Chapter 1: Using Paint and how to edit the Text box. - Microsoft Community

Do one of the following to select a type layer: Select the Move tool and double-click the type layer on the canvas. Select the Horizontal Type tool or the Vertical Type tool. Select the type layer in the Layers panel, or click in the text flow to automatically select a type layer. Position the.

Add text to a shape Select the shape. When a shape is selected and you start typing, Visio adds the text to the selected shape. To format the text, you can do either of the following: On the Home tab, in the Font group, set the font characteristics. On the Home tab, in the Paragraph group, set the alignment and other characteristics. Click a blank area on the page or press ESC to finish. Add text to the page You can also add text directly to the page, independent of any shape or object in the drawing. On the Home tab, in the Tools group, click Text. Click anywhere on the page to create a text box, or click and drag to make the text box the size that you want. Edit text Double-click the text that you want to edit. If you are not already zoomed in to the shape, Visio zooms in while you type. When you finish typing, click a blank area on the page or press ESC. Visio zooms back out. To stop Visio from zooming in on your text: Click the File tab, and then click Options. Click the Advanced tab. Under Editing options, in the Automatically zoom text when editing under box, enter 0 zero for the point size. Click the shape to select its text block. If the text is in a group, click to select the group, and then click to select the text in the shape. Drag the text to move the text block. On the Home tab, in the Tools group, click the Pointer Tool. After you switch back to the Pointer Tool, the text keeps the same position relative to the shape. If you use the Pointer Tool to drag the text, the shape will also move, even if the text is no longer on the shape. To move the text independently of the shape, use the Text Block tool. Click the text and drag to move it, or drag the rotation handle to rotate the text. When the pointer is over a rotation handle, it changes to an arrow that forms a circle.

Chapter 2: Add, edit, move, or rotate text in Visio - Visio

Select the "Text" tool and click to place a text box. As long as the text box is open, you're free to edit the text. If you're wondering how to change the color of text in paint, in addition to typing or deleting text, use the settings on the menu bar to edit the text's formatting, such as font, size and color.

Studios often have to edit PDF documents in order to alter a document created by someone else, or to make a last minute change without having to return to the source files. This page explains how to make more complex changes to text and objects using Adobe Creative Suite. The best way to edit a PDF file without actually recreating it from the source files is by using a combination of Acrobat, Illustrator and Photoshop, depending on what you need to do. If you only have Adobe Acrobat your options will be limited, but you can still make simple text and layout changes. As explained in the previous article, below is an example of a simple business card created and opened in InDesign. All the elements on the page have been selected to give you an idea of how it is constructed. The logo top left is an Illustrator EPS file with the text converted to outlines. The red and yellow background boxes and white lines have been created and placed in InDesign. In short, this is a fairly typical, simple layout. The rest of this page will focus on how to edit PDF files in Photoshop and with the help of the remainder of the Creative Suite. Acrobat accesses Illustrator and Photoshop and uses them as super-advanced plug-ins. When you edit an element within a PDF file, Acrobat determines which program will be best to use as the editor, and it calls it up. Otherwise, the best thing to do is to edit the elements using Illustrator, accessed from Acrobat 9 or earlier. To do this, open your PDF file. Without selecting any individual item, right-click anywhere on the page or on the paste board. A dropdown menu will appear. Before making any changes, take a look at how everything is laid out. The first thing to note is that the text is not conveniently arranged in text box blocks. This means that the best way to replace the text is to delete the old and add the new in a wrapping text box. This is just to retain the style. Now type or paste using plain text the revised address over the top. Use the Direct Selection Tool to delete the old text. Position the new text box appropriately: Obviously, whilst in Illustrator you can edit any other elements in the same session if you need to. Please note, however, that if you want to make further edits to the text this will no longer be possible if they have been converted to paths in this way. Make sure you make a copy of the original PDF file before altering it. A warning will appear about flattening images: And then the image will open in Photoshop: The changes are adopted by the PDF file in Acrobat, which you can now save and close. These are the most common and useful methods of editing a PDF file, other than actually recreating the document from scratch.

The Edit Text & Images tool lets you replace, edit, or add text to a PDF. You can correct typos, change fonts and typeface size, adjust alignment, add superscripts or subscripts, and resize text or paragraphs.

This will enable making edits to the actual text, such as adding a word or fixing the spelling of something. You can also change the font and color. Each version of SketchBook has slightly different tools for editing text. Some are more robust than others. Click-drag the opacity slider to change the transparency of a text layer. To set text color, click. Changing the transparency of text In the Layer Editor, tap-drag the slider seen below to increase or decrease layer opacity. Drag up to decrease opacity, making the layer content solid. Drag down to increase opacity, making the layer content more transparent. Use the puck to select a different mode. When rotating or scaling the text, SketchBook uses the center of the text as the pivot point. When scaling text, font size is changed, resulting in no visual quality change. Keep in mind, changes to the size will affect the quality of the image, since you are scaling a rasterized image. This is why we recommend you do it once and do it right, if working in the free version. Chapter 4: Edit text in Photoshop

You edit a PDF one page at a time. For more extensive editing or to make global formatting changes across the entire document, edit the original document. Then edit, and re-create the PDF. Each text box is independent, and inserting text in one text block does not push down an adjacent text box or reflow to the next page. Outlines identify the text and images you can edit. Select the text you want to edit. Edit the text by doing one of the following: Type new text to replace the selected text, or press Delete to remove it. You can create new list items, convert an existing paragraph to a list item, convert an existing list item to a paragraph, and convert from one list type to another. Select a font, font size, or other formatting options under Format in the right pane. You can also use the advanced format options, such as line spacing, character spacing, horizontal scaling, stroke width, and color. Formatting options in the right pane Note: For legal reasons, you must have purchased a font and have it installed on your system to revise text using that font. You can edit text only if the font used for that text is installed on your system. Click outside the selection to deselect it and start over. Add or edit a numbered or bulleted list You can add items to a numbered or bulleted list, create new list items, convert an existing paragraph to a list item, convert an existing list item to a paragraph, and convert from one list type to another. Acrobat detects paragraphs and lists separately. Therefore, both paragraph and list may appear in the same bounding box while editing. After you save or save as the changed file and reopen it, the paragraph and list items are displayed in separate bounding boxes. To add or remove items from a numbered or bulleted list: You can add or remove items to the list at all nested levels using the same familiar controls that you use in MS Office. For example, press Enter at the end of a list item to insert a new row. Press Backspace to remove the new row and position the cursor back to the end of the previous list item. To create a numbered or bulleted list: Place the cursor in the document at the location where you want to add a new list. To convert an existing paragraph to a list item: To convert an existing list item to a paragraph: Select all items in the list. The appropriate list type is highlighted under Format in the right pane. Click the highlighted list type. To convert from one list type to another: Place the cursor in the list item or select all items in the list. Choose the appropriate list type bulleted or numbered under Format in the right pane. You can also use Keyboard to add a list item. Drag to define the width of the text block you want to add. For vertical text, right-click the text box, and choose Make Text Direction Vertical. The Add text tool intelligently detects the following text properties of text close to the point of click: Font name, size, and color Character, paragraph, and line spacing Horizontal scaling These text properties are automatically applied to the text that you add at the point of click. You can change the text properties using the options under Format in the right pane. To resize the text box, drag a selection handle. To move the text box, place the pointer over the line of the bounding box avoid the selection handles. When the cursor changes to Move pointer, drag the box to the new location. To maintain alignment with the other list items, press Shift as you drag. Move, rotate, or resize a text box You can move or rotate text boxes on a page. Edits are confined to the page. You cannot drag a text block to another page, or move or rotate individual characters or words within a text box. However, you can copy text boxes and paste them on another page. Resizing a text box causes the text to reflow within the new text box boundaries. It does not change the size of the text. To change the font size, see Edit or format text in a PDF. As with other text edits, resizing is limited to the current page. Text does not flow to the next page. Click the text box you want to move, rotate, or resize. A bounding box with selection handles surrounds the text box you clicked. Do any of the following: Move Place the pointer over the line of the bounding box avoid the selection handles. When the cursor changes to Move pointer, drag the box to the desired location. Hold down the Shift key as you drag to constrain the movement vertically or horizontally. Rotate Place the pointer just outside a selection handle.

When the cursor changes to the Rotation pointer , drag in the direction you want it to rotate. Resize Place the pointer over a selection handle. When the cursor changes to the Resize pointer , drag the handle to resize the text block. Add, edit, or move text on noninteractive forms or when signing Organizations sometimes provide PDF versions of their paper forms without interactive form fields called "flat forms". Use the Add Text tool on the Comment toolbar to fill in noninteractive forms or to add text to documents you need to sign. Text added with this tool is actually a comment and does not change the original PDF. Click where you want to add text. In the Text Properties toolbar, select the color, font, and font size for the text you want to add. Text Properties toolbar Note: Press Enter to add a second line. Edit text in a noninteractive flat form PDF To change the text properties, select the text you want to edit. Chapter 5: How to Add and Edit Text in Adobe Photoshop

This article is going to teach you how to edit text in Photoshop that is contained as a text layer in your image. If you are working with text that is stored as an image, such as in calendrierdelascience.com, png or a rasterized text layer, then any edits that you make to the text will need to be treated as though the text were actually an image.

However, what makes a Once you do that, you should see a cursor. Click and drag on your canvas where you want your text to appear and draw a bounding box to limit the dimensions of your text. You can then start typing in your text box. You can alter the dimensions of the text box by clicking and dragging any of the anchor points. These strategies and font-pairing tools will help you pick the perfect font pairing for any task. You can also choose the text justification and color. Select the layer of text you want to edit. With the layer selected, you should see all the same text settings listed above in the properties panel. Here, you can access the same settings above, as well as a few others. You can change your leading space between lines of text and kerning space between characters, switch your text to all caps or small caps with the click of a button, and more. For a simple approach, do the following: Select the Text tool from the Tools panel or by using the keyboard shortcut T. In the list of layers in your Layers panel, find the text you want to edit and double-click the large T button. You can then click your cursor in that text to select, delete, or add more text. To move your text, do the following: Select the Move tool from the Tools panel or use the keyboard shortcut V. Click directly on the text on your canvas and drag to move without releasing the mouse. Chapter 6: How to edit text in AutoCAD | HowTech

The simplest way to edit text in images you're using in PowerPoint is simply to overlay text on or near the image. To do this, click the "Insert" tab in the menu and then, in the Text area, click.

If a questioned word is spelled correctly, you can confirm its spelling by adding the word to your personal dictionary. If a questioned word is misspelled, you can correct it. This is the dictionary Photoshop uses to check spelling. Optional Show or unlock type layers. The Check Spelling command does not check spelling in hidden or locked layers. Do one of the following: Select a type layer. To check specific text, select the text. To check a word, place the insertion point in the word. If you selected a type layer and want to check the spelling of only that layer, deselect Check All Layers. As Photoshop finds unfamiliar words and other possible errors, click one of the following: Ignore Continues the spelling check without changing the text. Ignore All Ignores the questioned word during the rest of the spelling check. Change Corrects a misspelling. Make sure that the correctly spelled word is in the Change To text box and click Change. If the suggested word is not the word you want, select a different word in the Suggestions text box or enter the correct word in the Change To text box. Change All Corrects all instances of the misspelling in the document. Make sure the correctly spelled word is in the Change To text box. Add Stores the unrecognized word in the dictionary, so that subsequent occurrences are not flagged as misspellings. Find and replace text Do one of the following: Select the layer containing the text you want to find and replace. Place the insertion point at the beginning of the text you want to search. Select a nontype layer if you have more than one type layer and you want to search all layers in the document. In the Layers panel, make sure the type layers you want to search are visible and unlocked. The Find And Replace Text command does not check spelling in hidden or locked layers. In the Find What box, type or paste the text you want to find. To change the text, type the new text in the Change To text box. Select one or more options to refine your search. Search All Layers Searches all layers in a document. This option is available when a nontype layer is selected in the Layers panel. Forward Searches forward from an insertion point in the text. Deselect this option to search all the text in a layer, regardless of where the insertion point is placed. Case Sensitive Searches for a word or words that exactly match the case of the text in the Find What text box. Click Find Next to begin the search. Click one of the following buttons. Change Replaces the found text with the revised text. To repeat the search, select Find Next. Change All Searches for and replaces all occurrences of the found text. Assign a language for text Photoshop uses language dictionaries to check hyphenation. Language dictionaries are also used to check spelling. Each dictionary contains hundreds of thousands of words with standard syllable breaks. You can assign a language to an entire document or apply a language to selected text. Examples of hyphenation for different languages A. Then enter the text. Some type families include a true expanded font, which is designed with a larger horizontal spread than the plain type style. Scaling distorts the type, so it is generally preferable to use a font that is designed as condensed or expanded, if one is available. Select the characters or type objects you want to change. Rotate type Do the following: To rotate type, select the type layer and use any rotate command or the Free Transform command. For paragraph type, you can also select the bounding box and use a handle to rotate the type manually. Rotated characters appear upright; unrotated characters appear sideways perpendicular to the type line. Original type left and type without vertical rotation right Select the vertical type you want to rotate or unrotate. A check mark indicates that the option is selected. Select the type layer in the Layers panel. Select a type tool, and click the Text Orientation button in the options bar. Choose Change Text Orientation from the Character panel menu. Rasterize type layers Some commands and toolsâ€"such as filter effects and painting toolsâ€"are not available for type layers. You must rasterize the type before applying the command or using the tool. Rasterizing converts the type layer into a normal layer and makes its contents uneditable as text. Some warning messages provide an OK button you can click to rasterize the layer.
