Discussion topics for before reading: What did it feel like? What were you nervous about? What about the first day you started at this school? Volunteers can share their names, too. Were you named after someone special? What, if anything, does your name mean? How do you feel about that? In what ways does this affect Mar? What is it about? Did you like it? Have you been in a winter pageant? What did you do? What is the teacher? Decorate it with things that you like or that represent you. On a paper plate or piece of paper, create a web. Start with a point in the center. Draw lines radiating from it like the spokes of a wheel. At the end of each line, put a point, and then connect the points from line to line. Make similar points along the lines, and connect them to form a web. Draw a spider in the middle. Refer to text page 49 for Mar? These craft ideas are just suggestions. You can expand upon them, or add your own twist. Remember, though, that the focus of your time should not be on the development and execution of a craft; the focus should be on the read-aloud and the enjoyment of the book!
