He applied for and was granted advanced training on multi-engine aircraft. Stewart was posted to nearby Mather Field to instruct in both single- and twin-engine aircraft. The short recruitment film *Winning Your Wings* appeared in movie theaters nationwide beginning in late May and was very successful, resulting in , new recruits. Instead, he was assigned in early to an operational training unit, the 29th Bombardment Group at Gowen Field , Boise, Idaho , as an instructor. However, a rumor that Stewart would be taken off flying status and assigned to making training films or selling bonds called for immediate action, because what he dreaded most was "the hope-shattering spectre of a dead end". After several weeks of training missions, in which Stewart flew with most of his combat crews, the group flew its first combat mission on December 13, , to bomb the U-boat facilities at Kiel , Germany , followed three days later by a mission to Bremen. Stewart led the high squadron of the group formation on the first mission, and the entire group on the second. On March 30, , he was sent to RAF Old Buckenham to become group operations officer of the rd Bombardment Group , a new B unit that had just lost both its commander and operations officer on missions. As a staff officer, Stewart was assigned to the rd "for the duration" and thus not subject to a quota of missions of a combat tour. His official tally of mission credits while assigned to the th and rd Bomb Groups was 20 sorties. Stewart continued to go on missions uncredited, flying with the pathfinder squadron of the th Bombardment Group , with his two former groups and with groups of the 20th Combat Bomb Wing. He also was awarded the Air Medal with three oak leaf clusters. Stewart served in a number of staff positions in the 2nd and 20th Bomb Wings between July and the end of the war in Europe, and was promoted to full colonel on March 29, . During the course of World War II he rose to the rank of colonel, first as an instructor at home in the United States, and later on combat missions in Europe. He remained involved with the United States Air Force Reserve after the war and retired in as a brigadier general. While always gracious with his fans, he was always very protective of his privacy. A notable example of this occurred when a nervy family of tourists set up a picnic on his front lawn. Stewart came out of his house and, without uttering a word, turned on the sprinklers. Steven Spielberg , who was in attendance, said that he was humbled to even be in the same room as Jimmy, because he respected him so much. While filming *The Big Sleep* in August , Stewart appeared to be much older than his actual age of 69 at the time as the rich, wheelchair-bound General Sternwood. The fact is that he had a hearing impairment, and he was having memory problems, which caused him to keep flubbing his lines. It is believed that these health problems brought about his retirement from films shortly afterwards, although he was also concerned with the violence and explicit sexual content of modern films, and he saw no future for himself in the movie business. Upon his death on July 2, , a small group of fans and admirers placed a few items on his Hollywood star, not the least of which was a rather tall although not six feet tall plush rabbit wearing overalls. It was reportedly stolen later in the night. His jazz and blues piano-playing skills were showcased in *Anatomy of a Murder* . After making *The Magic of Lassie* , Stewart went into semi-retirement from acting. During the next few years he suffered from many health problems including heart disease, skin cancer, deafness, and senility. *The Spirit of St. Louis* at 69, Mr. By the late s, he reported that his weight was up to pounds. Thereafter, he spent most of his time in his bedroom, coming out only at the insistence of his housekeeper for his meals.
