The Florida Panhandle extends from Perdido Key on the west to Apalachee Bay on the east. The beaches are in four major areas: Pensacola Fort Walton / Destin Panama City Apalachee Bay.

The seasons of the Florida Panhandle based on temperature and precipitation are: Spring in the Florida Panhandle lasts from Mid-February to Early May and is characterized by moderate rainfall and mild to warm daytime temperatures. Average daytime temperatures range from the mid 60s to the low 80s and nighttime temperatures ranging from the low 40s to the low 60s. Summer lasts from Early May to Early October and is hot, humid, and rainy. Rainfall averages more than 6 inches in June, July, and August. Average daytime temperatures range from the low 80s to the low 90s and nighttime temperatures range from the low 60s to the mid 70s. Autumn or Fall lasts from Early October to Early December and feature warm days and mild to cool nights. Rainfall sharply declines as it gets closer to Winter. Average daytime temperatures range from the low 80s to the mid 60s and nighttime temperatures range from the low 60s to the low 40s. Deciduous trees in this region typically have peak autumn color around Early December but will vary based on sunlight and distance from the Coast. The Winter season lasts from Early December to Mid-February and is more similar to winters in the lower south than to winters in the rest of Florida. Frosts are fairly common and occur on average up to 40 times a year. Average daytime temperatures range from the mid 60s to the upper 50s and nighttime temperatures range from the low 40s to the mid 30s. Snowfall is very light and does not occur every year. However, snow can be seen up to several times a decade and can be very unsettling to people in this region due to most people not having experience with how to handle snow. Understand[edit] The Florida Panhandle has hung onto its Southern culture better than probably any other region in Florida, so expect traditional Southern hospitality and more conservative values. An exception to this general trend is Tallahassee, which, while retaining a great deal of that Southern charm, also contains pockets of the progressive, creative atmosphere typical of college towns. By plane[edit] Pensacola Regional Airport - located in Pensacola and is the gateway to the western Florida Panhandle. Pensacola Regional has many flights on many carriers to destinations across the eastern United States and within the state of Florida. Stretching from Pensacola to Apalachicola, it promises history, charm, and an abundance of smiles. Oyster boats run in place of cotton-laden steamboats. Shrimp and blue crab are tasty here, too. Before you visit Apalachicola, which was damaged by Hurricane Michael, please check here to ensure it is ready to welcome you. Blountstown Rivers run near it – the Chipola to the west, the Apalachicola to the east. The working farm here produces sugar cane and its own syrup, and annual quilt shows and peanut boils capture the essence of Northwest Florida. Chipley Holmes Creek, a spring-fed creek, flows through here with canoes and tubes boating and fishing tours are popular, too. Falling Waters State Park stages some drama within its foot-deep, foot-wide sinkhole; when water levels are sufficiently high, a waterfall crashes inside. Many Panhandle residents had, in fact, migrated to the area from Alabama and had relatives there; it was also easier to trade with and travel to southern Alabama than to reach East Florida by slow, arduous journey across the thick cypress swamps and dense pine forests of the Panhandle. It was natural for West Floridians to feel that they had more in common with their nearby neighbors in Alabama than with the residents of the peninsula, hundreds of miles away. In the census, the enumerated population of Pensacola was 2, including slaves and "free Negroes". In , while Florida was still a Spanish possession , American residents sent a petition to Congress asking to be incorporated into the Mississippi Territory , which at that time included present-day Alabama. In , the constitutional convention of Alabama asked Congress to include West Florida in their new state. House of Representatives asking that their section be annexed to Alabama, and Alabama Senator John Williams Walker also promoted the idea. In the same year, the territorial Legislature notified Congress that it opposed allowing Alabama to annex West Florida, but in , the year before statehood, the Legislature reversed its stance and asked that West Florida be separated. Broome vetoed the measure. The Pensacola Gazette reported that "annexation is desired by a large majority of the people" of the area. In that year, the Alabama Legislature approved a joint resolution authorizing their Governor to negotiate with the Governor of Florida about the annexation of West Florida. An offer of one million dollars in Alabama state bonds, paying 8 percent interest for thirty years, was included. Both states appointed commissioners to make detailed recommendations on the matter. In , Alabama made yet another offer when the Legislature appointed a commission to negotiate with Florida about annexation, but this attempt, too, was unsuccessful. Numerous tropical depressions and storms also afflicted the area from time to time: Ivan was the most disastrous, making landfall near Gulf Shores, Alabama , with mile-per-hour kph winds and a foot 4. On June 23, , oil from the Deepwater Horizon oil spill landed on Pensacola Beach and Navarre Beach, damaging the fishing and tourism industries, and prompting a massive clean-up effort. After World War II, the economy was boosted by the numerous military bases established in the region, as well as the growth of tourism and the hospitality industry. Major employers in the second half of the twentieth century included Monsanto and Westinghouse plants at Pensacola, the St. Joe Paper Company in Port St. Joe , and Gulf Power , a major electric utility company. Unlike central and southern Florida, the Panhandle has never been a producer of citrus crops because the area is subject to regular frosts and freezes in wintertime, which destroy citrus fruits.
