His father was a Shrewsbury School and Cambridge University -educated engineer working for a steel firm. His sister Angela was nine years older than he was. Despite the age gap the two had a close relationship until her suicide in 1967. At the age of 10, Palin, still interested in acting, made a comedy monologue and read a Shakespeare play to his mother while playing all the parts. His nephew is the theatre designer Jeremy Herbert. Although the members of Monty Python had already encountered each other over the years, The Frost Report was the first time all the British members of Monty Python its sixth member, Terry Gilliam , was at that time an American citizen worked together. As a straight man he was often a foil to the rising ire of characters portrayed by John Cleese. He also played timid, socially inept characters such as Arthur Putney, the man who sits quietly as a marriage counsellor Eric Idle makes love to his wife Carol Cleveland , and Mr. Anchovy, a chartered accountant who wants to become a lion tamer. He also acted in the film *Monty Python and the Holy Grail*. In it, he plays the Reverend Charles Fortescue, who is recalled from Africa to aid prostitutes. In *Monty Python and the Life of Brian*, he reunited with Terry Gilliam to appear in Brazil. After filming for *Fierce Creatures* finished, Palin went on a travel journey for a BBC documentary and, returning a year later, found that the end of *Fierce Creatures* had failed at test screenings and had to be reshot. Palin also had a small cameo role in Australian soap opera *Home and Away*. He played an English surfer with a fear of sharks , who interrupts a conversation between two main characters to ask whether there were any sharks in the sea. This was filmed while he was in Australia for the *Full Circle* series, with a segment about the filming of the role featuring in the series. Throughout the hour long show, Palin humorously reminisces about his childhood hobby of train spotting , while he travels throughout the UK by train, from London to the Kyle of Lochalsh , via Manchester , York , Newcastle upon Tyne , Edinburgh and Inverness. He rides vintage train lines and trains including *Flying Scotsman*. In *Monty Python's The Meaning of Life*, Palin travelled through Ireland for the same series, entitled "Derry to Kerry". The series is a trip along the Palin family line. Starting in *Monty Python's The Meaning of Life*, Palin appeared as presenter in a series of travel programmes made for the BBC. It was after the veteran TV globetrotter Alan Whicker and journalist Miles Kington turned down presenting the first of these, *Around the World in 80 Days*, that gave Palin the opportunity to present his first and subsequent travel shows. *Around the World in 80 Days Travel* ; Programme release *Pole to Pole Travel* ; Programme release Each book is illustrated with photographs by Basil Pao , the stills photographer who was on the team. All seven of these books were also made available as audio books, and all of them are read by Palin himself. *Around the World in 80 Days* and *Hemingway Adventure* are unabridged, while the other four books were made in both abridged and unabridged versions, although the unabridged versions can be very difficult to find. These are large coffee-table style books with pictures printed on glossy paper. The majority of the pictures are of various people encountered on the trip, as informal portraits or showing them engaged in some interesting activity. Some of the landscape photos are displayed as two-page spreads. Art and history[edit] Palin in In recent years, Palin has written and presented occasional documentary programmes on artists that interest him. In November 1979, Palin presented a First World War documentary about Armistice Day , 11 November 1918, when thousands of soldiers lost their lives in battle after the war had officially ended. In recognition of his services to the promotion of geography, Palin was awarded the Livingstone Medal of the Royal Scottish Geographical Society in March 1980, along with a Fellowship to the Society.

So parts are boring. Aside from talk of Python stuff, we see how interested Palin was about current events. We see the beginning of the Pythons, but also the beginning of his family: This, of course, is the most interesting because, seriously, no one is picking this book up in hopes Palin talks about his extensive dental problems. Many of these Pythons coughJohnCleese cough got pretty big for their britches very early on and were clearly only in it for the money, while others were just trying to figure themselves out however they could. Eric Idle, for example, became vegetarian at one point. Back when being vegetarian was sort of a thing no one did. And then wanted personal chefs to come on set with them, but only prepare food for the Pythons. What I like about diaries like these, while not terribly exciting outwardly, is that I get a glimpse into a time and place I am not familiar with. I was a whole year-and-a-half old at the end of this volume he met Rowan Atkinson on my first birthday! He was becoming a celebrity at a time that other exciting things were happening in the celebrity world, like getting to, um, hang with Shelley Duvall while she was filming *The Shining* and he actually thought she was cool and not annoying at all which I call bullshit on but whatever, and Bill Murray was his biggest cheerleader evah. And stuff like this that no one else can do today: Hamill is chirpy and is dressed like a delivery boy. Harrison Ford looks young and alienated. He would look over his glasses at us if he had any. As it is he moves broodingly around - like a famous man might do if he knew how famous he is. I would totally write that moment in my diary too. Throughout all of this, Palin would write about books he was reading or movies he had seen, and it all makes it feel very personable and warm and I just want to sit down and talk to him about stuff. This was just a lot of fun to read. I will look for the other two volumes of his published diaries and also plan on getting to those travelogues of his. The title on the side of the book is printed rather small, as his first name. His last name, however, is written in ginormous red print: On more than one occasion since buying this book last month, my boyfriend or I have started screaming "Who brought a Sarah-fucking-Palin book in this house?? We cannot have this name screaming at us from the bookshelf any longer. So we agreed that it would be one of the next books I read, just so I can move it to the To-Sell stack in a different part of the house. And probably even agree with us.
