The exam is offered in a computer-based format. ABO created an online tutorial where candidates can become familiar with the computer-based testing system ahead of time. The Candidate Guide also includes a detailed content outline that lists the topics that will appear on the question General Examination, as well as the six question Areas of Emphasis. On exam day, each candidate must choose 2 of the 6 Areas of Emphasis. Here is a sample of what a typical exam day will look like note that the start times will vary by location: I understand the exam takes a full day, nearly six hours. The exam was designed to allow candidates plenty of time to complete. Some take the entire time, others finish in half of the time. It just depends on your testing style. There are three sections, with an optional break built in: If there was a sample test that could help me study, I may consider taking the exam. ABO has plans to create a sample test in the future. While the ABO does not endorse any specific board review course, many Diplomates tell us that these courses have proven worthwhile. Individual study should be tailored to the publications considered standard of care for the profession or recognized as chairside reference textbooks. You might consider setting a study schedule of 45 to 60 minutes of reading and review per night for several months in advance of your test date. Candidates who do this tell us that it enriches their overall experience significantly. Many other medical professions have a national board certification. We believe this voluntary exam is a step in the right direction to provide additional credibility for optometrists. Determining if and when to take the exam is up to the optometrist. If applying under expiring ABO phase-n rules, the exam must be taken in either July or January Post-Graduate Requirement points must be verified under these current phase-in rules. ABO represents much more than an exam. We want to become a resource to help optometrists build their practices. In fact, we are piloting a number of initiatives right now. We want to give ABO diplomates access to new resources to build and strengthen their practice. Benefits to the certification will extend beyond the credential. Course Criteria and Requirements Due to the overwhelming number of submissions, not all submitted courses will be accepted. All applicants will be notified of accepted courses via email by Oct. Acceptance will be based on the following criteria: Speakers must be members of the AOA. The complete electronic submission must be received by the American Optometric Association by Sept. Submissions will not be accepted in any other manner or after that date. Lectures may be submitted as one- or two-hour segments. Workshops may be designated for two- or three-hour segments. Workshop proposals should indicate that participants will be provided with hands-on experience in techniques and procedures. Workshop size is limited to a maximum of 40 participants. The submission must be complete; otherwise the entry will be ineligible. You agree to present the course at the time scheduled by the Education Center Committee. If you have scheduling conflicts, please indicate them in the Comments box on the submission form. Once scheduled, course times cannot be changed. Only two-hour courses will be considered. If your course is selected, you agree to provide the AOA with 20 multiple-choice questions with answers. The questions will be included in the CEE examination, which will be administered by the AOA or a designated representative. You agree to submit five multiple choice questions if your course falls under a research grant supported category. As part of the online submission process, you are required to upload An initial course outline. The preliminary outline must provide enough detail to allow the Education Center Committee to determine if the course is suitable for presentation and to submit to COPE for approval. Follow the COPE outline guidelines. An up-to-date curriculum vitae of the primary speaker. A brief biography of the primary speaker. Upon acceptance, additional speakers must submit their cv, biography and contact information phone and email by Dec. Final course outline will be due by Feb. Speakers must respond in a timely manner to achieve COPE approval. Course handouts are required and must be submitted electronically by March 31, Speakers cannot promote their books, consulting services, etc. The speaker travel stipend is determined and agreed upon before the meeting.
