Classic clothing conveys power. Conduct your job interview from a point of strength, not novelty. Dress in clothes that you would wear on the job. Executives should wear business suits. Office people should wear dress clothes. Workers should wear work clothes. The classic white-collar outfits. Check for holes, tears, splits, stains, missing buttons, runs, frayed hems, worn cuffs, puckers, pulls, or wrinkles. Wear clean, freshly-pressed clothes. Send your jacket and pants off to be dry-cleaned and pressed. Have your shirt or blouse laundered, starched, and pressed. Looking sharp shows respect for the manager and the job. It says that you are a meticulous worker and you pay attention to details. Avoid bright colors, loud fashions, and patterns that clash. For men, a wristwatch and a ring are plenty. For women, a watch, a ring, a necklace, and a pair of earrings are ideal. No bulges to ruin your profile and no jingling change to fall out of your pocket when you sit down for the interview.
