She has begun to accept that that there is more to the world than can be explained by FBI training and forensic science. The Fierce Ones, an activist group of Navajo, are insisting that more native workers be hired by the firm--including a Navajo replacement for a manager recently found dead in his car, an apparent suicide. A sniper shoots at Ella as she drives to another crime scene--the home of State Senator James Yellowhair, who has been kidnapped. Then one of the pregnant women is murdered Human bones are discovered at the spot where the younger woman had told her family she and Ella were to meet late one night. Suddenly Ella Clah, cop, is Ella Clah, murder suspect. Her former allies in the Navajo Police Department and the FBI are hot on her trail, using techniques she taught them to hunt her down. She is the ultimate hope of the world. She is Woman, who embodies all the mysteries of life. The father of her child seems ready to be more of a father, though it will alter the rhythm of all their lives and may hurt his political career. The Dineh seem to be ready to bring casino gambling to the Rez, despite the risk that the character of the Navajo Nation will be forever altered. Speaking eloquently against the proposal, Rose becomes a national celebrity. Ella has no time to think about how these changes will affect her and her two-year-old daughter.
