forth the water. Moses seemed to be taking credit for the miracle himself and Aaron , instead of attributing it to God. Moses did this publicly. God could not let it go unpunished and expect the Israelites to understand His holiness. The water-giving rock is used as a symbol of Christ in 1 Corinthians The rock was struck in Exodus When Moses angrily struck the rock, he destroyed the biblical typology and, in effect, crucified Christ again. Yet we do not see Moses complain about his punishment. Instead, he continues to faithfully lead the people and honor God. In His holiness, God is also compassionate. God continued to use the prophet and continued to love him with tenderness.
