

Chapter 1 : 5 ways men should man up and lead their families | TheBlaze

The main idea of this practical and insightful book is simply this--the key to extended, fruitful, and enjoyable pastor-church relationship is an expanded knowledge of the pastor by the church. Knowing his personality, his responsibilities, and even his struggles, can result in an enhanced ministry.

This is a wise question because if you are off by a few degrees at the start and you travel that path for a while, you will be off by miles later. I know that from experience. And it is better to learn sooner than later. So here are the 10 things not necessarily in any particular order that I thought my new Christian friend should sink deep into his heart, head and hands as he travels his first year with Jesus: The one thing that the Bible emphasizes more than us loving God and people is that God loves us. He loves us first and most. He cannot not love you Rom. Your motivation to and the purpose of learning, serving, worshipping, giving, reaching, reading, praying, etc. You not only are saved by grace, but you grow by it, too. This is a false equation: New and enthusiastic Christians often do this. Instead, lead people to Jesus by loving people to Jesus 1 Cor. If they ask you why you live the way you do, humbly and simply share with them why you put your hope in Jesus. Love your neighborsâ€”your literal neighborsâ€”the ones you have, not the ones you wish you had. Do this because you are a Christian, not just because you want them to be Christians. Focus on Jesus, His cross, His resurrection and His kingdom. When you confessed Jesus as the living Lord and Messiah, you never saidâ€”and will never sayâ€”anything more meaningful. Jesus is God with skin. They were mere men; Jesus is God who became a man. He is the center and circumferenceâ€”the hub and rim of all of life and creation. They may not think they are the only Christians, but they do think they are the best or most right ones. This is a prideful and sinful attitude that grieves Jesus and dismembers His body. Strive for unity in the body of Christ by praying humbly and thankfully for other Christians. Pray with your Bible open. There are many different spiritual exercises fasting, solitude, serving, etc. Prayerfully read about the beginning of the church in a book called Acts. Prayerfully read some letters written by Christians for Christiansâ€”some good ones to start with are James, Philippians and Ephesians. Find a Christian mentor. You will need help and encouragement in this journey with Jesus. Ask an older Christian of the same gender as you to mentor you. Look for someone who displays the attitudes and actions that were described above. Be a blessing to them in return. But new Christians will learn new things. Some of those things will be true but not important. Some things will be off by degrees that can lead them astray. Other things will be just plain wrong. Help new Christians learn to follow Jesus by being their best at what matters most to Him.

The Money in the Church Who has control over monies coming into the church? Thank you for the question. However, I have to admit that this is a difficult question from a "thus saith the Lord" vantage point. I know of no absolute statements on the control of money in the church in scripture. Much of the structure of our churches has been established by man. The Bible gives certain guidelines and then leaves many of the details of church organization to us. However, as in all things, the scripture has some precepts that should guide our decisions. That is where we will look. Order Paul sent Titus to the churches of Crete to "set in order the things that are wanting" Titus 1: Of the order of worship and the work of the ministry, Paul would have "all things be done decently and in order" 1 Corinthians This shows me that a church should have an established procedure for the control of monies in the church. The controls do not belong to whoever shows up first, has the most muscle, or bluffs his or her way through. The church is a group of baptized believers who have joined together for the purpose of accomplishing the work of God on this earth. Traditionally, the church has been looked on as a covenanted body of people. That is, they have joined together in agreement and those who join them later are coming in agreement with earlier policies. Therefore, they should have established policies and procedures for the handling of monies. These procedures may differ from church to church since the Bible does not spell these things out in detail. But there is no excuse for no established procedures. That is not decent or in order. Leadership The church is set up by God to have leaders. They are said to "rule" the church. Of the bishop or pastor, Paul said, "For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God? Peter commands the elders to "feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof" 1 Peter 5: These verses teach that the leadership of the church has rule over the church. My father in the ministry, Luther Adkins, used to tell me that whoever controls the money in an organization controls the organization. Now, I am not advocating absolute, unchallenged control of the money by the pastor and other leaders without any safeguards. However, there is certainly nothing in the Bible that teaches any form of democracy in church spending. I have heard too many stories of the messes caused by everyone voting on practically every item. If the leadership is dishonest or foolish, it can mean much pain for the church. But churches that are run by vote are brought down to the vision of the average member. In most churches, that is dangerous as well. There must be a balance and this leads to the next two precepts. Integrity I partially quoted 1Peter 5: Here are verses 2 and 3 in entirety: They are not to get a kick out of calling the shots. Their desire is the good of the people. This is similar to the relationship of the husband and the wife. It is true that the husband can make final decisions in the household and the wife is commanded to submit. However, the godly husband is to love his wife like Christ loved the church. Therefore, he should put her first in all his decisions. So, although he is given the authority to make the decision, it is not to be made for his own benefit, but for the primary benefit of his wife and family. The pastor is in a similar situation. He is given much authority in the leadership of the church. However, he is never to be led by his own ambitions or needs. The needs of the church should always be first. That is why one of the qualification of a pastor is that he be "not greedy of filthy lucre" 1Timothy 3: If he has any serious problems with money, he should never be put in as pastor of a church. Accountability 2 Corinthians, chapters eight and nine, deals with an offering being taken up for the needs of the believers in other parts. Right in the midst of these instructions about money, Paul states, "Providing for honest things, not only in the sight of the Lord, but also in the sight of men" 2 Corinthians 8: Here, Paul emphasizes the importance of dealing with church money in a way that is appears honest, not only in the sight of the Lord, but also in the sight of men. The handling of monies must be open and aboveboard. There must be accountability for the funds. If this is not done, it will result in distrust and anger--even if nothing specifically wrong has been done. We need honest accountability in our churches. Conclusion If the precepts defined above are followed, there can still be variations from one church to another. Some churches give greater control to the pastor and leadership; some balance the control with frequent votes on expenditures.

The Bible does not give answers to all of these questions. Remember, the church covenants together. These things should be settled before the questions arise. At least, I hope it helps to see some of the biblical precepts involved.

I know that God does not call every man to marriage, but for the many that he does, it is a good thing that they find a godly wife. Outside of salvation in Jesus Christ, a godly wife brings more joy and happiness to a man than anything else on earth. She is far more precious than jewels. The heart of her husband trusts in her, and he will have no lack of gain. What man does not want to find that? A woman that he can trust with every ounce of his being. But where does a man begin if he wants to find a woman like that? Where does he start to begin the search for a woman of such value? By no means is this list exhaustive, nor are these necessarily in order of importance, although the first one is. Before a man finds a godly woman, he first finds the living God. He begins to long to glorify Jesus Christ with his life and sees Christ as infinitely valuable and worth all of his time and energy 1 Corinthians A godly woman will not settle for anything less! She wants a man that could be a spiritual leader for her, a man that she can respect 1 Peter 3: If you are seeking your validity or worth in a woman, you will not find a godly woman, because you will be looking for qualities that the world esteems rather than the qualities that God esteems. Seek the Lord in prayer and ask him to bring you a godly woman. It is OK to do that. Also, pray for wisdom and discernment. God is more than willing to give that to you as well if you will ask him for it James 1: Also, start praying for your future wife. Pray for her protection and her own growth in godliness. You will read passages like Proverbs 31 and Titus 2 , and you will see and learn about what God considers to be a godly woman. A vision for what type of woman God is leading you to will begin to form in your mind as you listen to the Word of God. And by joining a church, I mean a church where the Word is taught as the inerrant and infallible Word of God, where the Word is taught and preached, where the Gospel of Jesus Christ is cherished, and where people are on mission to bring the Gospel to the world. Also, this should be obvious, but church is where the godly women are! If you want to see a football game, you go to the football stadium. If you want to find a godly girl, go to a church. She wants to join a man on mission that is doing something with his life. She wants to be a part of something special. It is your job to figure out what this is. What are you to do with your life? Where are you to go? How are you going to invest in building the kingdom of God? She wants to marry a hard worker whom she can respect. He will stand before kings; he will not stand before obscure men. Take ownership and pride in your work and work hard. Strive to become the best at what you do. Instead, develop appropriate friendships with Christian women in the context of service in the church. A godly woman wants to first see your godly character on display before she wants to trust you emotionally and romantically in a serious relationship. Before you ask a girl out you should know something of her character and her godliness. You will most likely meet a godly girl at church or serving at another Christian organization or institution. They have seen more, experienced more, and most importantly have walked with God longer than you have. They will be able to invest in your life and impart wisdom to you in ways that your peers cannot. Also, more often than not, older, godly men are married to older, godly women, who know and are mentoring young, godly women. See where I am going with this? Even with everything that has happened, people still love priests and the priesthood. The reason for this is that they love Jesus and they know that the priesthood is the way that Jesus has chosen to stay with them. They will treat you accordingly. This is a beautiful thing and it should be a cause of great joy for you to see how devoted the people still are to their priests. It is very critical to remember, however, that Jesus and the sacraments are the reason people are treating you so differently, not because of your awesome personal accomplishments, and certainly not because you are actually better than them in any way. This reality will hit you very hard pretty early on, and may cause some struggle because you know your own interior life and you know what a miserable sinner you still are. This is a good thing, and you should be very concerned for your spiritual health if it ever completely stops bothering you. You are still you, warts and all. With that in mind, be aware that people are going to treat you as if a You have no faults or sins, b You are an expert in all matters spiritual and doctrinal especially moral! Hopefully, you have enough self-knowledge to realize that none of these are reality. It goes without saying that without constant self-checks and being committed to holding nothing back from your spiritual director, any one of these things will be poison to your soul if you start to believe your own hype. The last of those three things deserves more attention. Because you have made a temporary commitment to celibacy which is definitely a good thing , women in your life will suddenly see you as emotionally available and eminently trustworthy with their intimate feelings. Be very, very careful here. Regarding interactions with the opposite sex, I would recommend being very diligent in paying attention to the what your actions tell you in terms of your commitment to celibacy. If you have cultivated a relationship with someone that is starting to cross some boundaries even just emotionally you need to bring that to your director. Failure to do so is a recipe for a spiritual and potentially, moral, disaster. And I do mean pretty much all the same sins. Perhaps the fact that some of the them are happening inside the Church makes them worse or more scandalous, but the reality is what it is. I think a lot of young men enter seminary with the expectation that they will suddenly stop struggling with the sins of their past and that everyone else there will be very pious and virtuous. However, you will also meet men who are bishops, or priests, or who are about to be priests whom you know because of your proximity to their lives to be at least as flawed and sinful as you are. Realizing and accepting this is not necessarily a bad thing, in fact it can be an opportunity for great spiritual maturation. You will be forced to separate your notion of the holiness of the Church and of the Priesthood from the holiness or lack thereof in the individuals who occupy the Church, even at the highest levels of authority. For that reason, it can also be one of the greatest opportunities for growth available. You will experience the dissonance between the things that people say about the Church from the outside and the things you know to be true on the inside. Faith tells us that Jesus is in charge of His Church and nothing can stop it from enduring. You will be made to cling to this truth in a new way when you go to seminary. Something I found in seminary was that not only was I taught methods and forced into habits of prayer that were totally new, but I found myself impelled by the difficulty of the situations I faced, and simply by taking my discernment seriously, into praying with greater fervor and intensity than I ever had before. This is true especially if your seminary offers a Spirituality Year and a long Ignatian retreat as mine did. With this great gift, however, comes the great responsibility of remaining mindful that this spiritual gift is especially for you, here and now in your life. God neither expects nor wants all of the faithful to have the same kind of prayer life and practices that you are building. Conclusion Overall, seminary can be a great time of grace and maturing as a Christian man. The best advice I think I can give to anyone planning to go to seminary is to keep your grasp on reality.

Let me give you some reasons why and how he is dangerous: This means that being a disciple is being one who is always learning. Therefore, to have it all figured out is to deny who you are. As Christians, we have to be people who are learning; this includes everyone from pastors to children. He Is Critical If this guy is not being moved by the ministry of the Word, he is likely gathering bullets to shoot at leaders. He sits quietly during the sermons and teachings only to pick apart everything like a Monday morning quarterback. His unteachability looks the exact opposite of what James 1 teaches: Know this, my beloved brothers: Please note this is not a repudiation of constructive criticism. This is desperately needed. There is a difference between constructive and destructive criticism, however.

Chapter 6 : The Inside Scoop on Seminary: 3 Things You Should Know Before Entering | ChurchPOP

You will experience the dissonance between the things that people say about the Church from the outside and the things you know to be true on the inside. Faith tells us that Jesus is in charge of His Church and nothing can stop it from enduring.

Are we to be faithful to the local church "first"? For example, if you wish to visit a different church one Sunday, people will tell you that your first commitment must be to your home church. Or do these people make the local church a bigger deal than it really is? Are we required to be faithful TO our local church or faithful IN our local church? I even heard one pastor say that people who only attend Sunday morning services, but not Sunday night and mid-week services, are not really saved. What he conveniently forgot to mention was that many of those folk who are in church all the time are not really spiritual, but rather use the local church as a substitute for personal devotion. Do these pastors really want people to study the Word for themselves, or are they threatened by believers who are too knowledgeable? Do they really want their church folk to have close relationships with God, or do they just want them to attend services? Do they really want their members to do real Christian ministry, or do they just want them to get involved in the local church programs? Are they more faithful to the local church than to the kingdom of God universal church? First of all, faithfulness is a Christian virtue. In fact it is one of the fruit of the Spirit Galatians 5: Believers are required to be faithful, period. But you need to know exactly what people mean when they make the above statements. When many people say those things, what they really mean is that you must be a regular attendant at church services, and that you must be a regular partaker in many of the church programs and activities. Many churches are just social organizations and middle class country clubs. And what we call fellowship are just social gatherings. Is that what we are called to be faithful to? And what the Bible calls fellowship is much more than the social gatherings over pot-luck lunches that we are accustomed to today. However, the Bible does address the local church, especially in the pastoral epistles of Paul – the ones to Timothy and Titus. If a man desires the position of a bishop, he desires a good work. Titus 1:5 For this reason I left you in Crete, that you should set in order the things that are lacking, and appoint elders in every city as I commanded you – 6 if a man is blameless, the husband of one wife, having faithful children not accused of dissipation or insubordination. In 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1, Paul discusses the requirements of those who would be bishops and deacons. Whatever name you give to church positions today, they can generally be classified as bishops and deacons. The latter refers to those with physical ministries, e. Among the qualities listed are: Am I saying that believers should not be faithful in their local church? But we have to be careful to distinguish between what is in the Bible and what are man-made rules. Their pastors are required to attend every single meeting. Many of them have to balance secular jobs with their pastorates, and still find time to attend all of those boring meetings. This is the last thing that Paul intended when he penned 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1. Paul even said that if a man was found not to be a good leader in his home, he should not be leading the people of God. This applied to both bishops and deacons. Do I have anything against divorced people? All I am saying is that we have our priorities mixed up because we value our traditions above the word of God. Some people today spend most of their free time inside the local church, while family life spends most of its time in the gutter. This is not what Jesus had in mind when he founded the church. The family has a higher status in the plan of God than does the local church. If pastors would devote more time to developing family life, especially equipping men to lead their families in bible study and prayer, that would do a lot more for the church in the long run. There, I said it! Here is my stupid advice to any single person wanting help to prepare them for married life. Find a family that is not strong in the Lord, and conduct occasional bible studies and prayer with them. See what that accomplishes. If I read my Bible correctly, true ministry is more outside of the local church than inside. True ministry is in our every day lives, less so within our local church walls. It is important to have spiritual authority over us, e. That is crucial to our spiritual growth and development. We should be careful not to get so suckered into local church activities, that they distract us from the real ministry at hand. Balance is the key.

Having no organization and no resources but their faith in the promises of Jesus Christ, these first-century citizens of Palestine were charged by our Lord to do the impossible “ go evangelize the world. What an awesome task “ what an awesome responsibility! But each one of the eleven, with the later addition of two more, served their Master nobly, fulfilling his command and dedicating their lives, and the lives of their families, to bringing the gospel of Christ to the nations. And the charge now comes down through the centuries to us. We must evangelize the world. We must not allow our friends and loved ones, nor strangers afar, to pass from this world without hearing the good news “ that Jesus will save them from their sins. So, are you an evangelist? He would provide whatever was needed for the task at hand. He was commanding him to go. It is expected that you will be an evangelist. It refers to one who proclaims the good message, a gospel herald. Often, the term is used in the New Testament in a restricted sense “ equivalent to a gospel preacher, a minister cf. In this sense, a woman cannot serve as an evangelist 1 Cor. But in a general use of the term, any person, male or female, who brings the gospel to others through various means, is an evangelist. And every Christian should be involved, in some way, in spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ through evangelism. The Reward of Evangelism Within twenty-four hours, he knew he would be dead. What would you do during your last day? Jesus took the time “ valuable, precious minutes “ to wash the dirty feet of his disciples. Why did he do that? We serve, because he serves us. We are commanded to serve our brethren in Christ, and even our enemies. When we render our sacrifices of service, we help others find their God and their way home. Perhaps the most ironic thing about the type of service demanded by the religion of Christ is that by serving others, we find our own greatest fulfillment. You will never be more contented than when you help someone else improve his station in life or, more importantly, improve his relationship with the Creator. That is why the best thing you can ever do is to serve others by being evangelistic. By being a messenger for Christ, you will receive the ultimate reward “ the satisfaction of knowing that you were able to help Jesus find a lost soul. Christ promises great rewards for those who serve in this way. His recognition and praise should motivate us to want to become his evangelists. How To Be an Evangelist You may not be able to fulfill the role of a preacher, or teacher, or elder, or deacon. But in the general sense, you can be an evangelist. With Christ as our example, one of the best ways you can begin to be an evangelist is to go about your day-to-day activities looking for good things to do. Paul summed it up this way: What a wonderful, practical implementation of this principle for the Christian evangelist, not just daily, but, as the Paul noted, at every opportunity. They open the door. They let someone know that you care. Master the example of Christ Acts Talking to Friends Do you have friends or family members who are in need of salvation? Or, if they would promise you they would read something and consider it. Perhaps it would be helpful to focus on expressing concern, asking for a fair hearing, and providing them the opportunity to hear the gospel. Whether through the preacher, a tract, an article, or a tape, you have fulfilled your loving responsibility to bring them the message of Christ. Generally speaking, most of us have somewhat limited spheres of influence. We have our families, those with whom we worship, our friends at work, neighbors we live near, and acquaintances we run into from time-to-time. But there are a lot more people out there “ about 5 billion. We cannot go individually to every person in the world. We are limited by the demands of living, the responsibility of family, and our geographic location. We can, however, cooperate and help others expand the borders of the kingdom. Collectively, we can reach far more people than we can individually. Many congregations support missionaries to spread the gospel to far away places. These dedicated people do not receive the praise and gratitude they deserve in this life the Lord knows, though. They often sacrifice comfort and convenience in order to carry the gospel to those distant lands. And, too often, their safety is in jeopardy as well. The missionary is a noble servant, indeed. You can do no better service than to help someone else teach the gospel. Through the combined efforts of Christians,

thousands upon thousands of souls have been saved in this manner – souls that were doomed and would not have been rescued had good Christians not supported a mission work. Take for example this work, the Christian Courier web site. In the past three months, there were over , visitors who viewed more than , documents designed to enhance their faith. Contacts were made in 73 different countries. Without these supporters, this web site would not exist. Be an evangelist – support a faithful mission work. Encouraging Your Church Leaders Your local ministers, elders, and deacons need your encouragement. Consider your local minister – so much is expected from him. Whether the message encourages, rebukes, or instructs us, it is a demanding job that requires skill and dedication. The preacher is expected to visit the sick, the elderly, and the weak. He waits at the bed beside those who soon will meet their Maker. He often labors under criticism – sometimes valid, sometimes not. Your church leaders labor similarly – because they love the church of Christ. You can be an evangelist by being an encourager of those who have dedicated their lives to the work of evangelism in your local congregation. Your partnership – through support, kind words, and thoughtful gratitude – mean so much. The Lord is depending on you. You can do it.

But for most men, Jesus Christ is abstract, conceptual or a long-gone historical figure. Each Catholic man must to be able to give a rousing argument for why Jesus Christ is the greatest Man and why Jesus is his King. Most men have not made a commitment to strive for Sainthood. Men are stuck in mediocrity and need to raise the bar higher; there is no higher bar than Sainthood. By making a commitment to Sainthood, a man starts with repentance and aspires to greatness; in this he realizes his own spiritual poverty. Aspiring to Sainthood changes everything. Keep a guide to Reconciliation with you, recalling regularly the 10 Commandments. Regular and frequent Reconciliation changes men, for supernatural Grace flows to men during Absolution. Pray for 15 minutes every day â€” Only about a third of Catholic men pray daily; some smaller number, a much smaller number, pray for 15 minutes. How can a man know Jesus if he never talks to Him? Commit to get to know Christ the King on a personal basis by approaching His Throne and talking with Him every day for 15 minutes. It is in this personal conversation that Christ will make His will known to each man. This is both a catechetical failure and an outrageous insult to Our King. Most men have much to make up for and precious little time; drawing closer to Christ more regularly will help men make up for lost time. It is a manly act of loyalty and fidelity. Commit to carry the Rosary as a sign of your loyalty and faith and as a weapon against the daily onslaught of Satan; Satan hates the Rosary and fears it. Have the Rosary handy at all times to pray a decade in times of gratitude and stress, relying on the Holy Mother to bring your prayers to Jesus Christ. The Rosary is part of the uniform of the Committed Catholic Man. When a man reads Holy Scripture, Jesus Christ is with him, not figuratively or conceptually, but in a real and actual way. Jesus Himself came to earth to speak the words of Scripture for all men, across all time, to read and contemplate, drawing strength and wisdom and Grace from His words. Be a priest, prophet and king in your home â€” In the face of a secular culture that attacks valid patrimony, Catholic men need to reassert their rightful roles as priest, prophet and king of their family. We are not talking about being a chauvinistic tyrant, but a true Saint of Christ, with each man serving his wife and children with humble sacrifice, holy example and courageous commitment to lead his family to Heaven. Be a priest by leading your family in prayer. Be a prophet by teaching the truth of Christ and His Church. Build a brotherhood with other Catholic men in your parish â€” In Acts 2: For a man to grow in faith he must build brotherhood with faithful Catholic men who can challenge and help him grow in holiness. Make the commitment to build brotherhood with other Catholic men, particularly younger men, men who are at grave risk as they enter adolescence and move into adulthood. Gather the men of your parish in large groups and small, to pray, to learn, to teach and to serve the poor. Be a catalyst, be a leader, working with your priest. Chapter 9 : Are we to be faithful to the local church first?

Love your neighborsâ€”your literal neighborsâ€”the ones you have, not the ones you wish you had. Do this because you are a Christian, not just because you want them to be Christians. Focus on Jesus, His cross, His resurrection and His kingdom.

Questions and Answers about the Marks and Attributes of the Church Which is the one true Church established by Christ? The one true Church established by Christ is the Catholic Church. These churches were founded by men who had no authority from God to found a church. How do we know that the Catholic Church is the one true Church established by Christ? We know that the Catholic Church is the one true Church established by Christ because it alone has the marks of the true Church. What do we mean by the marks of the Church? By the marks of the Church we mean certain clear signs by which all men can recognize it as the true Church founded by Jesus Christ. What are the chief marks of the Church? The chief marks of the Church are four: It is one, holy, catholic or universal, and apostolic. Why is the Catholic Church one? The Catholic Church is one because all its members, according to the will of Christ, profess the same faith, have the same sacrifice and sacraments, and are united under one and the same visible head, the Pope. Various sects, having only fragments of Christianity, are divided in doctrine and practice and recognize no authority but their own judgment, which can easily lead them into error. A person who deliberately denies even one of the doctrines of the Church cannot be a Catholic. The Church is one in faith. Everywhere the essential parts of the ceremonies are the same and substantially the same words are used in offering Mass. Hence the Church is one in worship. What Christ determined, the Church cannot change. Since Christ, however, did not determine many points of worship in non-essential matters, the Church has the authority to do so. They must recognize the supreme authority of the Pope in matters of religion. A person who deliberately refuses to accept the legitimate and supreme authority of the Pope and the bishops in matters of religion cannot be a Catholic. Why is the Catholic Church holy? The Catholic Church is holy because it was founded by Jesus Christ, who is all-holy, and because it teaches, according to the will of Christ, holy doctrines, and provides the means of leading a holy life, thereby giving holy members to every age. The efforts of others to prove that the Church is not holy show that they acknowledge holiness as a mark of truth. Moreover, God has always favored the Catholic Church with miracles. Christ foretold that there would be good and bad members of His Church as we read in the parables of the fishes in the net and the cockle among the wheat. Why is the Catholic Church catholic or universal? The Catholic Church is catholic or universal because, destined to last for all time, it never fails to fulfill the divine commandment to teach all nations all the truths revealed by God. Christ further promised to be with them all days, even to the end of time. It has existed uninterruptedly since the day it was established down to the present time. The Church exists in a more flourishing condition in some nations than in others. It is always trying to preach the gospel to all races and in all places and sends its missionaries to the most remote places on earth. In trying to accommodate themselves to the changing conditions of the time, they have made changes in the doctrines of Christ without any divine authorization. Why is the Catholic Church apostolic? The Catholic Church is apostolic because it was founded by Christ on the apostles and, according to His divine will, has always been governed by their lawful successors. The supreme power of Saint Peter in the Church has been passed down through the unbroken line of his successors in the see of Rome. How do we know that no other church but the Catholic Church is the true Church of Christ? We know that no other church but the Catholic Church is the true Church of Christ because no other church has these four marks. They recognize no authority in religious matters vested in an individual who is the vicar of Christ. In the worship of God many Christian sects are guided more by sentiment and personal conviction than by the objective truths given to the world by Our Lord. The sects have not given saints to the world. Their truths are but fragments of the doctrines of the Catholic Church. The holiness of their members is due to the means that the sects have salvaged from Catholic worship. Moreover, these sects cannot point to miracles wrought in their favor. From it have come various national churches, subject in some degree to civil authority. The Protestant churches began in the sixteenth century when their founders, rejecting certain doctrines of faith, broke away from

Catholic unity. Many Protestant denominations are offshoots of the earliest sects. What are the chief attributes of the Catholic Church? The chief attributes of the Catholic Church are authority, infallibility, and indefectibility. They are called attributes because they are qualities perfecting the nature of the Church. What is meant by the authority of the Catholic Church? By the authority of the Catholic Church is meant that the Pope and the bishops, as the lawful successors of the apostles, have power from Christ Himself to teach, to sanctify, and to govern the faithful in spiritual matters. He implicitly guaranteed the same power to the successors of the apostles when He promised to be with them all days, even to the consummation of the world. The present position of the Pope, as head of the Vatican City, shows to the world that he and his household are not the subjects of other temporal powers. When we speak of the temporal power of the Pope, we do not mean thereby merely to classify him with earthly rulers. What is meant by the infallibility of the Catholic Church? By the infallibility of the Catholic Church is meant that the Church, by the special assistance of the Holy Ghost, cannot err when it teaches or believes a doctrine of faith or morals. The term "infallibility" is often distorted to mean impeccability, that is, freedom from all sin. The Church has never held that the Pope cannot sin. If the Church could and did err in matters of faith or morals it would not be a true teacher; it would fail in its ministry of sanctification and would not lead men to salvation but would be responsible for their condemnation. It would be impossible for Christ to be with the official teachers of the Church and permit them to teach error. When does the Church teach infallibly? The Church teaches infallibly when it defines, through the Pope alone, as the teacher of all Christians, or through the Pope and the bishops, a doctrine of faith or morals to be held by all the faithful. Catholics must accept such teachings, not on faith, but in obedience to the authority of the Pope and in respect for his wisdom. What is meant by the indefectibility of the Catholic Church? By the indefectibility of the Catholic Church is meant that the Church, as Christ founded it, will last until the end of time. Are all obliged to belong to the Catholic Church in order to be saved? All are obliged to belong to the Catholic Church in order to be saved. What do we mean when we say, "Outside the Church there is no salvation"? When we say, "Outside the Church there is no salvation," we mean that those who through their own grave fault do not know that the Catholic Church is the true Church or, knowing it, refuse to join it, cannot be saved. It does mean that no one can be saved unless he belongs in some manner to the Catholic Church, either actually or in desire, for the means of grace are not given without some relation to the divine institution established by Christ. Can they be saved who remain outside the Catholic Church because they do not know it is the true Church? They who remain outside the Catholic Church through no grave fault of their own and do not know it is the true Church, can be saved by making use of the graces which God gives them. We should also pray for Catholic missionaries and help them in their work of bringing the faith to those outside the Catholic Church. The Catholic Church is called the Mystical Body of Christ because its members are united by supernatural bonds with one another and with Christ, their Head, thus resembling the members and head of the living human body.
