Preventive efforts should not skate just to where the problem is at the moment but should also try to anticipate where the outbreak is headed. Given that recent epidemiological evidence shows that gay men are at a higher risk of hepatitis A infection than the general population, it would not be an unreasonable approach to double down on education and vaccination efforts in this demographic group, Schooley said. The idea was already on the mind of Dr. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued a brief on an outbreak among gay men in New York that has now reached 51 patients. Fifteen of the 32 men who were infected had sex with other men. So far, he said, out of the cases confirmed so far, only eight gay men have had outbreak-linked hepatitis A infections. Though the teams work in largely the same way they always have, approaching small groups of people in bars, clubs and city sidewalks, a hepatitis A flier was added early this summer as the outbreak grew. Family Health Centers was already offering hepatitis A vaccinations to any gay man who arrived in any of its medical offices, and that has been the case for many years, he said. He speculated that maybe the reason the outbreak has not yet appeared to any large degree among gay men is because vaccination efforts have been underway for many years. Family Health, which offers a range of services to nearly, uninsured, low income and underserved patients each year, operates 21 clinics throughout San Diego and has screened 12, patients for hepatitis A since Aug. Nearly 9,, she said, have received at least one shot and the interest in vaccination has picked up recently. Low-income, disabled seniors at Praxis community in Deerfield Beach are struggling without power and medication after Hurricane Irma swept through South Florida.
