The following year, in , the 38th Congress removed the instruction that the institution was to educate the blind, and renamed it the Columbia Institution for the Instruction of the Deaf and Dumb. In , Congress amended the charter of the institution, changing the corporate name to Gallaudet College, which had been the official name of the collegiate department since. He also led the college in developing new departments, especially drama. He directed Gallaudet theater productions, which eventually led to starting the National Theatre of the Deaf. Two houses were used, one purchased and one rented. Superintendent Gallaudet, anticipating the future growth of the school, requested money for more buildings, lamenting the fact that the money was not issued in the year prior, due to federal budget problems. The Second Annual Report was submitted November 5, Gallaudet praised Kendall for donating money needed to construct a new brick building; however, both school buildings were already at capacity. There were 24 deaf students, necessitating a second teacher of the deaf. The teacher of the 6 blind students resigned due to health concerns. Gallaudet reported that the students were safe and free from fear. There were 35 deaf students and 6 blind students in attendance during the academic year. An art teacher was hired for the first time. There were 35 deaf students and 6 blind students. During vacation in August a regiment of troops used the brick building for a hospital, and some of the students who stayed over the summer helped with tending to the sick soldiers. For the first time, Gallaudet proposed expanding the school to create a college for deaf students. Congress provided approval for Columbia to grant college degrees, and an enabling act for the college was passed and approved by President Lincoln. An elaborate inauguration ceremony was held in June with Laurent Clerc in attendance. Fourteen acres of land was purchased with money supplied by the government. Gallaudet was promoted to the position of president of the institution. He continued to push for funds for expansion and new buildings. Gallaudet also proposed discontinuing services for blind students, saying that the small number of blind students would be better served at the school for the blind in Baltimore. Gallaudet asked the government for money to accomplish several projects, including the construction of an ice house and a gas house, sewer lines, and more. Major construction continued on campus. The name of the collegiate department was changed to "National Deaf-Mute College". The blind students were transferred to a school in Baltimore. Gallaudet proposed that a representative of the school be sent to Europe to study the methods employed there, in order to determine which types of instructional methods might be added to those methods already being used successfully at the Columbia Institution and other American schools. Combined enrollment of all levels of instruction, including the collegiate level, exceeded for the first time during this year. There were 25 students enrolled in the college, including students from 14 states of all parts of the Union. Edward Allen Fay joined the faculty as a professor of history, having learned to sign as a child. A mathematics professor was hired for the first time. More money was needed to accommodate additional students expected to swell the ranks of the school. Gallaudet gave a lengthy account of his travels to Europe and was very critical of the extent to which speech is taught to deaf children in European schools for the deaf. Nevertheless, he recommended that a limited amount of speech training be afforded to deaf students in America to those who show they can benefit. His travels took him to: Fourteen schools for the deaf were represented from 22 different states. Gallaudet delivered a eulogy at the board meeting in January The main central building was partially completed, with rooms in the basement and on the first floor first being used. She was told that deaf women could not enter the institution. In Gallaudet agreed to allow women to apply with the intent that women would not stay. Temporary living arrangements were made and the college remained co-educational. Deaf President Now Student strikes at Gallaudet University starting March 6, , revolutionized the perception and education of Deaf culture. Deaf students were outraged at the selection of another hearing president, Elisabeth Zinser; the university had never selected a deaf person for this position. Alumni, faculty, staff, and students demanded

that the next president of the university be deaf. After a week of protest and activism, Zinser resigned and was replaced by I. Unity for Gallaudet Movement [edit] Main article: This was met with protests from the student body, both in person on campus and in internet blogs and forums. Fernandes, appointed to serve as president-designate until Jordan retired, said that she would not step down. On May 8, the faculty gave a vote of no confidence for Fernandes. When the fall academic year resumed, some students, faculty, staff, and alumni continued their protest, calling for Fernandes to step down and for the presidential search to be done again. On October 11, a group of protesting students shut down the campus. On October 16 at a regularly scheduled meeting, faculty members voted to 24 to block Fernandes from becoming president of Gallaudet University. The difference between Genesis 2 and Acts 2 is that Genesis 2 comes before the fall of man; Acts 2 comes after the fall. The church in Acts is not perfect; it is simply pursuing the right things. The honeymoon is a wonderful time, and we should enjoy it while we can, but life does go on from there. To use one last analogy, two of my married daughters are pregnant. Both have gotten sonograms and have come home with pictures of the child in their womb. The doctor has told both our daughters that their child is perfect. That means that they are in good health, but they are not fully developed. They do not yet have all the necessary hardware to survive. They must continue to develop and to mature. That is what the church is like in Acts 2: It is a wonderful church, populated with a very large number of new Christians. Only members of this church of 3, have trusted in Jesus for a longer period of time. The church is not perfect, but it does exist, and it is moving in the right direction. Nevertheless, we need to be aware of some ways in which the church has not come to maturity. Later on, we see that the church gathered weekly see Acts This church seems almost totally dependent upon the apostles Acts 2: Later on, we will see elders and deacons and a diversity of spiritually gifted people functioning as a body. Here we read of the saints selling their possessions and laying the proceeds at the feet of the apostles Acts 2: Later on, people will set money aside on the first day of the week, as they are able 1 Corinthians Evangelism is certainly taking place, but most of this seems to occur through the preaching of the apostles. It seems obvious that there is no formal missions program. The church in Jerusalem will never really be a missionary church, like Antioch will be Acts The church in Jerusalem was a Jewish church. There may have been some proselytes, but can you imagine what would have happened if some Gentile saint showed up to one of their common meals with a bacon and tomato sandwich? There was no such thing yet as church discipline it first appears in Acts 5. The saints in Jerusalem did not yet grasp the fact that the church was to be made up of Jewish and Gentile saints who are now one in Christ Ephesians 2 and 3. Gentiles would be added after the death of Stephen, when the gospel was taken to Samaria Acts 8. Gentile evangelism would occur in Acts 10 and 11, and especially in chapter 13 and beyond. Right now, the church is not ready to embrace Gentiles. In Acts 15, we will read about the Jerusalem Council and its watershed decision regarding the alleged necessity of circumcision. The church was respected and esteemed. As said previously, this is not a perfect church, nor is it a fully mature church. The Structure of Our Text Acts 2: Verse 42 lists four of the activities to which the church devoted itself; verses serve to further define these four activities. The Activities of a Healthy Church The four activities of the earliest church are introduced to us as priorities of the church. These are the four things to which these saints devoted themselves. These were not options. These were the fruit of a genuine conversion and of life in Christ. No doubt there would be a good deal of emphasis on the fact that the saving work of Jesus was the fulfillment of many Old Testament prophecies. Jesus had to be rejected, crucified, buried, and raised from the dead. We should bear in mind that the apostles still had a great deal to grasp themselves. It is apparent from Acts 10 and 11 that Peter did not understand that God had set aside the old Jewish food laws as per Mark 7: The issue of circumcision and law-keeping for Gentiles was to be tackled in chapter 15 the Jerusalem Council. Many points of theology were yet to be defined and refined in the centuries to come. Reverential awe came over everyone, and many wonders and miraculous signs came about by the apostles Acts 2: Just a short while before, Peter had reminded his audience that the teaching of Jesus had been divinely accredited by the Father: We see evidence of this in the Gospel of Mark: A new teaching with authority! Jesus did not merely speak as though He had authority; Jesus spoke with authority. His words of teaching were emphatically underscored by the miraculous works God did through Him. The same kinds of miracles were now being accomplished by the apostles Acts 2: These miracles, performed by the hands of the apostles, served to accredit the apostles as those who spoke for God with full authority: It was first communicated through the Lord and was confirmed to us by those who heard him, 4 while God confirmed their witness with signs and wonders and various miracles and gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to his will Hebrews 2: One can hardly over-emphasize the importance of sound, biblical teaching. The Word of God is the foundation and starting point for every aspect of the Christian life. The Christian should not only seek to actively partner with fellow-believers, but he should also guard against partnering with those outside the faith. Thus, the Christian should not be unequally partnered with unbelievers in Christian endeavors 2 Corinthians 6: We should not support or welcome those who preach a false gospel 2 John And we should not become partners with the immature and untested individuals who fall because we have prematurely laid hands on them by appointing them to the office of deacon â€" 1 Timothy 5: Contribute to the needs of the saints, pursue hospitality Romans Now the one who receives instruction in the word must share all good things with the one who teaches it Galatians 6: And as you Philippians know, at the beginning of my gospel ministry, when I left Macedonia, no church shared with me in this matter of giving and receiving except you alone Philippians 4: While the actual term is not used here, we see a further example of this kind of koinonia fellowship in Acts 4: The proceeds were distributed to each, as anyone had need. There is only one who is good. But if you want to enter into life, keep the commandments. What do I still lack? Then come, follow me. I am not suggesting that every Christian should follow the example of the early church in Jerusalem. Breaking bread is not always a reference to the observance of Communion, however. The expression may simply refer to the eating of a meal: After he said this, Paul took bread and gave thanks to God in front of them all, broke it, and began to eat Acts One should observe that in this instance Luke is describing what took place when Paul and many others were caught in a devastating storm. This is certainly not a Communion service! Then he left Acts Given the fact that this expression can be used with somewhat different meanings, we must ask what sense Luke intends for us to understand it in Acts 2: Every day they continued to gather together by common consent in the temple courts, breaking bread from house to house, sharing their food with glad and humble hearts Acts Even if Communion was observed, this is not what Luke wanted to emphasize. The sharing of a meal was perhaps the most intimate form of fellowship one could have with fellow believers. In the ancient near eastern world, when a guest was invited to a meal with his host, it was incumbent on the host to provide protection for this guest. This partly explains the actions of Lot when the men of Sodom want to do harm to his guests Genesis The eating of a meal is also used as a description of our fellowship with God: You refresh my head with oil; my cup is full of wine. I tell you the truth, he will dress himself to serve, have them take their place at the table, and will come and wait on them! Two clarifications help us identify that to which Luke is referring in Acts 2: I am therefore inclined to think that Luke is telling us that in its very early days the saints in Jerusalem diligently persisted in the observance of the stipulated times of Jewish prayer at the temple. These were newly-saved Jewish believers who were just beginning to grasp the significance of the things they had done as Old Testament Jews, even though they were unbelievers at the time: This text has been used by many including me to describe the essential functions of a church. If we are doing all these things, then we feel that we are obedient. Worse yet, we may even be proud that we are so biblical. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus condemned charity, prayer, and fasting that was done in the wrong spirit, and for the wrong reasons Matthew 6: Very impressive works were claimed by people whom our Lord said He never knew: Go away from me, you lawbreakers!
