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In the triangle on the top of the flag is a white colored moon symbol, while in the lower triangle is the white colored sun emblem. Blue color represents the tranquility of the country. The two triangular shapes are the Himalayan Mountains and the two main religions of the nation in the country; It represents Buddhism and Hinduism. Furthermore, these symbols refer to the desire of the country to have longer periods such as the sun and moon. In the old Kurukshetra War described in the Hindu epic of Mahabharata, which dates back to the s, it was mentioned that the first King of Nepal, Yalambar, took part in this great war. There is no mention of this flag, but there are discourses that the flag of Kirati people in this great war represents Nepal. At the same time, the Kirat flag served as a model for the Nepal flag, and some suggested that it should be considered a new national flag for Nepal. The origin of the unique double triangle of the Kirat flag symbolizes Kirat and Nepal. The Nepal flag is believed to have emerged according to the Kirat flag. The first copy of the Nepal flag found by M. Lupant was shown in in a book published by Perceval Laundon. The flag was red and had green borders. The flag was not a rectangular flag as a shape. It consisted of two overlapping triangles. Two points are thought to symbolize the royal and Rana family. The moon symbolizes the king, while the Sun represents the Rana family. Moon and Sun also represented the hope of the nation. The faces were shown by a symbol in the middle of both the ears and the forehead, and the face in the upper triangle had a small neck that placed it on the moon. The flag was then redesigned with minor changes and the flag was adopted on December 16, with the establishment of a new constitutional government. Nepal has two neighbors.
