Apart from being the last island in the 1, mile 1, kilometer long Aleutian Islands chain, Attu is also distinct in that it is the location of the only land-based conflict on American soil in all of World War II. Monuriki has now become a popular tourist destination due to its appearance in the film. Its entire coastline consists of steep cliffs, making boat landings impossible. The island is now classified as a nature reserve, requiring United States government permission which is rarely granted to enter. Navassa is also one of the few United States territorial disputes – it is also claimed by Haiti. Due to the danger of polar bears, whenever one travels anywhere on Spitsbergen outside of Longyearbyen, one is required by law to carry a rifle. Spitsbergen is also the location of the Svalbard Global Seed Vault, where a variety of plant seeds are stored for safekeeping to preserve biodiversity in case of any kind of large-scale disaster. The rest is owned by the United States federal government and is administered by its Fish and Wildlife Service. Palmyra is staffed by a small group of government scientists and Nature Conservancy volunteers for preservation and research. Like many small Pacific islands, it was claimed by the United States and mined for its guano deposits. There was also an attempt at colonization, but it was interrupted by World War II, when Howland was attacked by Japanese bombers the day after Pearl Harbor was bombed, killing two of the colonists and requiring the other two to be evacuated. No further attempt at colonization was made after the war. It is the last remaining British overseas territory in the Pacific. Pitcairn Island, with only fifty or so inhabitants, is the least populous and most remote jurisdiction in the world being some miles, or kilometers, west of Chile. All of its inhabitants are descendants of the mutineers from the HMS Bounty and the Polynesians who accompanied them. The burned wreckage of the Bounty is still visible under the waters of Bounty Bay. Pitcairn makes what is supposedly some of the best honey in the world, so much so that even the Queen has praised its virtues. If you decide to buy some through their web site, though, be prepared for a long wait. Pitcairn has no airport, and Bounty Bay is small and shallow, so the island is visited and supplied only occasionally. Mail deliveries can be months apart. I ordered some honey myself about two or three months ago and am told that it will still be about another month before it even gets off the island. Pitcairn is unique in quite a few other ways as well, so much so that I had a hard time deciding which ones to include and which to leave out! It is almost completely covered with ice. Most of the coastline consists of very steep cliffs, making landings difficult. Bouvet was originally a British territory, but Britain waived its claim and ceded the island to Norway, which maintains it today as a nature preserve. Bouvet has never been inhabited and almost certainly never will be, but it still has its own top-level Internet domain name,. The nearest land, Queen Maud Land in Antarctica, lies some 1, miles 1, kilometers to the south. Adventure travelers and amateur radio operators using the island-specific prefix 3Y therefore like to travel there. It is about 28 square miles 72 square kilometers and is completely forested, with the exception of the thin strips of beach that encircle most of it. Between their active isolationism and the difficulty of observing the island from the air, almost nothing is known of the Sentinelese – their language, culture, and even an accurate estimation of their numbers are all unknown. North Sentinel Island is technically part of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Union Territory, but in practice, the local government has said that they intend to leave the island to its inhabitants, making it de facto autonomous.

It was once the site of a chemical weapons plant, turning out poison gas for the Japanese Imperial Army from to The Allied Occupation Forces dismantled the plant and let laboratory animals go free hence the rabbits. Tourists take the ferry to the island to interact with the friendly rabbits more than to see the museum. The cold climate and harsh winds make the islands too inhospitable a place to live. It is known for numerous shipwrecks and deaths, some from trying to survive on the islands, despite supplies being left there in castaway huts, as seen in the photograph. At its height, Hashima Island had over residents , densely packed into large apartment blocks. When the coal business fizzled, those buildings were left empty and derelict. It became dangerous to even set foot on the island. However, the uninhabited island was opened to tourism in The site was selected because experience showed that a defensive fort built too close to a city created more problems than it solved. The artificial island was built under the supervision of a young Robert E. The fort was still incomplete by the time the Civil War began. The fort was modernized, but not in time to be of much use during the Spanish-American War. Every time the fort was slowly modernized, it became obsolete again. By , the army had abandoned Fort Carroll for good. The island was sold to a private developer in , but various plans to use it proved too difficult and expensive to carry out. The fort remains, though slowly crumbling into ruin. It was a monastery in medieval times, then in was designated as a quarantine area for any ships approaching Venice, to protect the city from the plague. This continued until the 18th century, when the quarantine facilities were abandoned, and the Lazzaretto Nuovo eventually became a military base. The Italian Army abandoned the site in , and it suffered years of neglect. Then community efforts turned it into a cultural museum site, now supported by the Italian Ministry of Arts and Culture. The island is now open for tourism. Tourists can visit the island with permission, but the only inhabitants are military troops who are stationed there temporarily. However, as isolated as it is, it is officially uninhabited and unorganized. The atoll now is administered by the U. Fish and Wildlife agency, with the exception of Cooper Island, which is owned by the Nature Conservancy. Palmyra Atoll was the setting for a double murder in which became the basis for the novel and then miniseries called *And the Sea Will Tell*. The island has a population of about people and contains modern day conveniences such a satellite internet connection and an airstrip. Real uninhabited islands can still be found however and will continue to inspire writers, movie makers and bloggers. Traces of a Polynesian settlement, possibly dating to the 13th century, have been found by archaeologists on Enderby Island. This is the most southerly settlement by Polynesians ever discovered. The uninhabited islands were rediscovered in by a whaling vessel, who found them deserted. Ang Thong translates as bowl of gold, while Mu Ko simply means group of islands. Most of the limestone islands are covered with tropical forest and rise from the sea as dramatic rock cliffs and bizarre rock formations. Exploring the white sand beaches and snorkeling among the shallow coral gardens makes a popular day trip from Ko Samui. All of the islands are uninhabited and undeveloped except for Ko Paluay, an island inhabited by sea-gypsies who still earn a living from fishing. The first successful climb to the summit was made in by a team of Australian climbers. A year before, another team of rock climber rediscovered the Lord Howe Island stick insect thought to be extinct. This jungle-covered island is mostly uninhabited. Tourists are only allowed ashore with permission from the Costa Rican Park Rangers which are the only people who are allowed to live on the island. Cocos Island is popular as a dive destination but people also come here to go treasure hunting. Several hidden treasures are supposed to have been buried here by pirates in the 19th century including the Inca gold from Lima that was taken by pirate Benito Bonito. This isolated location has a vast array of undisturbed and pristine eco-systems. The coral reefs and bird populations are virtually untouched by man. The islands are one of the most popular Fiji vacation destinations with beautiful island resorts and white sand beaches. Several Mamanuca Islands are uninhabited, usually because there is no natural source of water, The most famous uninhabited island in the group is tiny Monuriki which was the main location for the film *Cast Away* and not ironically on *Castaway Island*. The long rugged island is covered with pristine lowland rainforest and fringed with coral reefs. For reasons still unknown the island was abandoned almost years ago and the descendents live on other parts of the Solomon Islands. They have formed an association to take care of Tetepare leaving it in its original state and allowing tourists to visit the island. Only islands are inhabited by local Maldivian people while only 5 islands have a population of more than 3, Of the remaining islands, 88 have been developed as tourist resorts and the others are uninhabited. It is the second largest Atoll in the world after Kiritimati. The islands are for the most part uninhabited, and are famous for their beaches, blue lagoons and the peculiar shapes of many of the islands.
