Grafton always, always, always describes new characters. If Kinsey is meeting up with someone, she will describe their meeting place: The furnishings were antique: The bathroom was small, the only portion of the house that was fully enclosed. She also describes who she is interacting with: She was slightly shorter than I with wide shoulders and a stocky build, which she managed to minimize by the clothes she wore. Her hair was a reddish blond, a fine flyaway shade much darker at the roots, cut shoulder length and crinkled from a perm. Her face was square, her mouth wide. No one needs thirteen adjectives in one sentence. Someone tell that to E. James The things I liked most from this book was that it was different than what Kinsey usually does. Biography[ edit ] The fictional character Kinsey Millhone was born on May 5, From her Aunt Gin, Kinsey acquired various eccentricities, including a liking for peanut-butter and pickle sandwiches. In high school, Kinsey was a self-described pot-smoking delinquent. After three semesters at the local community college she realized that academic life was not for her and she joined the Santa Teresa police force. Her second husband, Daniel, a struggling musician, appears in E is for Evidence, where he is revealed to be attracted to men.. In most ways, Kinsey is a loner. She has no children and lives in an extremely compact studio apartment converted from a single-car garage. Her landlord is a young-at-heart octogenarian, Henry Pitts, a retired commercial baker who enjoys creating crossword puzzles; Kinsey admits to having a crush on Henry, but also says he is the closest thing she will have to a father. Kinsey has had several relationships in the series, beginning with Charlie Scorsoni, then Jonah Robb, a police officer, and Robert Dietz, another private eye, until the later novels in which she began an affair with longtime friend Cheney Phillips, a police detective. When she met cousins Tasha and Lisa, she realized the three are very similar in appearance. However, she has remained reluctant to become involved with her new-found family, feeling that they abandoned her when she was orphaned.
