The focus is mainly on writing, but there are other activities scheduled, including sightseeing and cooking classes. While these retreats specialize in instructing first-time writers, they are open to writers of all levels, and can cater to different needs. The beautiful cabins where the residents stay are on Whidbey Island in Washington State. Hedgebrook is best suited to experienced writers or those who have a significant work in progress, as the application process is competitive. However, the retreats and residencies are open to women artists of all genres who are committed to feminism and social justice. Participants are hosted in Hopscotch House, a renovated old farmhouse on a acre property, a classic Kentucky ranch. Fundraising for the construction of the six properties is ongoing, but Storyknife hosted its first writer-in-residence in The retreat property is located in Homer, Alaska, and come with gorgeous mountain views. As this retreat is not yet fully operational, no costs have been announced yet. Whatever your motivations for seeking out a writing retreat, you will likely find one that suits your needs.
