

### Chapter 1 : How I Became a Pirate by Melinda Long | LibraryThing

*Suddenly there are pirate Saturday morning tv shows, an official Talk Like a Pirate Day (September 19), pirate movies making a mil, and pirate picture books. The breathtaking success of Melinda Long's, "How I Became a Pirate" is a little odd, but it couldn't have happened to a nicer story.*

Click here for grade level guidelines. From School Library Journal Long has selected an irresistible combination for this age group-pirates and soccer. Jeremy Jacob is building a sand castle when a pirate ship lands nearby. His parents are preoccupied with other chores, so he takes off for an adventure on the high seas to help the men bury their treasure chest. He tries to teach the pirates to play soccer, at least until the ball gets swallowed by a shark. When a storm hits, forcing the crew to return to shore, Jeremy solves the dilemma of where to bury the treasure-in his own backyard. He even makes it home in time for soccer practice. Either on the first reading, or during a second reading, have the children shout together the words of the pirates. Discussion topics for before reading: What stories do you know about pirates? Why or why not? Do you ever build sandcastles in the sand? Would you be afraid? What do they look like? Why is the captain? What does Jeremy like about dinner on the pirate ship? What sorts of pretend adventures do you have? What do you like to pretend to be? Who do you play pretend games with? Make a pirate flag? Bring ahead your own newspaper. These craft ideas are just suggestions. You can expand upon them, or add your own twist. Remember, though, that the focus of your time should not be on the development and execution of a craft; the focus should be on the read-aloud and the enjoyment of the book!
